With conditions in the world growing worse and worse, many out of work, food and clothing, the remnant is the only class who can confidently look forward to the future. Jehovah continues to give pros-perity to his people, and the period of October 1 to 9 was another occasion of much joy and great gladness. During this period 37,411 faithful witnesses showed their thankfulness to Jehovah for his goodness in the past year by exalting his name throughout the whole world. The visible army of the Lord is small in number, but "the joy of the Lord is their strength" and this little army delivered 2,202,970 testimonies concerning Jehovah's kingdom. These joyful witnesses were scattered throughout more than 61 different nations and countries of the world, yet they moved forward as one man, working in complete unity and exact harmony.

On the other hand we find the witness being given in spite of great heat, in countries located near the equator, such as in West Africa. In every country the clergy furnished much opposition clergy and thus added to burdens of Jeho-vah's witnesses; but the witnesses were not to be turned aside by any of these hardships, and continued to sing forth Jehovah's praises in spite of every obstacle.

The table published herein gives a detailed report of the activities of each country represented in this world-wide campaign. Also, at the foot of the table are given the totals for Thanksgiving Testimony Period, March 20-27, for comparison. believe that a careful study of this table will bring much joy to all of the remnant. Sixty-one different countries are represented in this report, and reference to a map will show that they cover practically the entire world. Surely Jesus' words are being fulfilled: "This gospel of the kingdom shall be preached in all the world for a witness."

Space does not permit us to give a detailed review of the results accomplished in each country, but we have published a few outstanding items from several countries which we believe will be of interest to all.

INCREASED ACTIVITY SHOWN BY WITNESSES IN CENTRAL EUROPE

The combined report from the countries under supervision of the Central European office, including Austria, Belgium, France, Holland, Poland, Rumania, Sarre Basin, Switzerland and Yugoslavia, shows increased zeal and activity by the brethren during Kingdom Testimony Period. In the period last March there were only 2,157 workers in the field, but from October 1 to 9, we find, there was a grand total of 2,921 in the same countries. 2,921 in the same countries. The number of hours also increased from 20,595 to 28,373. The total of books distributed, 7,773, was nearly double that of the previous period. After one hour they had come to realize what a desolation the locusts had caused. Period some of the workers were abused, stoned, and beaten. From the 9th to the 14th all the churches started a great campaign against Jehovah's witnesses, but old Gog and his army were shamefully de-feated. The distribution of nine thousand radio folders advertising a public lecture on the 9th of October was a surprise attack on old Gog's organized religion. An Ameri-can missionary of the Sudan mission was sent for to stem the flow of truth, but the waters were too much for him and his helpers. Jehovah's army was victorious, and glad were the people that love the truth."

We might add that during this period Jehovah's witnesses in that land challenged the above clergyman to an open debate, and the challenge received much publicity in the newspapers, but this representative of the Devil refused to accept the chal-lenge, as was the case earlier in the year in the United States. These dupes of Satan prefer to do their dirty work in the dark, and dare not come out in the open, for fear that their lying and duplicity will be exposed. In spite of being warned by the clergy not to listen to Jehovah's witnesses nor obtain any of their literature, the humble people of West Africa showed much interest in the message of the Kingdom, and according to the newspaper report the halls where the public lectures were given by the Society's repre-sentative were packed every night. Reference to the table published herein shows that the zealous activity on the part of Jehovah's wit-nesses in West Africa resulted in leaving 1,536 books and booklets with the people, in addition to 8,761 testimonies' being given, by 101 workers.

#### REPORTS FROM THE FAR EAST

We are happy to know that Jehovah now has two witnesses in China who participated in this world-wide campaign. These witnesses have only recently begun to give the testimony China, and labor under great in difficulties. As in other parts of the earth, they are being opposed by the clergy, and the following taken from the report of one of the workers is interesting:

"Once we were stopped by a Chinese pastor. He threatened us by saying he would use force to sup-press our work. But it was only his threat, and Jehovah's witnesses will never submit, but will continue to preach this gospel of the Kingdom among the Chinese people. Once we were interfered with by a foreign lady missionary of the Apostolic Faith Mission just after the ad-journment of their 'confusion' gathering. She said she does not want I.B.S.A. literature in her 'prison house' lest her prisoners will flee away from her, yet, as I was told after the argument, her prisoners have already begun to slip away on account of her tyranny."

4,409 The brethren in Japan and Korea are zealously spreading the good news of the Kingdom, as is shown by their report. We are glad to see that so large a number of the work-88 1624,186 are devoting all their time and energy in the Lord's service. # **Unity in Action in Servant's Testimony Period**

## All Workers Should Offer Same Combination

Jehovah Has Provided New Literature

**Preservation Should Have** a Wide Distribution

January 21-29 is going to be The Servant's Testimony Period. The details pertaining to this campaign were also carried in the December Bulletin. The special offer during this campaign will, of course, be the initial presentation of Preservation and the 13 new booklets for a contribution of 75c. Do you have your stock? If not, have you placed your order?

To make a success of distributing any special combination it is going to require concentration on the use of that combination. It has been reported to this office, and noticed also in a number of companies where brethren from this office have served. that either the service committee or the brethren in the company are either indifferent or negligent in regard to concentrating on the com-bination recommended for special campaigns. We find, when a special combination is recommended, that some brethren will have their book bag filled with everything else but the books and booklets included in this special combination. It has been found in most of these cases that the service director and those who have charge of the field activity do not place sufficient emphasis on the literature to be used in these campaigns and consequently the brethren in the company do not take it seriously. May we suggest for the campaigns during the coming year that each one pay particular attention to the literature recommended for these campaigns and cooperate by using that literature at the time when recommended. If the service director or others responsible for bringing this to the attention of the brethren in the company have over-looked doing so, some worker should this time.

bring the matter up for consideraat their service meeting. Scriptures are definite that the Lord's people are going to see eye to eye; they are going to raise the voice and with the voice together sing.

The voice is not their own voice or their own theories, but rather the message that Jehovah has to be delivered at any specific time. With some doing as they please, when they please, unity is sacrificed for selfishness, and as a result a more or less discordant proclamation is made. We are in the time of unity; The Watchtower during the past year has emphasized the scripturalness of unity at this time. Let each one, therefore, appreciate this in pushing this campaign.

The members of the Bethel family participating in this campaign during this period are not going to take any literature with them from door to door except *Preservation* books and the 13 booklets. To provide for any request for additional literature, some arrangement can be made to supply it. This supply can be kept in the car or at some store, to be called for if needed. We should like to see a similar campaign carried on by the English-speaking brethren throughout the country. The foreign brethren, of course, not having either these booklets or *Preservation* in their own language, will be unable to do this; but as far as they work among the English-speaking people they should confine themselves to this combination, carrying a supply of books in foreign languages according to the needs of the territory.

We would suggest also a rereading of the article on "The Servant's Testimony Period" in the December 1 Bulletin, giving particular considera-tion to the preparations necessary for each one to make in order to be prepared for the extreme weather conditions that are encountered at

## Are You Planning to Use a Portable **Transcription Machine?**

A Splendid Means to Witness to the Poor

#### **Two Types of Machine** Available

The arrangement for the manufacture and distribution of these ma-chines is progressing and we hope shortly to be able to supply the brethren with definite information regarding the actual cost of the machines and when they will be ready for shipment.

The field was never more ripe for a campaign of this nature than at the present time. It will be recalled by many that throughout the world, from 1916 to 1919 particularly, when the people were in great distress because of the war, they were anxious to know some dependable solution for the world's distress; they were tired of the hokum the preachers and politicians were handing to them and we had capacity audiences throughout the world. The condition in the world now is much more acute than it was even during the World War. People at home had high wages and the farmers received extremely high prices for their crops. Everyone was prosperous from that particular angle, whereas today many are in distress, without any hope of the future.

The message that the Lord has for the people today is much clear-er; the evidences of the Kingdom are definite and can be easily understood and appreciated by those who age hungering and thirsting for the Kingdom. The manner in which this Kingdom message is presented by Brother Rutherford in the transcription records is clear, concise and irrefutable. Therefore the indications are that through these portable transcription machines the Lord is opening up a tremendous field for the presentation of the knowledge of his kingdom.

Every company that possibly can should have one or more of these machines. In the larger cities par-ticularly, there are municipal lodg-ing houses and other places where the unemployed assemble and where

Anything that might affect the next one to witness in that ter-ritory should be reported. If the pioneers find people who are especially anxious to have the next J. w. call on them, or discover camping places, places where produce can be disposed of, etc., this should be reported. Frequently pioneers send in maps with their territory reports.

they would undoubtedly be highly pleased to obtain the real hope contained in the knowledge of Jehovah's kingdom. A one-hour program run-ning three records, with appropriate announcements, could be scheduled in these places each week to capacity audiences, we are confident. When the weather opens up, parks and other outdoor assembly places could be similarly used. In fact, the possibilities for using these machines are limitless.

There are two types of machine being developed. One is all electric, to be used where the regular 110-volt alternating current is available. The other machine has a spring-wound motor with a special dry battery for operating the amplifier, to be used in territory where electric current is not available. A num-ber of the companies have already sent in their order for these machines, but there are a great number yet to hear from. We should be glad to hear as soon as possible from all companies, pioneers, sharp-shooters and auxiliaries who desire these machines, in order that we may have some idea of how many will be required, because this is going to materially affect the cost whether you want the electrically operated or the spring-wound motor.

The effect of the release of the *Kingdom* booklet last year and the enthusiasm with which the brethren presented it is manifest in the increased placements, having over 100-percent increase over this year, despite the fact that the brethren this year worked approximately 80,000 hours more than they did last year and had a variety of 5c book

#### This Is Your Privilege and Responsibility

#### **Please Make Proper Reports**

Jehovah commands his servant to carry the Kingdom witness to the people. As to most of the pioneers, we are glad to say that when we make assignments we feel certain that the territory will be thoroughly covered in obedience to Jehovah's command. When territory is granted to these faithful witnesses it means that the Kingdom message will be taken into every part of the assignment to the honor of Jehovah. Those few who do not yet appreciate the importance of covering all rurals and towns and business districts to which they are assigned, and who skim over territory, are passing up privileges of witnessing.

Territory reports are required from the pioneers (and auxiliaries in isolated territory), and if records are properly kept, using the Daily Record Sheet provided for that purpose, these reports will be complete and accurate. Such reports are nec-essary, and, in the interest of the witness work, pioneers should give *all* information asked for. We appreciate the cooperation of the pio-neers in this matter, and ask that they all comply with the instructions work reported on the assignment the assignment of that territory.

on the assignment sheets, and the following. Inaccurate or incomplete territory reports will be returned to the pioneer to be corrected and sent back to us immediately.

When a county is completed, immediately return to us the assignment sheet, reporting thereon the information called for. In no case should an assignment from this office be held more than a year from the date of the assignment, and if the pioneer is continuing in the same territory indefinitely he should re-quest a reassignment at the time the territory report is made.

In making territory reports, show the work done in each town separately from that in the rural districts, and also the total work done in all the rurals. It is not necessary to show the rurals of each town separately. In the space provided for that purpose, the dates of work must be entered, on the front and also on the back of the assignment sheet. After the report for each town and the report for all the rural districts have been entered on the sheet, kindly total each column of figures, and at the bottom of the assignment sheet show the total

#### **Companies Can Arrange to Dispose of Products Monthly Assemblies Will** Aid in This

Louder and louder is heard the complaint of "no money" amongst the people. The hard times, which undoubtedly will grow worse as the day for the great battle approaches, make it more and more important for all the remnant to work together and for each to do his part in as-sisting his brother in carrying on in the work so that the Kingdom message will be left in the hands of the people. There is a real way in which the company workers can assist the pioneers and at the same time be benefited themselves. All who are interested in the Kingdom will be anxious to do his part.

Many of the pioneers are working in sections where it is almost impossible for them to get any contributions in the form of money with which to provide for their books and pay their expenses. It is necessary for them to take produce in exchange: chickens, eggs, canned goods, maple syrup, molasses, fruit, vegetables, nuts, and many other articles. Us ually in the particular vicinity in which they take such produce the market is flooded because the farmers all have that particular kind of product, and the pioneers have difficulty in disposing of that which they receive as contributions. Yet in other parts of the country, in the large cities in particular, some of the brethren in the companies are paying at their local stores three or four times the prices for the same goods. If, then, a scheme can be devised to materially increase the magaid the pioneers in disposing of their produce, it not only would en-able them to continue in the work in their particular territory, but would also be a benefit to the brethren in the companies.

One of the ways of doing this would be for the divisional leader and the local brethren to take this particular situation into consideration in arranging for the monthly assembly campaigns. If every pioneer who attends the campaign were to get in touch with the brother in charge, sending him a list of the produce he has on hand and which he could bring or send to the assembly, and also the price of the same, the one in charge could notify the various companies of that which would be available and those who come to the campaign could come prepared to buy some of this produce to take home with them. Pio-neers should remember, in taking goods in exchange, to allow only the wholesale valuation on the goods, and not the retail. That is all that the farmers receive for their goods in the local market, and if there is any benefit to be derived from the sale of the goods it should belong to Jehovah's witnesses. The obtain-er of the literature is receiving, in the available knowledge of Jehovah's purposes at this particular time, far more than the value of the goods or produce which he contributes. By allowing only the wholesale instead of the retail valuation, the pioneer's expense in handling the goods, the list of everything that each pioneer i more reported that the depreciation due to handling, time individually brings in, so that in spent in marketing, and the cost of settling up, if any goods are left marketing, can be covered. At the over he will know just how to dis-

same time, as the pioncer will not be in the business of doing this for a profit, but merely to cover ex-penses, he should be able to offer it to the brethren at a lower price than they would have to pay in their local market, and thus it not only would be a benefit to the pioneer for him to dispose of such goods at the assembly campaign, but would also be a benefit to the other brethren attending to stock up with such supplies, and to come prepared to do so.

At many of the assemblies which are arranged for each month, the brethren have been preparing sand-wiches and hot coffee which they have sold to the workers at 5c. They have had to get their supplies in the local market; but here also would be another way to take from the pioneers some of their produce, paying them for that which is taken instead of paying the local dealers. If the pioneers would notify the brother in charge concerning that which they have on hand, he could inform them to bring so much foodstuff to the cam-paign for this particular purpose. Many pioneers get chickens in exchange. What could be nicer than a bowl of hot chicken soup after a cold morning in the field, together with a chicken sandwich? Eggs taken in exchange for books could be boiled hard. Vegetables could be cooked up and made into salads, such as potato salad, and more eggs could be used for the same. Canned ruit could be opened and served to the workers at so much a portion.

It would be well for the division putting on the particular assembly campaign to have some brother specially appointed to communicate with the various pioneers and to ar-range for the handling of the prod-uce when it is received, displaying it at some point where the brethren attending the assembly can get it, such as in the dining hall.

In order that everything might be carried on in an orderly manner the following is suggested as an outline upon which the one handling these supplies might proceed:

Arrange a table at the end of the dining hall, for the display of the produce which is to be sold. Have each pioneer put a tag on each article, showing his or her name and the selling price of the article. When the article is sold remove the tag and place it in a drawer or box, to gether with the money received. If bulky articles which cannot be tagged are to be sold, such as sev-eral bushels of potatoes, tack a sheet on the bin, giving the name of the pioneer and the number of bush-els he has brought in. Each time any are sold enter on the sheet the quantity sold and the amount of money received. Then, after the brethren have left for their several homes the pioneers can settle up with the storekeeper. If much produce is on hand, several assistants may be necessary. But in having in charge of the store one brother whose desire is to aid the pioneers in disposing of all their produce, it will not hinder the pioneers from participating in the campaign. It would be well for the storekeeper also to keep in a separate record a

Germany reports the largest number of workers for any country dur-ing this period, namely, 12,484. These witnesses delivered 732,258 testimonies, which is also the largest number of testimonies for any country. We are happy to see the zeal of these brethren, and it is noteworthy that they were able to leave a large number of bound books with the people, a total of 59,161. They also distrib-uted 78,084 booklets, making a grand total of 137,245. Surely this was a great witness in that land. The report from Czechoslovakia

also shows much activity on the part of the brethren. There were 473 work-ers, who gave 33,439 testimonies and left 6,674 books and booklets with the people.

#### BRITISH ISLES

The report from the British Isles shows that the brethren there put forth a special effort during this period, and the Lord blessed their efforts. A total of 4,084 witnesses engaged in the service, which is over 300 more than the number for over 300 more than the number for the Thanksgiving Period last March, and they spent 30,376 hours in de-livering 270,754 testimonies. The total literature distributed was 50,-054, which is nearly double the amount distributed in the previous period, and shows how the Lord blasses the work of his people when blesses the work of his people when they put forth an extra effort. These brethren spent only about 5,000 hours more in the service this period than in the spring, yet nearly double the amount of literature was distributed.

#### SPECIAL EFFORT MADE BY BRETHREN IN INDIA DURING KINGDOM PERIOD

Jehovah's witnesses in India, Burma and Ceylon put forth a great effort to let the people know of Je hovah's kingdom during this period, as is shown by the number of hours reported, 2,919. This is an increase of 1,001 hours over the previous period, and, of course, the number of testimonies and the amount of literature distributed is greater, too. Of the 123 workers who reported, 91 were native Indians, nine of whom placed 507 books and booklets, in 470 hours. These nine workers, according to the branch office report, visited a large town in the north of India, met with much opposition, overcame it, and eventually succeeded in winning the confidence of the people and arousing much interest. A group of people offered to help towards maintaining one worker if he would devote his time to teaching them the truth.

#### MESSAGE NOW BEING PREACHED IN PERU

United States was manifested in greater devotion and zeal to the Lord and his cause during the Kingdom Testimony Period. While not as many workers participated in the field activity as during the International Thanksgiving Testimony Period last March, those who did participate more than made up for the loss of those who did not report, by increasing the amount of time spent in the service by approximately 12,000 hours, the average for the individual worker in the International Thanksgiving Period being 9.9 hours, against 11.9 hours in the Kingdom Testimony Period. In Alexandria, Va., a Greek broth-er was arrested while preaching the message to a colored man. It happened that he had offered the *Pro-hibition* booklet. He was arrested, brought before a judge, and the local brethren took it upon themselves to pay his bail. The judge said that it would be necessary to have a reg-ular attorney appear at the hearing; therefore the brethren hired a local attorney. At the hearing, the hired attorney cross-examined the com-plaining officer and the colored witness in the usual technical style. Then he placed an English-speaking brother on the stand who tried to outline the nature of the Society's work. The brother said he knew the defendant to be a sincere and true follower of Christ. The judge then angrily snapped, "Cut that out; I don't want to hear a sermon." The attorney then had to go into technical questioning and tried to bring out some of the facts about the Society's work, but was cut off by the judge and threatened to be com-mitted for contempt if he persisted in that line of testimony. The chief of police said he knew nothing about the matter, and arranged an interview for the committee of three with the head of the detective bureau, to whom he spoke and said that the committee would explain about the arrest of some colored people who should not have been arrested. The committee was received at the detective office After explaining the work to him, the committee was assured that he was sorry for the trouble and that it would not happen again. These are only two of many arrests which have occurred recently. The Devil and his organization are trying hard to stop the Lord's work; but by putting full trust in Jehovah, His protection is provided and the work of the Kingdom progresses.

Many of them have laid hold of the expressions "if you contribute a dollar for any four or \$2.50 for any ten", or, "the money received for the books," or, "the contribution received for the books," to try to sustain their claim. Their claim is false and instigated by the Devil. We are not hawkers or peddlers; we are Jehovah's witnesses preaching the gospel of his kingdom according to his commandment. Nevertheless the Lord admonishes his people to be "wise as serpents, and harmless as doves".

To this end the Society recommends that all such expressions as the above be eliminated from our presentation or testimony. The people do not really contribute for the books, but rather the contributions are received for the purpose of aiding in bearing the expense of carrying on the work of preaching the gospel of the Kingdom in printed form. To illustrate: Those who contribute a dollar to the work and advancement of the Kingdom messsage we give a choice of any 4 books or any 2 books and 13 booklets or any 3 books and 6 booklets. Those who contribute 25c to the work are given their choice of either 6 booklets or one book. And to those who contribute only 5c to the work we give any one of the booklets they choose. In other words, they voluntarily contribute to the work as without expecting any equal material reward for their contribution; and we give them the literature merely as an acknowledgment of their contributor] shall be watered also himself [with the spiritual blessing, the printed message in the books]."—Prov. 11: 25.

The time is here for unity. Let each one push the battle to the gate fearlessly; victory is assured. ## **Pioneers Start Planning for Spring Work**

#### in Isolated Territory

#### **fhere Is Plenty of Territory**

While February is generally blusering and a month of ice and snow, It draws near the time when the pioneers should start thinking about and making plans for their spring activities. Many of them have been working in company territory dur-ing the winter and will be anxious to get out into the rural sections of the north as spring begins. While Jchovah's witnesses have gone into many sections like a swarm of locusts and cleaned up the territory custs and cleaned up the territory repeatedly, there are still certain sections of the country which have rarely received the witness. To be sure, some of these sections are dif-ficult to get to on account of being in the avtreme parts of the the extreme northern parts of the country, which partly accounts for the little work done therein. Hence the necessity of making plans early, if the territory is to be thoroughly covered.

Some excuse themselves from entering the pioneer work on the grounds that there is no more territory; but in this they deceive themselves, for the Lord says that this Kingdom gospel must be preached in all the world as a witness and that when this is done, then the end will come. There is still much work to be done right here in the United States. Do you know that in South Dakota there are three counties that have never been covered; five that have had no witness since 1928; three not worked since 1929; eight, not since 1930; nineteen, not since 1931, and still others open for assignment but worked last year? There are many other states also having much unassigned territory

To be sure, the reason for the little work done in some of this territory is that it is sparsely settled, some of it is mountainous, some in-habited by Indians on Indian reservations, some in an area where there have been repeated crop failures some where the roads are poor, and all of which takes considerable traveling to reach. And yet, last suminto similar sections of the mer, same states a few pioneers went with the Kingdom message and, in spite of all these handicaps, were wonderfully blessed in placing the Kingdom message with the people. We were very agreeably surprised to see the amount of literature distributed among the people who had not heard the message from one of Jehovah's witnesses before. Michigan, Minnesota and Vermont all have re-mote territory in need of workers.

Now is the time for the pioneers working in conjunction with companies to turn their thoughts to these matters, to see whether or not they can arrange to carry the Kingdom message into isolated sections where Jehovah's witnesses do not dwell. Those who are young and strong, equipped with automobiles, trailers, etc., undoubtedly will stand ready to serve in such territory even though it presents many problems and difficulties. The Kingdom message must be preached to the people who live their entire lives in such parts as well as to those in the more thickly populated areas. The Lord always blesses those who put the The Lord Kingdom interests first, above their own personal preferences, because of their love for him.

100.000 More Hours Put in Work, but Fewer Testimonies

#### We'll Have to Do Some Catching Up!

The report for the first three months of the fiscal period shows a total of 4,216,013 testimonies having been given, by an average of 14.614 workers who have engaged in the work each month. No doubt last year's work with the Kingdom booklet, especially by company workers and auxiliaries, accounts for the fact that this number is 368,383 testimonies short of that of the same period last year. With a larger quota for 1933, this will mean that all of Jehovah's witnesses must look to the interests of the Kingdom if this shortage is to be made up. Last year, during the first three months, almost 29 percent of the year's total testimonies were given. On this basis, to be up to the quota, we should have had at least 5,000,000 reported. In other words, we are about 800,000 testimonies short of the gueta for the first three negative. the quota for the first three months.

While the pioneers reported almost 100,000 hours more in the work, and the auxiliaries about 20,000 more, the companies showed a decrease of 20,000 hours. The increase in the former was due not only to an increased enrollment in both of these branches, but to an increased effort on the part of those engaged in the work. The literature placed has shown a decline from 2,208,173 pieces of literature to 1,953,408, the latter total for this year being made up of 360,155 books and 1,593,253 booklets.

Instead of being discouraging, these figures should really fire the Lord's anointed to press on in the work with a greater determination than ever, for they demonstrate that if the hours are put in the testimonies are given and the literature will be placed with the people. Fewer testimonies means fewer books distributed.

There is a big job ahead of us if the quota of 18,000,000 testimonics is to be reached. Starting out on the second quarter of the year, Jehovah's witnesses in the United States are faced with the problem of whether they not only can make up this 800,000 shortage but can keep up with their quota for the second three-month period as well. By the Lord's grace it can be done. Each one must do his part to result in the giving of such a tremendous witness. Two holidays come in February, Lincoln's and Washington's birthday. Those who have this time off from work can make good use of it. Holidays are excellent occasions for witnessing.

#### Pioneering in Mexico

Jehovah's witnesses will be interested in knowing that the work is progressing in Mexico. Recently a convention was held in Mexico city, which proved to be quite a stimulus to the friends in that country, and now they are zcalously proclaiming the good news of God's kingdom to a people who have manifested their disgust for the clergy. According to the report for the Kingdom Testimony Period, last October, there are now more than 30 pioneers in Mex-ico, and we have the following report from the Society's branch in Mexico city: "In Mexico there are not many

good roads. Some of them can be traveled over only by oxcarts. Some roads in the mountains are mere donkey or foot paths. Even so, these remote districts are visited by a few faithful pioneers. One sister in the southern part of the country reports that in the mountains where she was witnessing she came across some savage Indians. She declares that she is determined to take the message of the Kingdom to every village, no matter how little she places. This pioneer sister is Indian

herself, but belongs to another tribe. "Here in Mexico city two pioneers are witnessing in the office and gov-ernment buildings. They place at least two sets a day, and the result is that practically every high official has the literature."

#### Clergy of West Africa Greatly Disturbed by Jehovah's witnesses

The preachers of West Africa are greatly afraid that their congrega-tions will soon be leaving them, because the faithful witnesses of Jehovah are zealously carrying the message of truth to the people of that land. To counteract the mes-sage of truth they are resorting to all manner of lies. We quote a few excerpts from an item appearing in a Lagos newspaper, no doubt written by a clergyman, which shows their fear and how they are lying. Speaking of Jehovah's witnesses, the article says, "these that have turned the world upside down are come hither also' for there is to be seen now at Ijebu Ode a body of enthusiastic Russellite book-sellers. These will certainly start soon to preach their bogus doctrines such as 'Christians owe no allegiance to anybody, Government or Christian authority'... Russellism, in short, is a curse to any country that ac-cepts it, and the Ijebus must beware of buying their median of buying their specious books or of following their dangerous doctrines. The promoters sell a lot of cheap books with a view to raise money for their business. . . . Rusworst religious movement ever brought here and should not be given a foothold."

#### Results of Praise Testimony Period, Nov. 12-20, in Japan

Our brethren in Japan engaged in a strenuous campaign during this period, the same as in the United States and other countries, and a report of their activity shows that they have a deep appreciation of their privilege of representing the King and the Kingdom. There 80 workers, 68 of whom were pioneers, devoted a total of 4,124 hours, gave 63,860 testimoles, and placed a total of 18,727 books and booklets among 4,302 families during this period. That means that on an average each worker spent 51.5 hours in the service, delivered 798 testi-monies, and placed 234 books and booklets, in this short time. The 18 branch manager reports that this 194 is the highest record for any testi-94 mony period ever had in Japan.

Remember, this is a booklet campaign and we should try to place literature in the hands of every person. Concentrate on *The Crisis* if you have your supply; otherwise use the latest booklets you have.

For the nine days appointed for this special witness we are setting as our goal 3,000,000 testimonies, these to be delivered to the peoples and rulers of the world in at least 94 countries. So far, brethren in 94 countries throughout the world have been sent Brother Rutherford's letter and have been invited to join in the Memorial Feast and participate in the witness work. We hope that all the brethren will make a report to their branch office, or to the office at Brooklyn if they are not connected with a branch office, stating what has been accomplished because of their activity in the doorto-door witness. #### Be Sure You Have a Good Supply

So that Jehovah's witnesses may be supplied with ammunition for The Remnant's Thanksgiving Period, April 8-16, a consignment of *The Crisis* will be shipped with orders received by us between February 20 and March 15 and added to the invoices. If *The Crisis* is included in the order received before March 15, the order will have preference over the consignment and the consignment will not be shipped. In certain instances, however, it may be deemed advisable to reduce or increase the amount of the order to fit the particular case. To those from whom we have not received orders by March 15, the consignment of *The* 

#### The Name of JEHOVAH Is a Strong Tower In the Time of The Crisis

#### The time has come to call upon all those to whom the name of Jehovah is a strong tower to put forth another great effort, in fact the greatest effort ever. To flee into this strong tower indicates that they will make haste to respond. The special call to action comes for The Remnant's Thanksgiving Period, April

8-16. What arrangements should be made? First: During this period every witness should endeavor to place *The Crisis* in the hands of as many people as possible, whether such a witness be a company worker, sharpshooter, pioneer or auxiliary. To do this an adequate supply of *The Crisis* should be on hand. (Read the article on consignments and ordering, in this Bulletin.) Second: Thickly populated terri-

Second: Thickly populated territory should be set aside for this particular period. Plans should be made for covering the territory thoroughly and quickly. Pioneers should do this as well as companies. If they have covered their city territory with the other literature and have only rurals left, then go over the city territory with the booklet. Pioneers as well as all other workers will be confining their efforts to *The Crisis* for this period. If they have been saving their city territory, a preliminary witness with *The Crisis* will be just the thing for an immediate follow-up with the rest of the literature.

Third: To reach more people with The Crisis will mean more time than ever must be devoted to the field work. Directors should arrange for parties to go out into the work for every day of the campaign. Don't be content, if you are a company worker, with two or three days of a few hours each in the service. If you can't get out during the daytime, plan to get out an hour or so each evening. In fact, seize every possible moment for notifying the people that "The Crisis" is here.

Pioneers, do you know that your best average for a service period was during 150,000-Hour Week, in July, 1930, at which time you reported an average of 45.86 hours each? Can you boost this to 50 hours? During the same period the auxiliaries reported an average of 24.82 hours each. What do you say about making this an average of 28 hours? Company workers and sharpshooters, you made your best average during Witness Week, September, 1931, at which time you averaged 9.9 hours each. Can you increase this to 12 hours each?

Jehovah has placed this message in the hands of the remnant. His work must be done speedily. Crisis will be shipped, so that all may be supplied with this booklet by April 8.

Some of the companies, sharpshooters, pioneers and auxiliaries have allowed their accounts to get in poor condition because of not sending in remittances for the literature distributed. These should be sure to get in their orders for *The Crisis* before March 15, accompanied by a remittance to cover, so that they can be adequately supplied for this special period.

plied for this special period. By ordering *The Crisis* together with whatever other literature may be needed in the near future, shipping expense can be saved. For this reason we request that you get in your orders before March 15 if possible.

The consignments to companies and sharpshooters are to be based on what is considered to be adequate for the special service period and a few weeks following. In most instances pioneers are to be consigned 360 and auxiliaries 190 (except where working in parties, when a carton of 460 will be consigned to each two pioneers and 360 to each two auxiliaries). Exceptions will be made to this rule when deemed advisable.

#### Special Notice April 2 Divisional Campaign Canceled

#### **Transcription Machines**

#### to Be Used in Public Witness Work

The Lord is richly blessing the progress of the work of manufacturing the portable transcription machines, and they are now being assembled and shipped. We hope to have a considerable number of them in use within a short while. These machines will afford an-

These machines will afford another splendid opportunity to give public witness to the Kingdom message in the territory. Pioneers who have a machine, as well as others, are advised to arrange for schoolhouses, empty churches, or other free buildings, to which the public may be invited, and to put on a program of one or two transcription records and then present the books to the people. There are many who are becoming too poor to afford radio sets, and this will afford a way for them to hear the truth.

Under no circumstances are transcription records supplied for radio broadcasting to be used on the portable transcription machines. This is very important. Use on the portable transcription machines only such records as have been supplied you for that purpose. Care should be taken that only

Care should be taken that only needles specially prepared for '33-1/3 revolutions per minute' records are used. Use a new needle for each running. Should records become cracked or scratched so that the presentation is to any degree distorted, advise this office, with a full description of the damage. The clarity and effectiveness of the presentation of the Kingdom message by this means depends upon the full cooperation of each one. Therefore we request that those who own and use the portable transcription machines give careful consideration to the above.

Notice of this issue must be given to the rulers and the people. They must know the crisis is here and that there is no alternative; Jehovah's kingdom only shall prevail

That this issue may be placed squarely before the rulers as well as the people, a special campaign is being arranged for Washington, D.C., on Saturday, April 15, in which it is hoped that the president, every member of the cabinet, all congress men, senators, and government em-ployees, and the members of foreign legations, in fact, every person who is connected with this or any other government represented in Washington, will be served with the *Crisis* booklet and an invitation to listen in to a nation-wide special chain radio broadcast on "THE WAY OF ESCAPE".

Do you wish to have a part in that campaign? If you do and can comply with the conditions, you may have a part therein. Here is the arrangement.

We are inviting the three divi-sions immediately adjacent to Washington to assemble as divisions. These are the divisions with head-quarters at Philadelphia, Pa., Balti-more, Md., and Richmond, Va. Every worker in those divisions who can be in Washington by 7:00 o'clock Friday evening, April 14, is invited to come and participate in the cam-paign. All other individuals or car groups outside of these divisions who wish to participate in the campaign and can be in Washington at 7:00 p.m. Friday, April 14, may also come. It must be kept in mind, however, that this work is of great

importance, and the detailed instruc tions covering it are so essential that they must be thoroughly assimilated by each one who goes into action, and that anyone who cannot get to Washington by 7:00 o'clock Friday evening, April 14, to get these instructions cannot have a part in the campaign. Therefore, if you are unable to make it by that time, do not go at all. It creates considerable confusion to try to work last-minute arrivals into the organization. The big job at Washington will be on Saturday morning, when the work ers who are thoroughly instructed, and who can be depended upon to carry out in detail those instructions, will be dispatched to their territory

There will be sufficient territory for those who are in the work at Washington on Saturday to stay over and work in the residential sec to stay tions on Sunday; but do not come to Washington simply for Sunday's activity, for the witness is just as important in the residential sections of your own territory as it is in those of Washington, and the additional time, effort and expense that would be required in going to Washington for Sunday's activity may be devoted to witnessing at your home. But for those who are there on Saturday and wish to stay over for Sunday there will be plenty of territory; and if any of the brethren wish to come to Washington earlier in the week and work with the Washington company, they may do so. Pioneers driving to this campaign and wishing to make a few stops en route may apply to any company service director for territory and this will be the authority for the service directors to fully cooperate with them by supplying territory and any other assistance they may be able to give. We hope to have at least 1,000 workers ready for service Friday evening; but may we again here emphasize that if you cannot get to Washington by Friday evening, don't go at all.

#### **Transcription Machine** Records

Great care must be taken in playing Brother Rutherford's transcription records and in the type of needle used. The clarity and effec-tiveness of the presentation is de-pendent upon the attention given to these details.

For the very best results the Columbia<sup>\*</sup> electrical transcription needles should be used. Do not use any other type of needle on Brother Rutherford's records, and when purchasing your needles clearly state that they are to be used for playing "331 revolutions per minute" records.

If you are unable to obtain this type of needle locally, the Society will be glad to procure them and send them to you. The Columbia needles come in packages of 100, at 25c a package.

#### SPECIAL NOTICE

USE A NEW NEEDLE EACH TIME YOU PLAY ONE OF BROTH-ER RUTHERFORD'S RECORDS. For long-playing music records use THE NEW RCA VICTOR CHROMI-UM NEEDLES FOR LONG-PLAY-ING RECORDS. This is an orangecolored needle which comes in packages of six, at 25c a package. Do not accept the new RCA Victor chromium needle which comes in the silvergray packages, for they are to be used on "78 revolutions per minute" records only. The needles for the long-playing music records may be used ten times, at least, before re-newing. See the instructions on the package. These needles may also be procured through this office, if you have difficulty in getting them locally.

#### To Those Who Love Him Supremely

Love is an unselfish devotion to the Lord. Real love is expressed in works, and not in words only. The truly anointed, having a vision of their kingdom privileges and a burning desire to serve the Lord, are anxious to consider ways and means for practically demonstrating their love for Jehovah and his kingdom by their works. The following are a few suggestions for the aid of such.

Summer is near, bringing to a great majority of the anointed who are unable to devote all their time to the Lord's kingdom service, periods of from two weeks to a month or more of vacation. Inquire of your local director what territory he has available and commence making your plans now for devoting all the additional time you possibly can to the service this year, so that when vacation time comes around you will be all set to start in. # Jehovah's Blessing Most Manifest

3,796,382 Pieces of Literature Placed in Half Year

An Increase, over Same Period Last Year. of 189,395 Pieces

#### Jehovah's witnesses Put in 219,228 More Hours

The first six-month period of the fiscal year 1933 came to a close with the activities of March. You are curious to know how the work thus far compares with that of 1932. Times have been exceedingly stren-uous, and the prevailing opinion is that the work has therefore de-creased. It has been extremely difficult to place literature, because the people have been filled with fear. The Devil and his organization have succeeded in turning many against Jehovah, and opposition to the Kingdom message has increased; but Wonders upon wonders! the fig-

ures show more literature placed with the people, more testimonies delivered, and more hours devoted to the service by Jehovah's witnesses than during the same period last year.

The 3,796.382 books and booklets placed in the hands of the people during these first six months of 1933 means an increase of 189,395; the 8,474,339 testimonies delivered represents an increase of 162,228; and the 2,017,259 hours reported means that Jehovah's witnesses worked 219,228 more hours in the field. In addition to this, many more hours not reported were used in going to and from divisional campaigns and in other phases of the work. In the face of the hard times among the people, and the Lord's people too have felt them, these results give evidence of the faithfulness of Jehovah's witnesses in their efforts to carry the message to those who hunger and thirst for righteousness. It is a testimonial of their devotion to God and their joyful obedience to his commands even though so doing entails hardships and some physical suffering. It is proof of the aboundand of the Lord's blessing upon their efforts.

As is to be expected, the increase over last year's figures in literature placed was due to a big increase in the number of booklets distributed. The total of 3,114,423 was actually 327,887 more than last year's figure (Continued on page 2, column 2)

This is the time, of course, when Jehovah's anointed, his witnesses are going to take the lead in pressing the battle to the gate and lifting up a standard for the people. However, the Bible clearly states that not only are the spirit and the bride to say, Come, but he that heareth is to say, Come, and he that is athirst may come, and whosoever will, let him partake of the water of life freely. These scriptures indicate that, in addition to the anointed, a great many whom we now refer to as the "Jehonadab class" are going to hear, drink, and be instrumental in carrying some knowledge of the Kingdom message to others. These should be encouraged to do this. It is the privilege of the anointed not only to encourage but to instruct work. This is wrong,

them in doing this effectively to the praise of Jehovah's name at this time. Whether these be young or old, anyone who wishes to have part in declaring the purposes of Jeho-vah should be helped and instructed. No one should take himself so seriously at this time as to think that he should in any wise try to dis-courage or hinder anyone else from serving Jehovah.

From the number of reports received in this office covering the Crisis campaign, it is evident that there are a great many people of good will throughout the country who want to have some part in car-rying this message to others. In the majority of cases these have been encouraged and helped by the brethren. Some of the brethren, not seeing the issue clearly, try to discour-age these people from doing this

## **Divisional Campaigns**

#### All Workers to Have These Points in Mind

In order that all may be familiar with the details and requirements of the divisional campaigns, we are presenting a brief summary of this work in the Bulletin.

In the instructions to divisional leaders the following statement is made: "Each division is to work its own assigned area and is not to go outside of that territory withdefinite instructions from the Brooklyn office. Please do not write to other divisions requesting them to come to your territory. If you believe that in your area there are citics where you encounter opposi-tion that are too large to be effectively worked without additional help, write the Brooklyn office explaining the situation and you will be instructed." We ask divisional leaders and all the brethren in the division to please comply with this requirement and avoid confusion. Divisions are to put on special cam-paigns only when they receive instructions from the Brooklyn office. Therefore, company directors, sharp-shooters, pioneers or auxiliaries should not request campaign divisional leaders for assistance when they encounter difficulty in their territory, but they should write to the Brooklyn office explaining the entire situation, and the necessary arrangements will be made from here here

Where an emergency arises that requires several divisions to concentrate on one town, no one shall be asked to travel more than 200 miles from one division to another. This will be the outside limit between division points. This, of course, will not preclude anyone from going who desires to, but when the brethren travel long distances it is depleting to their strength and minimizes their ability to perform the duties that they have to perform.

Brethren attending divisional campaigns should, as far as possi-ble, take their own literature, radio attending folders and calling cards and thus avoid the necessity of trying to get additional literature at the city where the campaign is being put on.

In reporting divisional activity a report is to be made to the divi-sional leader as outlined in the car drivers' instructions. However, this is simply a divisional report, and the service director of the company where the divisional campaign is held should report to Brooklyn on to the honor of his name.

his monthly report only the work done by the workers in his com-The workers from each company. pany, and sharpshooters, should report to their own service director the amount of time worked, testimonies given, placements made and literature distributed, and each service director should include this report in his monthly report to the Society. Thus participation in divisional campaigns should not reduce the activity of the individual com-pany, for they get credit for the work done by their workers regard-less of where that work is done.

(Continued from page 1, column 4) of 2,786,536. This means that 138,492 fewer bound books were placed, or 681,959 as compared with 820,451. It seems quite remarkable that there should have been such a big increase in the number of booklets distribut ed, in view of the special work last fiscal year with the Kingdom booklet during the months of October and November; especially so when this work resulted in 846,988 more place ments being made during those two months than during the same two months this fiscal year. This big lead in placements, during the last four months, has been cut down to 691.164, and, with the special Crisis campaign, we anticipate it will be overcome completely.

8,474,339 testimonies, or 47 per-cent of the year's quota of 18,000,-000, have already been delivered, during the most difficult six months f the year so far as weather conditions are concerned. With the succinct testimony for the Crisis booklet, and the best months ahead, we can with confidence look forward to not only making the quota, but possibly surpassing it, by the Lord's grace. Last year it was possible to make 50 percent of the year's total testimonies during the first six months, in 45 percent of the year's total hours reported, because of the special work with the Kingdom booklet. This year, without a singlebooklet campaign, last year's figure has been surpassed. What will the total of testimonies be at the end of the next six months? In hours, 45.7 percent of the year's quota of 4,431,-000 have been reported so far,

By steady work, taking advantage of every opportunity of making known the Kingdom gospel and pressing on in the work in spite of the opposition of the enemy, we can with confidence look to the Lord's blessing upon the efforts put forth

#### Try to Leave It in Every Home

The message contained in the new booklet *The Crisis* is one which should be placed in every home, if possible. The very fact that the Lord enabled arrangements to be made for so many different countries to have it ready for distribution during The Remnant's Thanksgiving Period is proof of its importance. While the campaign with the one booklet alone has come to an end with the conclusion of this period, each one of Jehovah's witnesses should endeavor to leave a Crisis booklet with as many as possible. Therefore be sure to include The Crisis in each combination placed, and before leaving a place where the other literature is not taken pre sent the booklet as a final offer with the special Crisis testimony.

#### **Back Calls** on Radio Listeners

The large number of letters requesting copies of Brother Rutherford's lectures over the chain broadeasts are now being handled in the office and arrangements are made to forward the copies of the lecture to those listening to the first broadcast: the others will follow in due course.

After the lecture is mailed we are sending the names of these people to the different companies, sharpshooters, pioneers and auxiliaries throughout the country, to be called upon immediately. Please give this matter preferred attention. As soon as you get your list of names see that prompt effort is made to call upon these people and give them an opportunity to obtain all of Brother Rutherford's books. In the case of large companies where there are a number of pioneers and auxiliaries working in conjunction with the company, all the names are for-warded to the service director. He should distribute them among the pioneers particularly, and where the pioneers cannot handle them the others, of course, can be distributed among the other company workers. See that the names are given to brethren who are competent to call upon these people and explain the truth and present the books in a proper way. We shall be glad to hear of any outstanding experience connected with the reception you receive from these people.

#### **Report on Radio Dramas**

The whole-hearted and enthusiastic cooperation of the brethren in reporting on the radio dramas put on over WBBR between 6 and 7 a.m. on Sunday, April 2, Wednesday, April 5, and Wednesday, April 12, is much appreciated and helps us in ascertaining what portions of the field we can reach through WBBR when there is no interference.

The good reception area on Sunday morning, when the weather was fairly good for radio reception, covered all of New England, New York state, New Jersey, Pennsylvania and castern Ohio, as well as the province of Ontario from Sault Ste. Marie east to Ottawa and as far north as North Bay. By "good reception area" is meant where the brethren who have fairly good radio sets can get the program without interference. Some of the programs came in faint in certain sections. In other sections within that area, of course,

The Canadian Radio Commission refused to allow even announce-ments of Brother Rutherford's lec-ture "The Way of Escape" and the two following lectures to be broadcast over Canadian stations. However, the brethren are not discouraged, but are fighting harder than ever. 274,000 radio folders were distributed so that people of Canada might hear the special broadcast on April 16. In addition to this, arrangements were made to advertise the lecture in the prominent news-papers. Jehovah's witnesses in Canada are greatly enthused over the three special radio lectures, and reports indicate that these lectures were very well received there.

#### CUBA

"I am pleased to state I was with the brethren of Banes and we had things all fixed for the lecture. It came through very clear. A gathering of over 200 heard same and was very pleased." Banes is located in the eastern end of the island.

#### ARRESTS

(Anderson, S. C.) "On or about the 21st of March a magistrate of the township took by force (and at the point of a gun) one chicken coop and five hens. They were not used in evidence or mentioned at trial, He yet holds the coop and hens. The officer also gave me a beating when confiscating same."

(Clinton, Iowa) "The chief of po-lice looked over the *Crisis* booklet and studied the two trial pictures and said, 'You don't think much of police and judges, do you? I don't wonder at your being arrested dis-tributing that.' They were very sore when I refused to pay the fine, and the sheriff was ready waiting to hur-ry us off to jail. We were freed to-day at about 10 a.m. and rejoice that deliverance was wrought for us and we can proceed the remainder of the special period. The three days' jail has done us no harm.

(Hillside, N. J.) "We were working for about a half hour when a sedan pulled up with two detectives in it. They asked what kind of work we were engaged in, and if we were going around for members. I said, "We are not interested in getting members, neither are we collecting money; in fact we are giving most of these booklets away. I will show you how we present this message to the people.' I gave him the entire testimony. When leaving, this detective put his hand to his mouth and in a low tone said, 'I am in har-mony with it.' For the rest of the day we were not bothered any more.

#### - AND NOW WHAT?

Jehovah's witnesses will continue to proclaim the message of truth. They will put in more time and energy so that the Lord's kingdom will be preached in all the world for a witness.

Those who would be faithful to God cannot now hold themselves in secret and not disclose themselves about God's organization and their part in it. The time has come when everyone of the remnant must clearly be identified as on the Lord's side. There is no compromise; their declaration must be for God and his Christ and his kingdom.

During The Remnant's Thanks-giving Period in the United States alone there was an increase of more than 7,000 workers over any former campaign, with corresponding in-creases shown by the other coun-tries that have already reported. In keeping with the usual policy, Brother Rutherford has arranged for the brethren working in the factory, office and Bethel home to have all day Saturday, July 1 and 8, off from their regular duties in order to enable them to have Saturday and Sunday at the beginning and at the end of the Ambassadors' Devotional Period for field service and also to serve companies as field service leaders within a radius of 200 miles from New York. Therefore, if your company is within the above area and you desire a service leader for either the opening or the closing period of this campaign, write at once to the service department, making your request and stating specifically the dates on which you wish the brother to serve you.

#### Needles for the Portable Transcription Machine

It has been found that it is impractical to use two different kinds of needle on the Portable Transcription Machines, due to the fact that it has to be changed after each record. Once the RCA needle is removed from the pick-up it can never be used again without defacing the record. Therefore the following arrangement is recommended as the most effective and economical. USE ONLY COLUMBIA NEEDLES FOR LONG-PLAYING RECORDS, both for music and for Brother Rutherford's transcriptions, but BE SURE TO CHANGE THE NEEDLE TO CHANGE THE NEEDLE THEER EACH RECORD. These needles will play only ONE record; throw them away after using once. These needles not only play Brother Rutherford's records well, but also play the music records with a softer, mellower and more pleasing Time in the Field Will Bear Much Fruit

#### Books and Booklets to Be Offered

July 1-9 is another period set aside by the remnant for worshiping Jehovah. This period is to be called "Ambassadors' Devotional Period". Paul said; in 2 Corinthians 5:20: "Now then we are ambassadors for Christ"; or, according to the *Diagloit*: "On behalf of the Anointed, therefore, we are ambassadors."

The May 15 Watchtower says, in part:

"Jehovah put his words in the mouth of Christ Jesus the Great Prophet, and that Great Prophet has instructed and enlightened class. . . Jehovah committed his testimony to Christ Jesus and clothed him with all power and authority; hence it is written that it is "The testimony of Jesus Christ'. He did not receive that testimony from man, but from his Father. Christ Jesus is the elect servant of Jehovah; and the faithful remnant on earth, being members of his body, are 'the feet of him' to whom the testimony of Jesus Christ is committed. As members of the body of Christ the remnant are under the direct command of Christ Jesus, the Head, and must render to him complete obedience. . . A failure or refusal to deliver the testimony of Jesus Christ would be unfaithfulness on the part of any member of the remnant."

How appropriate, then, it is that the remnant should be called "ambassadors for Christ"! As ambassadors for Christ they show their devotion to God by obeying his commandments. It will be a busy time for them.

for them. The season itself is particularly fitted for giving more time to the witness work. With two Saturdays and two Sundays, and a national holiday in the United States on July 4, the ambassadors for Christ will have considerable time off from their usual employment. Holidays are especially good for witnessing, because then the men are at home from office and factory and the farmers are in from the fields. During prosperous times many people go pleasure-seeking on such occasions. Now they stay at home and have time to listen to the message brought to them by the ambassadors of the Anointed.

Two special combination offers are to be presented during this period. In communities where the people are not too poor, Vindication 1, 2 and 3 and Preservation should be offered when one contributes \$1.00 toward the work. If this combination is not placed, then drop to Preservation and six booklets when a contribution of 50c is given. In communities where the people are not so well off financially the 'Preservation and six booklets' combination should be presented first. In each booklet combination placed there should be included a Crisis booklet, and, in fact, it should be offered singly at every home where the other literature is not taken.

the other literature is not taken. Since this will be the first and only service period during the summer, special effort should be made to get out into the rural sections. If possible, a survey of the territory should be made in advance by the directors, and the workers advised as to the more suitable of the two combinations to obtain the best results. In working rurals at this time of the year it should be possible to take farm produce as contributions for the literature. It would be well, therefore, at a service meet-ing preceding the period, for the matter of the disposal of such prod-uce to be considered. If the breth-ren know that they will have little difficulty in getting rid of that which they receive they will then know what produce to suggest in instances where the people have no money. If a section is to be worked where some particular produce is a spe-cialty with the farmers, the service director should investigate the local markets to see if any surplus over and above the personal demands of the workers can be sold. If a fa-vorable arrangement can be made with a local merchant, then the workers can be informed concern-ing it and be advised as to the amount at which such contributions are to be figured so that when they are sold the workers will not be the losers. Knowledge of such an ar-rangement would be a help to pioneers working in the vicinity, also

The territory should be well mapped out and the workers thoroughly instructed where to go and how to get there to avoid all waste of time. Parties should be arranged for working the rural sections so as to keep the workers busy. If the two-car system is used, all workers should cooperate by making their testimonies brief and to the point, (Continued on page 2, column 4)

#### The Jonadabs Are Taking Their Stand The Crisis Booklet Greatly Appreciated

It is still too early to give you the international report on the re-sults of The Remnant's Thanksgiv-ing Period, since not all the reports from the different countries have yet been received. We do have the final figures for this country, however, and they will be sure to make you very happy. Never before has there been such a response to a call to service as during this special period. During the same period last year 13,628 participated in the work. This year reports have been received from 20,902, or an increase of 7,274 workers. Where did all of these come from? Well, it does look as if some of the Jonadab class are getting into the chariot, doesn't it? As a matter of fact, several letters have been received stating that the in-crease in number of workers was due to some of this class' participating in the work for the first time. With such a big increase in number of workers engaging in the service for the first time, we might expect the general averages of time and placements to be considerably less; but just look at the following results:

During the nine days 886,592 books and booklets were placed in the hands of the people. Pioneers, auxiliaries, company workers and sharpshooters specialized on the Crisis booklet, according to instructhe tions, and only here and there, when an especially interested party was found, was the other literature pre-This is evident from the sented. fact that of this remarkable total only 6,932 were books. The balance of 879,660 were booklets. That you might better appreciate what this means, we give you a comparison with *Kingdom* witness week during the ten days of September 1931, when the Kingdom booklet was offered. At that time 732,852 books and booklets were placed, by 13,613 workers. During these ten days these workers averaged 13.8 hours days per worker in the field, whereas during The Remnant's Thanksgiving Period the 20,902 averaged 13.7 hours. With one day less time, poorer weather conditions, and many new workers who never before went out in the work, to have only .1 of an hour less per worker is worthy of special note. Certainly it shows that the Lord's time has come for the message to be given.

In placing this year's 886,592 pieces of literature, 2,229,880 testimonies were given. This represented over a million more testimonies than during the *Kingdom* Witness Period, ings uniformly. During the visits of at which time 1,162,236 testimonies the regional service directors with

The workers appar were reported. ently followed closely the suggested testimony given by Brother Rutherford and were thus able to average 7.8 testimonies per hour instead of 6.2. The literature was left in the homes of 831,990 persons, to com-pare with 630,369.

It may also be of interest to you to know that during this period 1,831 pioneers averaged 41.52 hours

booklets, and the 18,204 company workers and sharpshooters averaged 10.3 hours and 30.3 booklets.

Surely there is every cause for rejoicing in the way the Lord blessed the efforts put forth in all parts of the country. We can look forward with anticipation to the final worldwide results. As soon as we get them completed we will pass them on to you.

All of the regional service directors who travel by automobile are also supplied with one of these machines.

The Lord has very evidently opened up this field to increase the witness work, particularly among the poor and needy and in sections where there are no radio stations carrying Brother Rutherford's lectures. Therefore everyone having one of these machines should be using it regularly to the praise of Jehovah. At least two evenings a week and one or two meetings each Sunday should be arranged. Adver-tising cards and instructions for planning and putting on these meetings are now prepared and a copy is enclosed with this *Bulletin* to the companies and sharpshooters, and one will also be supplied to everyone owning and operating a portable transcription machine whose address we have. Brethren who have their own machine and are using it to broadcast Brother Rutherford's lectures and who do not get a copy of these instructions will please write this office for it. portable transcription machine, arrangements should be made to hold one or more public meetings; these meetings to be advertised and arranged for as suggested in the instructions mentioned above.

This, however, is not intended to mean that brethren should stay out of the field service in order to attend those meetings. Most of the portable transcription machine meetings should be scheduled for eve-ning or late in the afternoon, after the majority of the workers have returned from the field.

Saturday and Sunday should, as far as possible, be used for opening up new territory. Therefore the follow-up meetings should be held during the week. To illustrate: A party working in a territory on Saturday and Sunday can properly advertise the meeting and invite the people to the portable transcription meeting to be held either Saturday evening or Sunday afternoon. At this meeting the chairman is supposed to make arrangements for subsequent meetings. These subsequent meetings should, as far as possible, be scheduled for some evening during the week, thus leaving Saturday and Sunday open for entering into new territory and preparing for other meetings.

The time is now here to extend the Kingdom witness as far as possible. Let everyone be on the alert to take advantage of the privileges that are opening up. Every worker in the field should be watchful to see what opportunities there are in his particular territory for putting on one or more of these meetings and should cooperate with the service director in scheduling them. In territory where companies or sharpshooters have no portable transcription machine but feel that there is an opening in their territory to use one, please advise this office promptly and every effort will be made to route a pioneer, regional service director or some other competent brother to put on a series of meetings in your territory.

#### Do You Need More **Bulletins**?

During The Remnant's Thanks-giving Period there was an unusually large increase in the number participating in the witness work. All of these, if they so desire, should be able to obtain copies of the *Bulletin* regularly. To accommodate these, and in order that we can revise our *Bulle*-

tin figures accordingly, we ask EACH service director and shap shooter to let us know on his NF s monthly report card to this office the exact number of *Bulletins* they now can use. This information is to be shown somewhere on the upper right-hand corner of the report card.

#### News from Everywhere

#### RUMANIA

"Recently the Supreme Court in Rumania handed down a verdict regarding the *Kingdom* booklet and Jehovah's witnesses. The verdict was in our favor. The Society's office in Bucharest received a letter from the minister for foreign affairs authorizing the distribution in Rumania of the *Kingdom* booklet in all languages."

#### OPPOSITION IN JAPAN

The March issue of the Japanese Golden Age carried a long article explaining the cause of the present trouble and about Jehovah's king-dom, the hope of the world. The article was entitled "Important dom, the hope of the world. The article was entitled "Important Warning to the Rulers and People of Japan". This particular Golden Age was mailed to all the higher officials of Japan. The number of copies mailed was 11,900, including 4,000 regular monthly subscribers. The police were sent to the Society's office to deliver an order of the government to prohibit the distribution of this issue. But it was too late, and the officers seized only 100 copies of the March number. One of them said, "Gee, your Jehovah's people are very clever. I wish to be a Jehovah's witness myself too.'

RADIO CENSORSHIP IN NEW ZEALAND The New Zealand Radio Board, influenced by the Devil's clergy, re-fuse to allow the people to hear the Kingdom message over the air. / Jehovah's witnesses in New Zealand, however, are making an extra effort to tell the people why their rulers will not permit them to hear the truth. By means of a monster petition and letters to the public press, every effort is being made to give them this information. At the Wellington assembly, held recently, there were seven happy days spent in this work. "Locusts" swarmed on the streets, at the church doors, and called on the people at their homes. The rulers and principal people were visited. Policemen discussed with one another as to whether the street work should be permitted, but the work was completed without interference. A fitting climax to the assembly was the public meeting held in one of the large theaters. Here the people were invited to hear for themselves the lectures considered by the Radio Board too controversial to be heard over the air. Judging by the applause, the people were entirely out of sympathy with the decision of the Radio Board.

## **AMBASSADORS' CALL TO ACTION** Field to Be Wonderfully Prepared for Service Period Over 150 Stations to Broadcast Special Transcription Prog.

#### The Name of JEHOVAH Is a Strong Tower

To Those Who Are on His Side Meetings with Transcription Machines to Instruct Many

During these perilous times it is of vital importance to let the people know that there is only one place of security. Some are beginning to realize that the organizations of the world offer no real protection against the great day which is at hand. They are asking, "What is the way of escape? How may I re-ceive protection during the impend-ing conflict?" The name of Jehovah is a strong tower, and the righteous flee into it. Not only do the right-eous rejoice to take their stand on the side of Jehovah, but it is their keenest delight to notify the people concerning Jehovah's purposes and how they too may find the way of escape.

Brother Rutherford's special broadcasts last April directed many people to an investigation of the literature containing the Kingdom message. These speeches now prepared for electrical transcription will do much more to break down the prejudice aroused through igno-rance, but, with the financial stress growing more and more severe, many are unable to hear the radio lectures because of having to give up their radio sets. Here, then, is where the portable transcription machines provided by the Lord will meet the emergency which has arisen.

There has been a hesitancy on the part of some to get one of these machines, thinking that they cannot afford to rent halls and spend the money for extensive advertising. The expenditure of a lot of time and money should not be necessary. In working your territory, if you find some interested parties, suggest their meeting together in one of the homes, take out your transcription machine, and hold a meeting, having the neighbors invited to come in and listen. If you are working a rural section, the country schoolhouse can often be obtained free of charge. When in session ask the teacher to tell the pupils to inform their parents concerning the meeting, and put up a placard in a conspicuous place in front of the school, so that passers-by will notice it. Fraternal lodges, abandoned churches, town halls and courthouses can often be had free of charge

in small towns. One brother sug-gested the courthouse lawn, where most of the people in the small towns assemble. If you can obtain permission to use it, do so. Many small towns have so few things to distract the attention of the people that such a central place cutside would probably result in many listeners. Public parks, picnic grounds, public beaches, and summer resorts during the warm weather offer excellent places for outdoor meetings.

Tourist camps also should not be overlooked. It may be necessary to obtain permission to hold your meeting on their property; but if it is not granted, try the farmer across the road or a near-by service station or "hot dog" stand. Then invite the campers to attend the broadcast. Many of these camps are located on the outskirts of towns where there is nothing for the people to do dur-ing the evening before retiring. Many will be glad to have some such diversion, and will receive a great blessing thereby. These camps, being inhabited by a continually changing population, can be used repeatedly.

It is not to be expected that such meetings will be attended by great numbers, but if the machines are to be used effectively, they should be used frequently. Extensive prepara-tions need not be made, but if one is on the alert, places his placards announcing the meetings in conspicuous places, and then drives around town in his car broadcasting a musical record to attract attention to a big placard on his car advertising the meeting, interest can be aroused. Where sufficient interest is shown a series of meetings should be held to further develop the interest.

The drama "Defying Jehovah", which is an actual reproduction of the trial of our brethren at Summit, N. J., recently, will be broad-cast from the studios of WBBR on mit. Sunday morning, June 18, between six and seven o'clock, Eastern Day-light Saving Time, for the benefit of the brethren throughout the United States and Canada who are able to get our station. We would appre-ciate a card commenting on the presentation and advising how the pro-'gram was received.

There will be plenty of room on this folder for you to do that. Another of the 'whatsoever things

the Lord provides' is window cards. These are supplied only to brethren owning portable transcription machines, and will not be provided for any other purpose. These are arranged with a space in the center for the date and place of meeting, in the case of portable transcription meetings. Do not write in this space, but take a sheet of white paper cut wide enough to fit the space and neatly print the information upon it and then paste it in the space provided. When using these window cards for advertising the special broadcasts, cut the white band of paper sufficiently wide to cover the last two lines on the card (for the expressions "Bring your family and friends" and "Free" would not apply to a radio broadcast) and on this white sheet neatly print the title of the speech, the date and time of broadcast, and the radio station or stations in your vicinity carrying the lecture. If these cards are thus prepared and judiciously distributed in store windows they will have a good effect. Remember to have it definitely understood that these cards are not to be destroyed. Tell the store people you will be back to change the subject for each of these special broadcasts and to collect the

cards when the series are finished. These cards are to be similarly used when advertising your portable transcription meetings. On such occasions you will not cover up the two bottom lines, of course, and your strip of paper to be pasted on the space provided will contain the date, time and location of the meeting place. When the meetings move to some other section, the window cards are to be collected and reused.

These broadcasts have been timed so as not to interfere with the Am-bassadors' Devotional Period, while at the same time they prepare the way before the workers. The last of the three special speeches comes on the first Sunday of the campaign. Thus all radio folders and advertising are entirely removed from the special period, except, of course, the egular radio folders, which will be left as usual during that period.

These special speeches will be approximately three times as long as the regular weekly transcription. Therefore, as far as possible, these talks are arranged so as to com-mence at the regular time and in-clude the regular fifteen-minute peis placed in a conspicuous place riod and a half hour additional to thus including in your Ju where it will be seen and taken accommodate the three-record speech. the special period results.

#### "Smite Thine Hands Together"

Microphone announcements were used last April at a large number of stations not included in the special chains. This publicity was very ef-fective, together with distribution of radio folders, newspaper notices, "sandwich" boards, posters on automobiles and trucks.

Similar announcement-copy is now ready for giving most intensive mi-crophone publicity for the transcription rebroadcasts of the chain talks mentioned elsewhere in this issue. Besides the 150 and more stations selected to rebroadcast these talks there are hundreds of other stations in the United States which can be utilized by Jehovah's witnesses in each locality to direct listeners' at-tention to these special broadcasts. For convenience of the brethren, we are mailing two sets of announcements for such use to all points at which (or near which) one or more radio stations are situated, together with a letter of instruction regarding use.

JEHOVAH instructs the "son of man" company (Ezekiel 21:14) to "prophesy, and smite thine hands together, and let the sword be together, and let the sword be doubled the third time, the sword of the slain; it is the sword of the great men that are slain, which en-

tereth into their privy chambers". ADVANCE PUBLICITY is an essential part of this special cam-paign. As one claps ("smite thine hands together") to attract atten-tion, so it is now the privilege and duty of Jehovah's witnesses to use every agency at their disposal to stir and attract all possible attention to the 'prophesying' being done in obedience to His command. "Let the proclamation of the message of the day of the vengeance of our God continue with emphasis until it is complete. Repeatedly call the attention of the people thereto.' Vindication, Book One, page 279.

#### Hold Chain Records Pending Instructions

The five disks, containing the special chain speeches and another fifteen-minute program to be put on on July 9, are to be kept by the radio representative until he receives instructions regarding their further use. Under no circumstances are they to be used on the portable transcription machines without specific instructions to do so from this office.

#### **Special Report for** July 1 to 9

EVERY service director, sharpshooter, pioneer and auxiliary is to make out a report card covering the field witness activities during the Ambassadors' Devotional Period. This report is to be made out on one of the regular monthly report cards, and this card is to be headed by you, "Ambassadors' Devotional Period, July 1-9." This special re-port is to be sent in to the Society by July 16 at the very latest. This will mean that during July

TWO report cards will be made out. One report card will be for the Ambassadors' Devotional Period, and another report card for the ENTIRE month of July (from July 1 to 31); thus including in your July report

#### Shipment of the Special **Radio Folders**

All the companies, sharpshooters, pioneers and auxiliaries throughout the United States will receive a consignment of these special radio folders, free of charge. These folders are being shipped ONLY to the Eng-lish service directors and sharp-shooters and to the isolated pioneers and auxiliaries. Foreign machine and auxiliaries. Foreign-speaking and Colored companies and sharpshooters, pioneers and auxiliaries located within company territory are to arrange to obtain through the English service director or sharpshooter the quantity of folders they can dispose of.

As a general rule, the size of the consignment sent will be such as will enable the brethren to dispose of these folders within ten days of of these folders within ten days of their arrival. To accomplish this quick disposal, in company and sharpshooter territory especially, service directors and sharpshooters service directors and snarpshoulders must immediately notify the dif-ferent brethren in their territory of the receipt of the folders. Every effort must then be made to get the folders in the hands of the buckheen guidely that they in the brethren quickly, that they, in turn, may speedily distribute them to the people (without interrupting the field service work, of course); thus enabling as many people as possible to tune in on all three of the lectures.

lectures. The Society will start printing these folders June 5. On that same day, or on the next day at the lat-est, the shipping of consignments will begin. We expect to be able to print and ship out all the radio folders by June 10.

#### What to Do with Old Transcription Machine Records

#### Not to Be Used for Radio

Some of the brethren having portable transcription machines are writing in to the transcription department saying that they have already used the supply of records sent, and asking for more records, and also asking what to do with the ones now on hand.

The original intention was to rotate these records in quantities of six each, and once a month, beginning about July first. However, Brother Rutherford has approved another arrangement, which will operate during July, August and September, so that the rotating will be postponed until about November first. You will receive full instructions on this later, and will also receive notice when to rotate and what numbers you are to ship, and the numbers you will receive, at that time.

The supply of records which you now have can be repeated every three or more weeks until the new campaign begins; and if possible to hold meetings in different localities, they can be used indefinitely.

Do not under any circumstances use for radio purposes the records sent you for portable transcription machines, and do not loan them or ship them to other parties without written instructions from the transcription department. So please hold and use the records you now have on hand until you get further instructions from the office.



## **ALL RECORDS EXCELLED** International Thanksgiving Period the Greatest Ever Held World-wide Report Shows 3,920,190 Books and Booklets Placed Office and Factory to Be

6,682,439 Persons Receive Testimony

#### Brother Rutherford Heard by Vast Audience

The figures for The Remnant's Thanksgiving Period, April 8-16, are ready at last, and here they are, a whole page of them. Reports have been received from 76 different countries and all bear out the same conclusion, that this was the most wonderful service period ever en-joyed. Everywhere the brethren responded to the call to service as never before. Appreciating the tremendous importance of the message to be brought to the people, and that they were in a covenant with the Lord to do this, the brethren simply could not stay at home, for it was as a 'fire in their bones' and stirred their

zeal for the Lord to a fever pitch. During the spring Thanksgiving Period of 1932, when an international report of the results was tabulated, we rejoiced greatly as we beheld 38,585 workers in the field de-livering 2,447,840 testimonies and placing 840,340 pieces of literature in the hands of 710,638 persons. These workers reported 350,833 hours in the service. That was a mighty effort and a wonderful peri-The figures for the fall Thanksođ. giving Period (Kingdom Testimony Period) of the same year showed a decrease in number of workers to 37,411, total literature 677,122, ob-tainers 490,522, testimonies 2,202,-979, but those who participated 284 worked diligently and reported 384,-190 hours. With these figures as a basis the quota of 3,000,000 testimonies and 1,000,000 pieces of litera-ture was set at first for The Remnant's Thanksgiving Period of April 8-16. As it became known that more and more countries were going to be able to have the Crisis booklet for the campaign we became more hopeful for bigger results. The various printing plants of the Society rushed the translation of the booklet and its publication in as many languages as possible, and as a result 52 different countries, included in this report, had *The Crisis* in some language to place with the people.

And then the reports began to come in. In a very short time the million mark, in pieces of literature placed, was passed. The figures climbed steadily toward the two-"More workers than ever before, more zeal and joy in the service, for His spirit, His blessings and His much interested in reading litera-

and splendid results in the place-ment of literature." But even at that, when the figures showed that 3,920,190 books and booklets had actually been placed and 6,682,439 testimonies given within a short period of nine days, we could hardly be-lieve our eyes. That means that al-most 4.7 times as many pieces of literature were placed as during the same period of the preceding year, and about 5.8 times as many as during the Kingdom Testimony Period October 1-9, 1932. of

This amazing result was possible because of the Lord's blessing upon the efforts of his people who stood ready to take advantage of every ready to take advantage of every opportunity. His time had come for the people to be informed concern-ing the meaning of "The Crisis", and they were. To Him is due all the honor and glory. Instead of around 38,000 workers, the number portieingting roce to 28 204 ap in participating rose to 58,804, an in-crease of almost 53 percent, and these averaged better than 12 hours each in the witness work. The number of pioneers, auxiliaries and company workers all increased as each one seemed to appreciate the privilege and responsibility of being in the work and making his report. No doubt many of these new workers are of the Jonadab class, which is making itself more and more manifest. There are still a great many who participate in the Memorial emblems who do not appreciate their true significance, as is evidenced by the 84,179 reported for Memorial, compared with this 58,804. This Memorial report shows a slight in-crease over the preceding year, at which time 81,778 were reported.

Then, to cap the climax, on the night of April 16, at the close of this glorious period, when all the other workers had returned from the field, Brother Rutherford delivered a stirring lecture on "The Way of Es-cape", over a large network of radio stations. During the week millions of radio folders announcing the lecture were distributed in the United States and Canada and every effort was made to see that the people had an opportunity to listen to this important message. Shortly after the lecture thousands of letters and telegrams were received expressing appreciation and requesting a copy of the address.

of the address. It was surely a wonderful Thanks-giving Period and the brethren throughout the earth give thanks and praise to Jehovah for these in-

protection, none of this would have been possible. Knowing that you will delight in hearing a word from some of the various countries as to how they got along in this campaign, we give you some excerpts from their reports.

#### AUSTRIA

"We have never before had so much joy to send in our report, which is beyond all expectations. The former service weeks showed good results, but as compared with Thanksgiving Period they are far behind. In the Kingdom Week of last year we placed 22,000 booklets, but now the company workers alone distributed 34,000 booklets; and whercas last year the highest number of company workers was 400, this year 686 brethren have participated in the service. We are grate-ful to the Lord and rejoicing over this accomplishment."

#### BELGIUM

"The Thanksgiving Period has passed very well and I was im-pressed by the way in which all the brethren went joyfully and earnestly to the work, spurred on by the 'Feast of Jehovah'. During the week express letters and telegrams were received from brethren for more booklets, for they had not an-ticipated that *The Crisis* would have a better distribution than the *King*dom booklet.

#### BRITISH ISLES

"inis has been a unique experience. The brethren have never risen to an occasion as to this. nor has there ever been the same spirit manifested and continued through a like period of time. The total number of booklets placed is 220,388. We an-ticipated we might reach to 200,000, but the number has gone 10 percent in excess of that. The number of *Watchtower* subscribers who re-sponded to the invitation contained in Brother Rutherford's letter was more than expected. Some of these have now become regular workers. The presence of these new workers undoubtedly affected the regular workers. The grouping of pioneers in parties of from 6 to 18 in the cities, under the care and guidance of a regional service director or member of the Bethel family, was a great success and an inspiration to all the country."

#### **Closed August 21 to** September 4

#### **Order** Early

In harmony with the notice appearing in the July 1 Watchtower, that the Bethel factory, office and home will be closed from August 21 to September 4, to allow the brethren a change from their steady occupation here, it will be necessary, therefore, for orders for literature by companies, pioneers, auxiliaries and sharpshooters to be in this office by the second week in August to insure their being shipped before the close-down. Do not wait until the last minute to put through your or-der and then mark it "rush" or wire in, expecting it to receive preference over the orders of brethren who have complied with this request and put in their orders in time. It would not be just or fair to them to hold up their orders in order to permit some delinquent one to get a supply in emergency due to his own fault. Therefore, let each company, pioneer, auxiliary and sharpshooter take inventory of the stock on hand following Ambassadors' Devotional Period and estimate generously the stock you will require to run you until September 30, then forward your order to this office promptly. Do not skimp on your order so that you will have only enough to carry you over. See to it that you order enough to have a reasonable surplus for any emergency that may occur.

ture, and on account of the financial crisis the workers could not place any booklets in the hands of the people; but we had at hand about 1,000 copies of the Cedar Point Resolution of 1922 which we placed in the hands of the people."

#### CANADA AND NEWFOUNDLAND

"The brethren in Canada and Newfoundland entered into The Remnant's Thanksgiving Period with greater fervor than at any time prior thereto and Jehovah's rich blessing was upon their efforts to herald the Kingdom message. In that period they surpassed by 25 percent the number of workers ever before engaged in the field during any special period. These workers devoted 25 percent more hours and gave 35 percent more testimonies than ever accomplished during any special effort prior thereto. Despite the fact that this drive was held at a time when climatic conditions are most unfavor-

#### CENTRAL EUROPE

"The greatest battle God's  $\cos^{-1}$ nant people was ever engaged  $\sin^{-1}$ is now past. The Lord's visible army has victoriously advanced all along the line. Jehovah has indeed done great things for us, and our hearts are filled with praise and thanksgiving for the feast he had prepared for us.

for us. "The total result may be called marvelous; it has far surpassed our expectations. The greatest number of workers so far was 2,480. During this week, however, 1,220 above that number participated. In the past we were able to distribute during service weeks about 8,000 books and 80,000 booklets. This result was exceeded during Kingdom Week, in February, 1932, when 152,000 booklets were distributed in our territory. Our quota for the Thanksgiving Week was 160,000 booklets, but this was exceeded beyond expectation. In spite of the fact that the territory was reported to be more difficult, the wonderful result of 3,-076 books, 212,841 booklets and 18,-257 copies of *The Golden Age* was obtained. The number of hours in the service increased from 26,987 to 49,204, and the number of testimonies increased from 225,000 to 501,-000."

#### FRANCE

"The brethren put forth a great effort and were determined to obtain the highest results yet reached."

#### GERMANY

"The Thanksgiving Period was a great climax in the work here in Germany. The first day of this period the enemy opened his attack on the whole front. On the first day the interdiction and confiscating of the *Crisis* booklet was ordered by the Magdeburg government; but more than two million copies were already in possession of the brethren, and because the interdiction was accompanied by the interdiction of the whole Association in different states of Germany the brethren spread the whole quantity of booklets in a great hurry. Of course, under these circumstances the most of them were distributed without charge. In this way more than two million *Crisis* booklets were distributed in Germany. Never before in the history of the church was so much enthusiasm shown by the brethren."

Eight days after the end of The Remnant's Thanksgiving Period the whole factory and office of the Magdeburg branch was occupied by police; they sealed all the printing presses, and the entire plant was compelled to stop operating. The occupation continued for six days, and then the Lord showed his mighty hand and delivered his people. The government gave orders to discontinue all procedures against us and to lift the interdiction of the Bible Students Association and the Watch Tower Society in all Prussia. The entire action has merely furnished proof that the charges against the Watch Tower Society and the Bible Students Association were in every respect without any foundation. There was no evidence found to substantiate the assertion that we were connected with communists and socialists. ## Great Work to Be Done During Next Three Months

## **Summer Vacations Mean More Time to Witness**

Finish Rural Territory by September 30

#### Vindication and Preservation to Be Stressed

The manner in which Jehovah is going before his anointed and literally plowing, breaking and watering the earth with the three stirring radio speeches, first, over a national network of about 60 radio stations, next a nation-wide broadcast over 170 stations, and following that over hundreds of portable transcription machines in every nook and corner of the country, indicates the importance of this summer's activities. The King of Eternity is riding ma-jestically into action. The position of the anointed now is that of witnesses and heralds of the King. Every highway and byway, every city, town and hamlet must be told of the significance of the time in which we are living. God's remnant are prepared for that purpose. Every one who would be faithful to Jehovah at this time must use his every power to that end. As Brother Rutherford very definitely stated in his speech "The Way of Escape", the rulers have had their witness and we are now calling upon the people that those who love righteousness may escape and that the issue may be squarely presented to every creature, giving them an opportunity to take their stand on the Lord's side and have his protection or to reject the Lord's provision and suffer the consequences.

To do this properly, this summer must witness the greatest house-tohouse campaign ever staged. Every section of the rural territory held by companies should be finished before September 30, and where the portable transcription machine meetings are held this territory should be witnessed to twice: once before the meeting, doing the double work of witnessing and inviting the people you call upon to attend the meeting; and the second time within a week or ten days after the transcription meeting, so that advantage may be taken of the interest developed by the meeting.

The literature to be stressed is the Vindication and Preservation books and the booklets, with our objective being that of leaving at least a Crisis in every home, but be sure always to present the bound books first. This is particularly necessary in rural territory, where much time, energy and money is spent in reaching the people. The responsibility devolves upon each service director and service committee, pioneer and sharpshooter to plan this summer's work so that the greatest possible witness will be given. The service director is particularly charged with the responsibility of seeing that adequate provi-sions are made for every one in the company to have a part in these campaigns. The KINGDOM is the big thing in the lives of the anointed now. It is not a matter of 10 percent, 20 percent, or 50 percent, but each one must be 100 percent for the Lord and his cause, first, last and all the time.

In many companies there are a great many interested who love the Lord and his cause and who do not claim to be of the anointed, who are termed the "Jonadab" class. Provisions should be made so that every one of these can avail himself of the opportunity of demonstrating his love for the Lord and

his cause by participating in this activity to the extent of his ability. During the next three months there will be vacations for those who are employed in secular pursuits and because of this work are unable to devote all of their time to the Lord's kingdom service. What is going to be done with this vaca-tion? Is it going to be used to the praise of Jehovah's name or to gratify some personal desire along other lines? This is the question each one must face and answer before the Lord. Then there are Labor Day and the previous Saturday and Sunday, during which practically every one is released from all secular employment. How is this time to be used? Will it simply mean a drive to some divisional campaign, work  $2\frac{1}{2}$  or 3 hours and come home, or will it mean a real witness for Jehovah? These are serious questions for each one to ask himself or herself; for the issue is put squarely before us by Jesus in these words, "Herein is my Father glorified, that ye bear much fruit." Fruit-bearing is carrying the Kingdom message to the people to the extent of our ability. Therefore, during the Labor Day week-end at least six hours should be devoted to field service by company workers and sharpshooters, with auxiliaries increasing their time proportionately. The divisional leader, in arranging for territory for September 3 and 4 divisional campaign, is to allow at least 400 homes for each car. This does not need to be in one city, of course. The campaign can be extended to include sufficient territory to provide that many homes for each car in order that a thorough witness may be given. See to it, however, that the territory is within the company and sharpshooter assignments of your division. In this way adequate provisions will be made for all to have part in the campaign and also to give a real witness to the praise of Jehovah during this period.

(Continued from page 2, column 4) his work, and that just the contrary to what the enemy intended to do has taken place.

"Notwithstanding [this action by the government], in many parts of Germany all activities of Jehovah's witnesses are forbidden, and it seems that this week is the beginning of the great climax which will end in the full vindication of Jehovah's name. Jehovah's witnesses in this country rejoice that the Lord has given the promise to preserve his people, and they will go in full trust that Jehovah will destroy his enemies.

"Because of the trouble which was caused by the above-mentioned circumstances the report is not fully exact, since in some parts all correspondence with the Society is forbidden. About 10 percent of the companies have sent no report, and therefore all numbers are really a little higher than shown."

#### HOLLAND

"Here the proportion between the number of participants at the Memorial and the total number of workers is especially significant. Although the Devil has caused various difficulties in Holland recently, such as expulsions, etc., the brethren, and chiefly the pioneers, have put forth a very great effort. Holland is one of the stiffest countries for the witness work"

#### Divisional Campaign Equipment

In all divisional campaigns from this time forth the Preservation book is to be included in the combinations presented. Where the territory justifies it, the three books Vindication and Preservation may be presented and left with those who contribute one dollar. In poorer sections of the territory Preservation and booklets may be presented and an effort made to leave *Preservation*. If not, of course, the booklets. In every campaign each worker should have a supply of at least ten Crisis booklets and should try to leave one in every home. The workers should also bring along their own radio folders. The Kingdom booklet is to be presented to the local authorities with the letter and list of names as heretofore.

#### JAMAICA

"Each one went forth with renewed zeal and determination in the service. Although our output is not up to expectation, yet we rejoice greatly in the privilege of taking part therein. Financially the people are more depressed each year; and more are added to the ranks of the opposition class."

#### JAPAN

"We had a heavy rain all over Japan during this period, but in spite of this disadvantage all of Jehovah's witnesses were in the field with such a great joy of the Lord just the same."

#### JAVA

"Thanksgiving Testimony Period saw RADIO for the first time in Java. This happy period saw the first meeting of Jehovah's witnesses held in Java using the Dutch language. We made the first organized attack with the Chinese booklets, with encouraging results. The Lord has blessed us with good weather, for this hot-house joint, together with good health, His spirit and the cup of joy."

#### KOREA

"Am so glad to send this special report for Remnant's Thanksgiving Period. The people of Korea are very poor, and it is difficult for them to obtain literature; but Jehovah's special blessings were upon His witnesses in this period, as shown by the enclosed. That is the highest record for any testimony period ever had in Korea. In this period two Korean pioneers entered into north Manchuria. The land is very dangerous on account of the war, but they are faithful to the Almighty One and boldly active in there."

#### LITHUANIA

"The period commenced with good prospects. In Lithuania, as separate from Memelgebiet, over twice the usual number of workers were prepared for service. The Crisis booklet had arrived and all were look-ing forward to a busy time. Then suddenly, on the second day of the period, the forces of Gog showed themselves. A large number of the books were confiscated. An extra effort was therefore made the following day, but in the evening the manager and two British pioneers were arrested and confined in a buginfested cell for 18 hours, during which time they were refused permission to communicate with their consul. No provision was made by the police for meals or bedding, and all possessions were taken from them. They were kept under lock and key so long that they finally had one hour in which to pack their belongings. Every effort seems to have been made to get them across the border before news of their arrest leaked out. Just at the last minute the British consul got to hear of the affair and permission was obtained for them to remain a little longer to put their affairs in order.

"Although no charges have been made personally, newspaper articles have appeared stating that the literature spread is 'pure communistic agitation'. The authorities seem to have sensed the absurdity of this charge, for no attempt has been made to sustain it. 1,271 pieces of literature were placed in Lithuania before the work was stopped, however, and news of the arrests spurred on the witnesses of Jehovah in Me-melgebiet to greater activities." (Since the above report, word has come to the Brooklyn office that, although the matter is not definitely settled, there is every reason to expect that it will be possible to continue the work of the Kingdom in Lithuania with even greater results, as the recent experiences have aroused much interest.)

#### NORWAY

"As we did not have the *Crisis* booklet for this campaign, the result in booklets placed is not so great as it could have been. But the result is very encouraging anyway, and certainly as good as it could be under the circumstances. The placement of bound books in this period far exceeds the placement in the same period last year, 1,320 against 112. The outstanding feature as a whole was greater zeal and joy in the work, amongst the brethren everywhere, and greater interest for the work. The message is more and more parting the people into two camps—for and against the truth. Gog seems to be busy also in our little country."

#### PERU

"The desired number of hours could not be put in, on account of holiday week. The Catholics here were celebrating what they term 'Holy Week'. There were processions or parades through the streets every day. When I tell the people here that the clergy represent the Devil they pause for breath and are shocked; nevertheless, there are some among the younger generation and middle-aged men who have no use for the clergy, and when I show them the *Deliverance* book, about the clergy, they are pleased and readily obtain the books. They all know me here; even the small children on the street point me out and say, "There goes the one who does not believe in any religion.' Some are much pleased with the books, and state 'we need many more like you down here in this dark country'."

#### POLAND

## **Those Without Radios to Hear Special Broadcasts Campaign with Transcription Machines Begins July 16**

## Meetings to Develop Interest

in Kingdom Message

#### How to Report Meetings in **Outside Territory**

July 16 will mark the beginning of an extensive campaign with the three special speeches "The Way of Escape", "Effect of Holy Year on Peace and Prosperity" and "King-dom Blessings for the People". These lectures have created a nation-wide interest and contain the message of the hour. Therefore, everyone who owns or controls a portable tran-scription machine should be ready to go into action on July 16.

Have you analyzed your territory picked out the best places for these meetings? Are you making arrangeinents for the proper advertising by placards, signs on the sides and spare tire of your car, and such other means of inviting the people as you may intend to use locally? Start making these preparations start making these preparations now, so that they will not interrupt your work during Ambassadors' Devotional Period. Then after this Devotional Period the final arrangements for the coming Sunday's campaign can be made.

While this campaign is to be of an intensive and extensive nature, it is not to be permitted to becloud the field witness work. The machines are primarily for the use of the companies or pioneers in their own assigned territory. However, if someone holding the adjoining territory, be it a pioneer, company or sharpshooter, requires the assistance

of a portable transcription machine and such assistance can be given without interrupting the field witness work, it may be rendered: but if it means pulling a pioneer away from his own territory for half a day, a whole day, or a number of days, making it impossible for the pioneer to put in his full time in door-to-door witnessing, he should not be requested to render such aid; and if he should be requested he should not respond under the circumstances, because it is absolutely imperative that the field witness work be kept up as well as the portable transcription witness. His first obligation is to get in his pioneer hours; for if he does not do this, he cannot expect to have his needs provided for enabling him to keep in the pioneer service. Since the owner of the transcription machine will have the forms upon which to report the meetings held, such reports should be made by him, and not by the party who has invited him to hold the meeting in his as-signment. If such meeting is in a county different from that to which the machine owner has been assigned, a separate county sheet should be headed and the meeting reported thereon as well as the results included in the monthly report submitted. When machines owned by divisions and used by different companies, pioneers and sharpshooters are transferred from one to the other, be sure to include advertising placards, instructions for operation, and report forms and instructions covering same.

**Special Broadcast Records** Should Be Shipped Promptly

#### **Outdoor Meetings During** Summer

A special portable transcription machine campaign with the chain speeches will commence Sunday, July 16. If each one who has to do with the handling of the records will promptly cooperate according to the instructions received from this office, there will be no difficulty in having the records in the hands of the transcription machine owners in plenty of time to commence on that date. This, however, will mean that the radio representatives are to ship these records promptly to the party to whom they are instructed to ship them. During the remainder of July and all of August and September these machines are to be used exclusively for broadcasting Brother Rutherford's special chain talks.

The big thing is to see that this message is placed within the reach of everyone in your territory. There should be very little expense to such assemblies, especially during the summer months. As a rule, people prefer to assemble out of doors; therefore the logical thing to do is to concentrate on the outdoor places where the people gather, and arrange for your meetings there.

hovah that I am handing you herewith the report for Thanksgiving Week. This has indeed been 'the greatest witness ever given in this territory' (to use the words of your circular letter of January 15, 1933). Never has the blessing of the Lord been so manifest upon our labors in this country. We all unite in prais-ing Jehovah; for the success obtained surpassed our fondest hopes immensely. During December, 1932, the total number of books and booklets sent out of office (our record for 3 years) was 2,135; in March another record, at 3,109; and now nearly 2,000 in one single 9-day peri-od! We are hoping to reach the 4,000 mark this month. Our total distribution during the whole year 1930-31 was only 9,217; i.e., the year before last."

#### SWITZERLAND

"The testimony which has again been given in Switzerland during this special week is to be rejoiced over. More than half of the people witnessed to accepted the literature; and this shows that the territories in Switzerland count still among the best. The capital city received a specially imposing witness. In splendid, calm weather an aeroplane encircled the city for over 40 min-utes, showering down 50,000 leaf-The sensation caused among lets. the people just returning home from their working places was great and enabled the brethren stationed over the whole city to place, in 4 hours, 2,300 booklets. The office and factory staff, comprising 48 workers, distributed, in 935 hours, 6,087 book-lets and gave 10,726 testimonies."

#### THE UNITED STATES

The Remnant's Thanksgiving Period was the greatest witness yet for the United States. Never before has there been such a response to a call to service as during this special period. During the same period last year 13,628 participated in the work. This year from the United States and territory under its direct supervision reports were received from 20,902, or an increase of 7,274 work-With such a big increase in ers. number of workers engaging in the service for the first time, we might expect the general averages of time and placements to be considerably less; but the results were just to the contrary. During the nine days 886,592 books and booklets were placed. During the Kingdom witness week of September 1931, when the Kingdom booklet was offered, 732,-852 books and booklets were left with the people. That was considered remarkable, but now, a year and a half later, with the depression far greater than in 1931, an even greater amount of literature was placed.

"God's typical people celebrated "God's typical people celebrated two periods of the year: one in the spring and one in the autumn sea-son. Those periods were 'holy unto the Lord'. Why should not God's anointed people specially observe during the year two days of joy, thanksgiving and praise unto Jeho-vah God? "The joy of the Lord is your strength.' The Lord 'has given us an understanding of his word' and continues to graciously 'feed us and continues to graciously 'feed us upon food that is convenient'. The kingdom is here and progresses, and our business is to sing forth the praises of Jehovah God and, as his witnesses, to bear testimony to his name."—The Watchtower, February 15 1022 15, 1932.

September 30 to October 8 is to be the autumn "period of joyful thanksgiving, praise and service un-to Jehovah God, a feast to the pros-perous kingdom work", and there-fore it is designated Kingdom Proc-lamation Period. To be sure, there are other service periods during the year in which the remnant delight to put forth a special effort to sing forth the Lord's praises, but, these being seasons of special feasting September 30 to October 8 is to being seasons of special feasting upon the goodness of Jehovah, it is the desire of the remnant to make each one of these spring and fall thanksgiving periods bigger and bet-

ter than ever. Brother Rutherford is so im-pressed with the importance of this fall period that he has addressed a special letter "to Jehovah's witness-es in all the earth", sending it to us from London, England, so that it may be received by Jehovah's wit-nesses in the August issue of the Bulletin, regardless of where they may be. All branch offices that publish their own *Bulletin* will carry a translation of this letter in their own particular language for the ben-

importance of putting forth every possible effort to give thanks unto the Lord by actively engaging in proclaiming the Kingdom.

For a practical example of what would be pleasing and acceptable to Jehovah in these feast seasons, it is well to briefly consider what he required of his typical people. These experiences were recorded for our learning, upon whom the ends of the ages have come.

First: They were holy unto Je hovah.

Second: Every male member of Israel was bound to appear before Jehovah at the sanctuary at Jeru-

salem. Third: There was a general oc-casion set apart from servile work. Fourth: The first and last days of the feast were entirely devoted to

the service of Jehovah. This strongly indicates that the anointed and all who love Jehovah should wholly set themselves on his side and strive for the prosperity of Jerusalem, cutting off and laying aside all hindrances to the service work; wherever possible getting off some or all of the time from secular employment for this occasion, and especially setting aside the first and last Saturdays and Sundays of the campaign for the exclusive service of Jehovah.

If the Lord was pleased with and accepted this typical service of Isaccepted this typical service of is-rael, with greater reason we may expect him to be pleased with the whole-hearted participation of his people now in that which Israel's ceremonies typified. ing a season of feasting and rejoicing, Jehovah has provided his peo-ple with something special to make their hearts glad. That special course for the feast is to be a new 64-page booklet, Escape to the King-dom. Fifty-two countries were able to use the Crisis booklet during the spring International Thanksgiving Period, and every effort is to be made to get this booklet published in even more languages and shipped in advance to all countries, so that all of the brethren can share in its distribution during Kingdom Proclamation Period.

If we hope to make Kingdom Proclamation Period even a greater witness than The Remnant's Thanksgiving Period, it will mean everyone's doing just a little more than he did at that time. Then 58,804 workers reported, on the average, 12.3 hours each, including the many additional hours reported by pioneers, auxiliaries and some company workers. In other words, many put in many more hours than 12.3 in order to bring up to this average the shortage of others. Therefore, in order to obtain better results, let the company workers try to increase their average from 10 to 13 hours, the auxiliaries from 26 to 29, and the pioneers from 42 to 45. Place-ments come as a result of giving the testimony. The number of testimonies reported during the spring campaign averaged a little better than 9 per hour per worker. That is truly a remarkable average. It shows that the work was done at top speed; it would be very difficult to cover territory any faster. More hours in the field, therefore, will be necessary to better the results. Each worker throughout the earth, on the average, placed 4.75 pieces of litera-ture per hour. This average was possible by the large number made of booklets given to the people in Germany even though no contribu-tions were received. This also stress-es the importance of each one's giving more time to the work than ever if there is to be an increase in total literature distributed.

The transcription machines which are in the hands of the brethren are being put to good use in getting out the Kingdom message. The early reports indicate good attendance at the meetings. In fact, for 145 meet-ings held by the pioneers the total attendance has been 7,099, or an average of approximately 49 at each meeting. They have had many in-teresting experiences in holding these meetings, and a report of such in addition to the regular report card information is appreciated by us; for from these many valuable suggestions can be obtained. Thus, one brother has found that if rubber cement (the stainless kind used in art work) is used in pasting on the placards the announcements of place and time of meeting, the cement will rub right off when the paper is removed, leaving the poster neat and clean. In leaving these posters in the stores it is well to impress the storekeeper with the fact that you will call for them after the meeting and that you do not want them destroyed. If you don't do this they are likely to be thrown out.

Another brother writes:

You may be interested to know of my experience at an unemployment camp near Jacksonville. We have been out several times with the machine. There are more than 300 men living at this state military camp. I called on the major and the captain in charge and asked permission to entertain the men for an hour with Judge Rutherford's lectures and a musical program. I presented both with a Crisis, and they agreed to post a notice on the board. They put us on the platform for boxing bouts. We tuned up to 70, and you could hear it all over the big camp. Had an audience around the ring of about 100. At the close they gathered around and asked questions. Practically all of them were opposed to religions of today. When we promised to return in two weeks' time, they asked, 'Why can't you come next week?' and so it was 'next week' until we made five trips. The electrician delighted to help us get electrical connections. He had been an assistant field manager for NBC, and, I later found out, 'was to put us out of the camp if anything was said that was not O.K.' The second trip he was glad to ac-cept some booklets and offered to place the whole set of booklets in the camp library, where, he informed me, they were creating much inter-At the last two broadcasts the est. captain was present, expressing himself as pleased that the men were taking such interest in a program of that nature. We used two musical records to draw the crowd, and then a lecture with a brief introduction of the judge. These camps may be a place that some of the friends are overlooking. There are many fine fellows among them, and they ad-vertise as they travel."

## The Plainfield Meeting a Thriller The Lord's Protection Most Manifest

#### Now for a Steady Downpour of Truth

According to the 1930 census, Plainfield, New Jersey, is a city with a population of 34,422; not so large, but its officials have been bitter in their opposition to the message of God's kingdom. On Sunday, July 30, their strong-arm squad attended in force the mass meeting which was held in their city for the purpose of hearing Brother Rutherford deliver a lecture on the subject "Why Religious Intolerance Is Practiced Now in This Country". Like the wor-shipers of Baal whom Jehu called together to offer sacrifices unto Baal. they came decked in their robes of identification, handcuffs, ammunition belts, revolvers and sawed-off shot-guns; in fact, armed to the teeth. There were two or three policemen stationed at each of the exits, be-sides others in plain clothes who were specially detailed at each exit and throughout the audience. These also carried guns. Even on the plat-form itself and behind the drop curtain armed guards were stationed, prepared to blaze forth at the least provocation. To the early arrivals this armed guard was so large that it appeared that a policemen's con-vention, instead of a Bible lecture, was to be held.

An hour or more before the meeting time the people began to assemble for the lecture. The day was extremely hot, but many of the order-loving people of Plainfield and vicinity who desire righteousness braved the heat and came early in order to get in. Many brethren had come also to participate in distributing the invitations to this special mass meeting. Seventeen of them had been seized by the police the previous day and held in jail to suffer as Christ suffered because of their faithfulness to Jehovah.

Suspicious of every act, the strongarm squad, upon seeing one brother come in with a package, demanded to know what he had, but he refused to tell. Peremptorily the package was seized and torn open. Much to the chagrin of the officer, instead of finding a bomb or explosives, he found some copies of *The Golden Age* which were afterwards given free to the people.

By three o'clock the big hall was packed and others had assembled in another theater connected by loud-speaker extension. The audience hung on every word that Brother Ruther ford had to say, as if spellbound. If the officials of Plainfield anticipated the stopping of the meeting by their display of arms, or if they expected that Brother Rutherford would put on the soft pedal, they were quickly disillusioned. Boldly and fearlessly, yet without sarcasm or ridicule or attacking any individuals, the truth was presented to the people of Plainfield and the radio audience. The strong-arm squad were seen paying close attention to the arguments presented.

Brethren were stationed at the various exits who passed out these copies, and it was especially notewor-

Brother Rutherford had arranged with the police captain to release the brethren who were in jail, and the meeting in the park was delayed until these seventeen had been brought there from jail. Brother Rutherford then spoke to the brethren for a few minutes, outlining the big campaign to be made with this special issue of The Golden Age and bringing to their attention words of encouragement from the Lord's Word. All went home re-joicing greatly in the privilege which the Lord had granted to them that day of being his witnesses and having been present at this meeting at which the protection of the Lord, in spite of the strong-arm squad of Satan's organization, was so clearly manifest.

## Good Results with Transcription Machine

#### Keep Them Busy

Reports coming to the office from the different brethren assigned to the work of operating the portable transcription machines indicate that in a number of cases these brethren do not really appreciate what comprises the real field for this type of work. Many of them seem to figure that all they have to do is to get a machine, set it up in some little, stuffy hall, do a little bit of local advertising, and then the people will come to the meeting.

Other brethren, realizing the need of forethought and planning for these campaigns, obtain splendid results. They realize that the last place in the world to put one of these machines, if they want a real audience, in this weather, is in a hot, stuffy hall. They go out in the open, into the parks, camping sites, picnic grounds, by lakes where the people assemble, and in summer cottage colonies, and places such as these, where the people are and want to be. They feel at home and relax there and will gladly attend a meeting of this nature when it is ar-ranged for at their convenience, and that is what we must do if we want success. In going after parks, if you cannot get permission from the park commissioner to use the public parks and playgrounds, don't lie down and quit then; go to the farmer across the street, or to any one convenient who has a suitable place for an assembly; scout around. There are many places in practical-ly every community where meetings can be held.

These meetings can be held Saturday afternoon, Saturday evening, and three or four on Sunday, if proper effort is put forth and the territory is really scouted out by competent brethren. One brother, taking advantage of such openings during the month of July, put on 26 meetings and had a total attendance of 4,937, an average of almost 190 people at each meeting. These meetings were arranged by a pioneer in isolated territory. Another brother loaded his machine into his car and started out. He knew where there were a number of fruit pickers' camps along the highway. He planned in advance, got permission from the superintendent, and, starting with the first one, served them in a row, making five different places each Sunday, and repeated the route every Sunday until 24 of these meetings were held; at which 227 persons took literature, besides the great number who heard and did not obtain any literature.

These are simply illustrations of what may be done to push this work if the brethren are versatile and zealously using their kingdom interests to the praise of Jehovah.

## "Escape to the Kingdom" Will Bring On **More Howls**

#### With All the Publicity These Booklets Should Go Like Wildfire

The appropriateness of this title, Kingdom Proclamation Period, at this time is emphasized by the statement appearing in the August 1 Watchtower: "Now there is revealed to those who have taken their stand on Jehovah's side the great truth that there is rapidly approaching a time of unprecedented prosperity and blessings for the human race. Those who are diligent to grasp the truths that are placed before them are lifted far above the present sad conditions of this world and see the incontrovertible proof that the time of deliverance is at hand."

This marvelous vision is given to the anointed now for their en-couragement in pushing the battle to the gate. The insufferable arto the gate. The insufferable ar-rogance and defiance of the Devil and his representatives before Jehovah is increasing daily. They are desperately straining every nerve to stop the activity of Jehovah's wit-nesses. The opposition is world-wide, and it can truly be said now that 'all nations are being gathered against Jerusalem to battle'. Gog is des-perately trying to keep the people in ignorance of the Kingdom, but he cannot succeed. With the vision of the Kingdom which the Lord has given his anointed, enabling them to see the Inspector General of Jehovah's host inspecting the city of Jerusalem and measuring the earth, they realize that he is cognizant of all that is taking place and is directing the issue to the praise of Je-hovah's name. They have implicit confidence in him and those of the truly anointed cannot be turned aside.

In Escape to the Kingdom Jehovah has equipped the anointed with the most pointed message ever delivered upon the earth since the days of our Lord, proving beyond all doubt that the battle of the great day of God Almighty is imminent; that the so-called "Holy Year" will provide no way of escape for the people and that the kingdom of God under Christ is here and it is the only refuge. Where local business men or school boards control the auditorium where the message is to be given they try to bring pressure to bear on these to have the permit to use the auditorium withdrawn; they try to bring pressure to bear on local authorities to have the message prohibited from public parks and other public places; but just as sure as the Lord had the message broadcast over the radio stations in the chain hook-up and over more than 150 stations by electrical transcriptions, just so surely may his people expect success in putting this message on by portable transcription machine in their re-spective areas. Do not permit anything to stop you. Go forward with implicit confidence. Insist on the various ones with whom you con-tract to use their hall that they carry out their part of the contract. If they do not, but insist on closing it down, make arrangements for announcing to the people (when they assemble there) of some other near-by location, out in a field or park or any place you can put on the records, where the people can listen to them. This is a real fight and must be pushed with determination and zeal.

My beloved Brethren:

The Scriptures and the physical facts abundantly prove that the battle of the great day of God Almighty is near at hand. There are millions of persons of good will who desire to learn the way of escape. Jehovah has committed to his witnesses the great privilege of informing the people that he is the Almighty God, and that the only way of escape is to his kingdom.

This good news of the kingdom must now be preached to all the world as a witness, and you will prove your love for Jehovah by joyfully participating in that work. The booklet ESCAPE TO THE KINGDOM, which contains that message, will be available to all witnesses by the latter part of September. Be fully prepared to participate in the work from September 30 to October 8. May I suggest the following brief testimony in connection with the booklet:

The times are very hard and the people continue to suffer, and there is just one way of escape from even greater trouble. He has overruled the advertising of the message so that everyone will want to read it, Catholic, Protestant and Jew, as well as those who claim they do not believe in the Bible at all. The common people heard the message over the air gladly, and rejoiced in it, and are waiting for you to call with their copy of it. It is the leaders, particularly among the Catholics, who are bringing pressure to bear to have this message stopped, and this should be most encouraging to all of Jehovah's anointed and is proof conclusive that it is having its effect among the Catholic people to such an extent that the leaders are desperately trying to stop it.

During the Remnant's Thanksgiving Period the Lord used his people throughout the earth to give the tremendous witness of over 6,600,000 testimonies, and almost four million pieces of literature were placed in the hands of the people. Undoubtedly the Kingdom Proclamation Period is going to exceed this to a considerable extent in countries where it is possible to place this message in the hands of the people. In some countries, of course, the activity has been temporarily stopped, but the Lord is cognizant of this also and permitting it for a good purpose. In the other countries, the tremendous interest created in the message, the more favorable weather conditions in the fall in this northern hemisphere, where the great majority of the brethren live, and the fact that the people of the world are going into another winter with practically no relief from the miseries that they have endured in the past, will cause the people to be on the lookout for some way of escape. Therefore, with all these favorable circumstances we should reasonably anticipate from 10 to 15 percent increase in every country where the witness work is carried on. We would therefore suggest to the brethren throughout the earth, whether it be a branch, company, sharpshooter, pioneer or auxiliary, or those who hope to be of the Jonadab class, that for this period a quota be established 15 percent greater than that for the Remnant's Thanksgiving Period. Undoubtedly the Lord will add the increase to the results of our efforts if we go for-ward in faith. The circumstances seem to justify our expectation of However, increase. keep in mind that this cannot be done in our own strength. Each one must look to Jehovah and go forward in this battle with the one predominant thought that that which is being done will redound to the praise of His name.

You have all read Brother Rutherford's letter in the August Bulletin and have been thrilled as he forcibly places before us the importance of this real issue. For the September Bulletin Brother Rutherford has forwarded from Paris another letter, with a brief, pointed and forceful testimony to be delivered when you present Escape to the Kingdom. As quickly as possible after the close of this period, this report is to be sent in to the Society.

AS A SPECIAL EXCEPTION, your report for the month of September is to close on the 29th. In other words, your September report will include all the work done during September except the last day of the month, or the beginning of the special period, September 30. Therefore your September report will be from September 1 to the 29th inclusive; and the October report, from September 30 to October 31 inclusive.

fore them in the most effective way. This letter is being supplied in advance to all the branches throughout the earth so that it can be printed in their *Bulletin* and thus uniformity of presentation may be had by all.

It is hoped that the brethren in the United States will reach a total over two million testimonies in this period, and over 300,000 hours, and make over 900,000 placements, and leave a million pieces of literature with the people. In view of all the advertising this message has received throughout this country, we believe this is a very conservative estimate. All the branches are putting forth every effort to have *Escape* to the Kingdom available in more countries than those in which the Crisis booklet was available, and we feel confident that the magnitude of this message will exceed anything to date.

Let each one, therefore, take this matter before the Lord. Pray for a wider door of service for yourself and for all the anointed of Jehovah throughout the earth and then, in harmony with that prayer, go forward in the service.

## Organization of Work with Transcription Machines Outlined

#### Method of Reporting Important

Each assembly of Jehovah's wit-nesses, whether under the sharpshooter or the company arrangement, that owns and uses a portable transcription machine for playing Brother Rutherford's records, should appoint a competent brother to have charge of this work. Wherever possible the service director or sharnshooter should be assigned to this All correspondence and reduty. ports to the Society are to be handled by this brother. Therefore the name and address of the one so appointed to serve should be sent in to this office as soon as possible, so that our records may be accurate and that all future instructions, records, etc., may be forwarded to the said party.

Brethren who have been thus appointed to supervise the portable transcription machine work are requested to make regular monthly report of that work direct to this office. The P.T.M. reports are to be made out promptly at the close of each month on the special report cards furnished for this purpose.

DIVISIONAL MACHINES: In cases where the machine is owned by a division, the one appointed by the division to take charge of the transcription work is to make these monthly reports, and NOT the service director, sharpshooter, or pioneer who may have used the machine during the month.

MACHINES IN COMPANY TER-RITORY: Where one or more machines are operated in company or sharpshooter territory, the P.T.M. 'reports should be made by the one appointed by the company to supervise the transcription work in its

#### Ammunition for the Divisional Campaigns, September 3 and 4

PIONEER AND AUXILIARY MACHINES: Pioneer and auxiliary brethren who have machines should make a separate report of their machine activities direct to this office as pioneers and auxiliaries; exception, in cases where a pioneer or auxiliary is appointed by the company to direct the activities of the company's machine. Then the card should be checked as coming from the company, and NOT from the pioneer or auxiliary. MACHINES IN ISOLATED TEIRRITORY: Brethren owning

MACHINES IN ISOLATED TERRITORY: Brethren owning and operating machines not in company or sharpshooter territory and who are not organized for service should make separate P.T.M. reports direct to this office.

In cases where the machines are operated in several counties during the month it is NOT necessary to make a separate monthly report for the activities in each county. Only a combined monthly report is required.

County Sheets are supplied for the purpose of keeping a record of the transcription machine activities carried on in each county. These are to be used in accordance with the instructions on these County Sheets.

Users and operators of divisional and company machines should obtain all their supplies, instructions, placards, etc., from the one appointed to supervise the activities of the machine. The Society does NOT send placards, records, or instructions to anyone except the person in charge of the machine.

## **Catholic Coercion Has Not Stopped the Truth**

5,000,000 Radio Folders to Be Distributed

A Coast-to-Coast Network Arranged

Simultaneously with the Kingdom Proclamation Period Brother Rutherford will again speak to the peo-ple of America in person. Catholics, Protestants and Jews and every-body opposed to the witness of the Lord have made a big fuss and do a lot of talking about what they are accomplishing in removing Brother Rutherford's lectures from the air. Those who are thoroughly ac-quainted with the facts, however, know that up to the present the Catholics have persuaded very few stations to drop these lectures. Even in the cities where these lectures have been discontinued because of threats and coercion on the part of the Catholic clergy, a greater wit-ness has been given than ever be-And now, in spite of all this fore. opposition, arrangements are com-pleted for broadcasting a special series of three lectures over a coastto-coast network in which there will be approximately 100 stations. The Subjects are: THE TRUE GOD, on October 1; THE MIMIC GOD, on October 8; and WHY SERVE JE-HOVAH, on October 15.

An intensive campaign should be started immediately and continued during the three weeks in which these broadcasts are made, to inform everyone about these lectures so that they may tune in and learn

the truth. Radio folders are being consigned to all the companies and sharpshooters and to isolated pioneers and auxiliaries. Pioneers and auxiliaries working in company territory will get their supply of radio folders through the company. These should be put in the hands of the people, and they should be personally invited to tune in. If they don't have a radio set, tell them to go to their neighbor who has, because this message is of vital importance to every creature living.

Arrangements should be made to announce these three special lectures over the stations which now carry Brother Rutherford's transcription programs weekly. The one handling the regular announcements for the records should change them so as to include an announcement of the coast-to-coast network in the opening and closing announcement of each program. If the station over which the transcription record is being broadcast is not in the chain, then announce one or two stations which can be very well heard in that vicinity and which are in the chain.

Be sure that announcements are made at the transcription meetings, giving this series of three programs real publicity. It is the purpose of Jehovah's witnesses to advertise the King and Kingdom, and by informing the people of this country of these three vitally important broadcasts we do this very thing and the people will hear again the clear-cut truths which the Lord wants brought forth at this time.

"Sunday, August 13, we put on a lecture at 11:00 a.m., "The Way of Escape,' to 135 colored people in their church. The minister objected. ... but the board of deacons came

up and said, 'We are going to have this lecture. We invited these people here to give us this lecture and we are going to have it.'"

"A party of pioneers advertised a meeting at Lanette to take place at 2 p.m. at the home of Brother — . Before the hour for the meeting the home was filled and the people were standing in the yard and around the house, in all over 150 people. "The Way of Escape' and 'Holy Year" were given. One lecture was not enough for these people. Not a single person left until after the two lectures were completed."

We hope that by the time you receive this *Bulletin* all preparations for the most extensive witness ever given on earth will have been completed. The Kingdom Proclamation Period marks the beginning of the fiscal year 1934, which opens up with a promise of greater privileges than we have ever before enjoyed. The issue is clear-cut now, and the crisis is here, and the anointed are meeting it with joy and confidence.

meeting it with joy and confidence. September activities, which concentrated on the distribution of special Golden Age No. 363 and the booklets Heaven and Purgatory, Crimes and Calamities, War or Peace, and Prohibition, in regular territory and in special divisional campaigns at points where the Catholic pressure induced radio stations to discontinue broadcasting Brother Rutherford's transcription records, exceeded our fondest expectations. Over 1,100,000 Golden Ages vanished as though the earth had swallowed them up (in fact, that is what actually took place); and 600,000 old booklets, which we hardly dared hope would be entirely disposed of, kept going out so fast that we found it difficult to keep up with the ship-ments, and now, the 15th of the

#### Consignment of Special Radio Folders

Five million special radio folders are being printed for the purpose of informing the public of the nationwide chain broadcasts by Brother Rutherford October 1, 8 and 15, and arrangements have been made whereby all the companies, sharpshooters, pioneers and auxiliaries in the United States can have a share in distributing them to the people.

Consignments of these folders are now being shipped direct to the serv-ice directors of the English companies, to the sharpshooters, and to the pioneers and auxiliaries located in isolated territory. This means that the colored and foreign companies, pioneers and auxiliaries located in English company territory are to arrange to obtain their folders from the service director of the English company; for they will not receive direct consignments. Also, the pioneers and auxiliaries located in the same town as the sharpshooter are to obtain their folders from the sharpshooter, to whom they will be sent. The pioneers are being al-lotted 510 of these radio folders, and the auxiliaries 340. -These brethren should apply for their allotments accordingly

These folders are to be placed in the hands of the people as soon as possible. Every effort should be made to get them out in time for the first broadcast, October 1.

(Continued from page 1, column 4) Year' and 'Jehovah Is God', in a vacant lot across the street from the post office. About 80 people listened. ... The next Saturday we got permission to put on the record in

front of the bank and the main drug store; probably 300 or 400 people listened, mostly farmers. The sidewalks were crowded and the people were standing by the parked cars along the road. The long and short of these experiences is that we placed as many books in the last two days as we did during the 30 days previous. We keep our machine in the car and take the loudspeaker and place it out over the engine, leaning it against the windshield."

From Kentucky we had a report that "when the preachers saw the advertisement of the portable transcription meeting they arranged for a big baptismal service and warned the people not to attend Judge Rutherford's meeting. . . . We waited until the baptismal service was finished. With all arrangements completed for the lecture, we then put on a musical record to attract the attention of the people, and the entire 150 people who assembled at the baptismal meeting came over and heard the lecture "The Way of Escape". Some came in cars and some sat on the schoolhouse steps."

These are only a few of the many interesting experiences that are continually coming in indicating how the Lord is using these machines to the praise of his name. Everyone who owns one of these machines or directs its use should carefully scout around and see if in addition to the parks and other public places there are not hospitals, old folks' homes, large municipal boarding houses and other places where people congregate, particularly now, with cool weather setting in, where they can arrange for a series of these meet-

ings. If you put forth the effort, undoubtedly the Lord will open the way and bless it with success.

There are a few points concerning this work that we should like to call to your attention again. County sheets should be kept on file by the service directors, sharpshooters and pioneers and submitted to this office only when the territory is released. In most cases, as far as companies and sharpshooters are concerned, this will simply be a permanent record of the meetings put on in their territory which they themselves are to keep and have available in case the Society requests the information; but if you relinquish the territory, please send in the report of meetings held in that assignment.

Only one monthly report card is necessary from each group owning and operating machines. If a company has a number of machines, one report, summarizing the work done, and showing the number of machines in the proper place, is all that is necessary. We do not want a monthly report on each county. Under the heading "Total Attend-

is to be reported the entire ance" attendance for the month, including visitors and brethren. Under the heading "Remarks" we should like you to show the general results you are having in the placing of literature and any other interesting ex-perience that might be beneficial to others. In the case of companies portable transcription reports, the name of the company should appear as well as the name and address of the brother supervising the tran-scription activities. In cases where the English companies loan their machines to foreign or colored companies or sharpshooters, the company owning the machine, through the party supervising it, is to make all reports. He is to receive the information from the parties to whom the machine is loaned, summarize that information, and forward it to this office as requested.

It has been noticed in some cases that when the portable transcription machine is on, the machine is kept in view of the audience, and that the brother operating the machine and the brother making the announcement are very conspicuous, whispering to each other about one thing or another and in this way thing or another and in this way attracting the attention of the au-dience to themselves. This should never be. Wherever possible the body of the machine should be kept out of sight, so that the people will part case the records put on or not see the records put on or changed. In many cases when this happens they see the brother running the machine take off the record or arrange to turn it over, and they think the speech is ended and walk out. Keep the machine out of sight. The short time it takes to turn a record over or to put on another will not be noticed if the audience does not see what takes place. All the brethren who attend those meetings should be as inconspicuous as possible, so that those attending can concentrate on the talks.

When portable transcription machines are ordered, a supply of musical records and needles should be ordered at the same time. These are not supplied free by the Society, and, of course, are sent only on the order from the party getting the machine. We have on hand at the present time 4 musical records: 2 single-faced records which the Society is able to obtain for the brethren at 75c each, and 2 double-faced records at \$1.30 each. This makes 6 musical selections, which the majority of brethren find sufficient. As advised in previous *Bulletins*, the Society is recommending the exclusive use of the Columbia steel needle, at 25c a package.

#### Be Sure You Get "Time, Territory and Books"

November 18-26 is "Jehovah's Wit-nesses' Praise Period"; and what an occasion for praise! Looking back over the past year and seeing the Lord's leadings in every branch of the work in which we been of the work in which we have been privileged to participate is great cause for praise. The last few months have witnessed the most desperate attempt on the part of the enemy to stop the work in this country; but, despite all their efforts, Brother Rutherford has been enabled, by the Lord's grace, to put on, on three consecutive Sundays, three of the largest chain broadcasts we have ever had. The month of September has witnessed the widest distribution of the Kingdom message, by means of the booklets and special Golden Age No. 363, that has ever taken place in any one month, and on top of these was the world-wide campaign with the *Escape to the* Kingdom booklet, which early re-ports indicate was a phenomenal SUCCESS

These thrilling facts clearly reveal to the anointed the supremacy of our God and the onward victorious march of the Kingdom. And now, as a grand climax of the year, Jehovah has provided us with *Preparation*, with its panoramic view of the preparation, the battle, and the aftermath; truths vital to the existence of the anointed and to the existence of every creature who hopes to have the Lord's protection in the battle of the great day of God Almighty.

With such evidences of the Lord's favor and blessing, who could withhold praising his name? Praise, however, is not a matter of lip service only. In fact, words are the least effective method of praising the Lord. The apostle tells us that "faith without works is dead". The same may be said of praise. #### Order Now with Other Literature

#### **Read This Carefully**

Every pioneer, auxiliary, com-pany worker and sharpshooter will want to join in Jehovah's Witnesses' Praise Period, November 18-26, and in order to do this each worker must have a supply of the book *Prepara-*tion, which Jehovah has provided to be offered to the people at that time. This is the arrangement for the various workers to procure Prenaration:

PIONEERS and AUXILIARIES: All pioneers and auxiliaries are to order their supply, and we will not send any to these workers unless we do receive their orders. Inasmuch as Preparation will be sent to them only when ordered, they should get their orders in to this office as soon as possible, so that they may receive their stock in time and be enabled to join in the special period of praise to Jehovah. Pioneers and auxiliaries should order just as soon as they read this, so that shipments can be made by the 31st of October, insuring delivery well before November 18. Order other literature needed with *Preparation*, so that, if possi-ble, shipments of 100 pounds can be made. In order for us to make 100-pound shipments, several pioneers and auxiliaries working in the same section may send in their orders at one time, with definite instructions that these are to be shipped together to one address.

COMPANIES and SHARPSHOOTERS: Companies and sharpshooters may order their supply of Preparation at once, based on the quota of at least four books per worker. However, to those companies and sharpshooters who do not have their orders in by October 31 a supply of *Prepara-*tion will be shipped on consignment. tion will be shipped on consignment. All companies and sharpshooters will thus be sent a supply of *Prep-aration*, their orders being filled if received before the 31st of October, or a quantity of the books consigned if no order is received. In cities where there are more than one company the consignment will be made to the English-speaking company, and the foreign and colored companies are to receive their stock of *Preparation* from the service director of the English-speaking company. The directors of the English-speaking companies will please arrange to advise all concerned as soon as the shipment arrives.

Speaking of the portable transcription machine a pioneer writes: "We are thankful to the Lord for this additional instrument that the Lord has put in our hands, and we desire to prove faithful by using it to its full capacity.'

Jehovah has greatly blessed the efforts of his people to faithfully use this additional instrument that the Lord has provided, as is shown by the splendid reports being re-ceived from the field. The work with the transcription machine is gaining impetus as the brethren grow more proficient in conducting the meetings, and to date there has been an audience of a quarter of a million, with an average attendance of 52. A great number of very en-thusiastic letters have been received from the brethren using these ma-chines in the work of the various divisions, companies, pioneers, aux-iliaries and sharpshooters, and we believe that not only will what they have written us be very interesting to all, but many of the suggestions will be valuable to others who are putting on the transcription meetings.

The following received from a pioneer in North Carolina states a condition which is found in northern and western sections of the

There are a great many people waiting for the knowledge the *Preparation* book contains. country as well as in the southern states: "We are using Saturday as states: "We are using Saturday as a good day to give the witness with the machine in the small country villages where all of the farmers come together this day to get their bacon, flour and other things for the week. That afternoon we always have to quit working in the rurals because we find nobody home. Now we get them all together in town, and they listen, too. We always have large crowds, due to the fact that we invite everybody and ad-vertise before by working in that respective section."

From Missouri a pioneer writes: "We surely appreciate the privilege of using the transcription machine. It is such a joy to see some of these farmers, who never heard a lecture over the radio or even saw a train, drink in the truth, eager for every word. We have found it good to put on lectures on Saturday p.m., as so many farmers come into town for supplies.

Excellent results have been obtained by an eastern division, re-porting 103 programs for the month, with an audience of 9,500. In making his report the one in charge of the machine states: "We put on an average of three programs an eve-ning throughout the week. We are able to put on a program in an hour, which includes setting up the machine, running the records, and mov-ing to the next point. The program consists of three 13-minute records and two 6-minute musical numbers, making a 48-minute program and allowing 12 minutes to move to the next point. The machine is set up inside of a small house trailer. We place the speaker on the roof during the program. People who are inter-ested in seeing a small home on wheels come to see the trailer and also listen to the lecture. We carry banners on both sides of the trailer, announcing Judge Rutherford's lec-tures. We found this an excellent means of advertising. We have 300 feet of wire to connect the trailer with the various homes, parks and other popular places where we set up the machine. The various places we have used are public parks, bathing beaches, county homes, sailors' homes, picnic grounds, tourist camps, and private homes.

"We had the machine placed in a small village one evening and a farmer heard the program  $1\frac{1}{2}$  miles away. He got in his car and drove down to the village to see what it was. We repeat the use of the ma-chine at the same place and time every month and find it very successful. We secured a permit for

the use of the band stand in public park every Monday evening from 7 to 8 o'clock. We usually had an audience of from 250 to 500. We have tried to prevent the transcrip-tion machine from interfering with the field service and have harmo-nized it with the field activity."

A pioneer has used the machine in a trailer as stated: "We are now in a country schoolyard with our big house trailer and broadcast right out of one of the front windows. The people drive up in rigs, cars and on muleback and listen, and always the program is too short.'

"The large attendance at was secured by taking advantage of the fact that the merchants of that lively little town give the people free motion pictures every Saturday night; also every Wednesday night a free band concert is given. We got in touch with the proper parties and they gladly gave us permission to give our lecture just preceding the motion pictures on Saturday night and immediately following the band concert on Wednesday. The preach-ers were furious because of our presence, but there was no successful interference."

The manner in which the work with the transcription machine supplements the door-to-door service instead of interfering with the houseto-house witness in any way is em-phasized in the following report from a pioncer: "It would be a task indeed to have to give talks by word of mouth so often, and a great drain on onc's strength, which is so much needed in the pioneer work. Also how weak they would be as com-pared with the lectures by Brother Rutherford over these machines, which seem to have no limit in power and volume! How easy it is now, merely to start the machine and turn on the power and still retain our strength for the witnessing of the next day!"

# **Protest and Petition to Be Circulated Quickly**

#### The Name of JEHOVAH Is a Strong Tower

#### To Those Who Carry the Petition to the People

The work with the PROTEST AND PETITION should be generally along the lines outlined for the entire campaign. The first day of the divisional assembly is Saturday, and the brethren who are on hand in the morning should go out in the field with the *Escape* booklet, the leaflet calling attention to the peti-tion which they will later bring back, and also the printed invitation announcing the transcription lecture, "INTOLERANCE," to be given that evening. Beginning not later than 10 o'clock in the forenoon, and working at least until 1 o'clock, the brethren should be able to reach a sufficient number of people to keep them occupied during the late afternoon and evening. It is recommend-ed that each of the three days the field service be with the booklet and the announcements from 10 o'clock in the forenoon until 1 o'clock, giving the brethren an opportunity to get a lunch and then rest a little until 3 o'clock, by which time they may make their return calls with PROTEST AND PETITION, the until they have gone over the territory covered earlier in the day. Brethren who reach the assembly

point late Saturday need not stay out of the work because of this, but may proceed and cover as much territory during the remaining hours of the day as they can get over twice. It is believed that in no case will it be necessary to make the second call the following day during the divisional campaigns; and this should not be done, in view of the fact that each day the workers will wish to see different people in a different territory, so that as many different ones as possible may be ANCE," which is to be given by electrical transcription Saturday evening, Sunday afternoon, and Monday evening. Signers should be obtained after each of the "INTOL-ERANCE" lectures, from among those who heard the lecture.

Announcements for the "INTOL-ERANCE" lecture to be given each day will be available at the contact points. Each worker should bring his own supply of PROTEST AND PETITION papers and leaflets explaining the petition. However, fresh petitions should be used, and at the divisional campaigns the brethren should not use petitions on which are names from other territory, as such would be in another congressional district. An additional sup-ply of PROTEST AND PETITION papers and leaflets will be on hand at the contact points. Be at the contact point early Sunday morning, 9 o'clock sharp.

#### Giving the Testimony by Card Method

The early returns of Jehovah's Witnesses' Praise Period so clearly indicate the Lord's blessing upon that campaign that we cannot refrain from letting you have this brief report. When the office opened Monday morning after the first weekend 25 or more telegrams and a large number of air mail and special delivery letters were on hand ordering more Preparation.

One of the outstanding reasons for this phenomenal result, we believe, is the fact that Brother Rutherford's recommendation of using the testimony exclusively was followed out to a greater degree than ever before. The Bethel family used the testimony exclusively, present-ing the card to the people to read themselves and afterwards presenting the book with a few brief remarks. Also the majority of the *Escape* booklet, to be brethren in the different companies with the Petition work.

served by the Bethel family during the week-ends used the testimony in this manner, with the same results. The only completed report of this period that we have at hand up to the present is that of the Bethel family; so we give it to you here as a matter of comparison. During the two week-ends that it was possible for the brethren to get away from the factory and home they were able to place 1,225 bound books and 4,559 booklets. They averaged over 6 *Preparation* for each worker. This is a very definite indication of the Lord's blessing upon those who follow organization instructions. We strongly recommend this method of using the testimony in printed form.

There is ready and now available a general testimony which can be used for all the books and booklets. Each director, sharpshooter, pioneer and auxiliary should order as many of these as he can judiciously use. Below is a testimony for the *Escape* booklet, to be used along

You have received our letter of November 20, calling attention to the special work for the Lord's people in obtaining signatures to the PROTEST AND PETITION and outlining the method of procedure in this campaign. There is a tre-mendous amount of work for Jehovah's witnesses to do between now and January 15, and they are grateful for the privilege of being enabled to put forth a special effort in defense of the name of Jehovah and the Kingdom message.

All pioneers, auxiliaries, company workers, sharpshooters and those people of good will who will wish to have a part in this are furnished with a supply of PROTEST AND PETITION papers and leaflets setting out the purpose of this petition. If you have not received this supply, or if you know of someone else who has not, be sure to write us at once, so that we can furnish these to you. Also, if your supply runs out, write immediately for more.

It is absolutely necessary that these petitions be returned to this office not later than January 15; so all workers should see to it that they have their territory covered and get the papers in the mail in plenty of time to reach us by that date. We hope to have several million names and addresses by that time.

It is entirely reasonable to expect that there will be nearly 25,000 individuals taking part in this campaign. Many people of good will will be glad of the opportunity to help Jehovah's witnesses in this work. Anticipating this, we are shipping nearly 7,000,000 leaflets to the various workers. More than 150,000 PROTEST AND PETITION papers are being supplied, with room for several million signatures. It is hoped that each pioneer will secure 500 signatures, each auxiliary 250, and the other workers 100 each. However, do not stop when all your PROTEST AND PETITION forms are filled out, but write to us for more. Each pioneer and regional service director is being supplied with 20 of these, 10 are being sent for each auxiliary, and 5 for each company worker.

The brethren will obtain the PRO-TEST AND PETITION papers and the leaflets in the same manner as the radio fliers. The supply for the company workers is being shipped direct to the service director; and in the cities where there are several companies the entire allotment is

being sent to the director of the English company and from him the colored and foreign-speaking companies will obtain their supply. Isolated sharpshooters are having theirs sent direct. Pioneers and auxiliaries in isolated territory are also having their supply sent to them direct. In the case of several pioneers working together, the entire allotment is being sent to one of their party, to be divided among the members of the group. In the case of pioneers and auxiliaries who are working in company territory, the supply for these workers is being included in the shipment made to the company service director and these are to get their PROTEST AND PETITION papers and leaflets from him. Shipments are being made on the basis of 20 PROTEST AND PETITION papers to each pioneer, 10 for each papers to each pioneer, 10 for each auxiliary, and 5 each for the com-pany workers. The pioneers are be-ing allotted 1,000 of the leaflets, auxiliaries 500, and the company workers 200, each. Distribution of the papers and leaflets should be made upon this basis, and if more are needed they will be furnished upon request.

In order that an effective witness may be given at the time the petition is circulated, the following ar-rangement should be carried out:

The *Escape* booklet is to be used during this campaign, and this together with the petition papers and leaflets are the supplies for this occasion. Sharpshooters, company workers and auxiliaries should connow and January 15, and also the pioneers who are in thickly populated territory, if they can do so. Pioneers who are out in isolated rural sections may offer all of the literature to the people when they call upon them.

The most densely populated territory in your assignment should be selected for this work, in order that as many people may be seen as is possible.

Territory covered in this campaign must be gone over twice. At the first call the worker is to present the booklet Escape to the Kingdom with the short testimony that is presented in the Bulletin for this. Hand to each person the leaflet, asking him to read it carefully, and say that you will call back later. Be sure to leave these leaflets at every residence, placing them where they are certain to be found in those cases where no one is at home.

In going back with the petition do not leave upon obtaining the name of one member of the family, but endeavor to get as many signers as you can from each family. Brethren, however, should in no case ar-

#### Inform Petition Signers of This Lecture Radio Folders to Be Consigned

The Society is going to print between three million and four million radio folders for advertising the special "INTOLERANCE" broadcast on Sunday, December 31. These are to be consigned to the different companies, pioneers, sharpshooters and auxiliaries. The pioneers will each receive 340, and auxiliaries 140. The folders for pioneers, auxiliaries, foreign and colored companies and sharpshooters in English company territory will be forwarded to the service director of the English company. The service director will please arrange to notify pioneers, auxiliaries, foreign and colored companies in his territory as soon as these arrive, so that they may get their

supply immediately. These brethren should also keep in touch with the service director regarding this, so that there will be no possibility of slipping up. Every effort should be made to see that these are all distributed in the respective territories before Saturday, December 30. They should all be placed in the hands of the people before you leave for the divisional campaign on that date.

Saturday, Sunday and Monday, December 30 and 31 and January 1, are to be devoted to the divisional campaign and the special work assigned for that period. Therefore we are asking the brethren throughout the country to put forth a very special effort to see that these radio folders are distributed and at the same time to try not to interfere with the petition work, which must be pushed vigorously in the allotted time. ## **Transcription Machine Work** Discuss This at Your Service Meeting

#### A Big Witness

#### to Be Given This Way

Enclosed with this monthly Bulletin you will also find the bulletin "Your Work with the Transcription Machine". One of these is sent for each worker in every company and sharpshooter arrangement, as well as supplied to pioneers and auxiliaries. This should be studied carefully and taken up and discussed at a service meeting in the very near future.

The first of this series of campaigns outlined here will be that at the divisional campaign December 30 to January 1, outline of which is contained in another part of this *Bulletin.* It was intended to concentrate on the transcription activity from that date forth, but, due to the necessity of getting the petition work completed before January 15, concentrated activity on the portable transcription machine meetings, with the exception of the divisional campaign mentioned above, will be postponed until after January 15. Then preparations can be made for the portable transcription series of meetings to commence the following week-end, January 19 and 20, and so on, as outlined in the bulletin covering that work.

(Continued from page 1, column 4) gue with the people or endeavor to coerce them into signing the petition. Pioneers in rural territory can have the petition signed immediately, so that no time will be lost calling back.

When you call back on the people be sure to have plenty of pencils or a good fountain pen along. It will be well to have a stiff cardboard under the petition, to facilitate writing. Time spent in getting signatures should be reported as regular house-

Each portable transcription machine leader should arrange immediately to send to this office, through the local director, an order for the advertising material re-quired for this work (pioneers and auxiliaries and sharpshooters will order direct). Leaflets for free distribution, announcing the respec tive talks, are now ready and may be ordered immediately, as well as the window cards and placards for the automobiles. Get placards for every car that is available for advertising these meetings, and plenty of window cards to cover your territory. These are to be used as instructed, and, of course, will be used again a number of times, simply changing the title of the lecture as the occasion demands.

Let this work be undertaken with enthusiasm and zeal. Press the campaign vigorously. The Lord has very evidently opened up this means of witnessing and has brought it to the front just at the time when the enemies are using all their power to have the lectures taken off the radio. Probably the Lord wants it this way, for these transcription machine meetings make the Kingdom message available to thousands of people who have no radios and have no prospects of getting one.

to-house witness work. Some other books and booklets should be taken along for those especially interested, and a few might be placed on this second call.

All the brethren will, of course, be anxious to sign this petition themselves, and the matter should be brought to the attention of all those who attend the various transcription meetings held during this period. Doubtless many signers can be obtained on such occasions.

#### Please Note on Protest and Petition Sheets

A separate form is to be submitted for each town and city. Do not put names from two different states, counties, cities or towns on the same form.

All service directors, sharpshooters, pioneers, auxiliaries or other brethren sending PROTEST AND PETITION forms to the Society's office will please see to it that the number of signers, and the name of the city or town, state and county are neatly typewritten or printed at the bottom of each sheet.

be so arranged as not to conflict unnecessarily with the other features. The radio folders, therefore, should be distributed by the workers when they go back for the signatures to the petition. The reason for this is to avoid leaving too much reading matter on the first time around. If you leave the radio folder and petition announcement many people will overlook reading one or may read neither one of them, due to the fact that there is too much reading material left. Therefore, to avoid this, distribute the petition announce-ments at the time you go around with your Escape booklet, and when you return in the evening for the signatures leave the radio folder, with an invitation to be sure to lis-ten in to the talk. If at the last minute you find that you cannot dispose of all your radio folders in this manner, make some special effort to get the remainder out and in the hands of the people by Friday night, December 29.

#### Funerals

There are numerous requests coming to the office for a uniform funeral service. The claim is made that some of the local brethren do not give an effective witness or else deal with material that is not exactly appropriate for the occasion.

The question has been asked, "Would it be proper to use transcription recordings for such occasions?" We recommend, first, "Where Are the Dead?" to be followed by the record on "Funerals". These two records would make an excellent presentation of the truth.

In view of the fact that there are transcription machines available in all parts of the country now, with the prospects of a great many more in the near future, we believe that this would be a very desirable way to conduct funeral services. The only object that the Lord's

The only object that the Lord's people could possibly have in serving at a funeral is to give a witness to the name and purposes of Jehovah. At the close of the service appropriate prayer could be offered by some competent brother.

#### The November Report

It is hoped that EVERY service director, sharpshooter, pioneer and auxiliary will promptly send in a report of the field witness work done during the ENTIRE month of November, INCLUDING the special period results of November 18-26.

One of the very regrettable features of the October report was the failure on the part of many sharpshooters, in particular, to send in complete reports for October. Many of them failed altogether to include the special period results in the month's report, while many others failed to make out their month's report completely in one way or another. We do hope the November report will show a decided improvement.

We hope to receive PROMPT and COMPLETE reports both for the special period of November 18-26 and for the ENTIRE month of November. Your cooperation will save time and money.

The question has come into this office from many who have portable transcription machines as to whether it is proper for them to use a microphone attachment, and they desire to have the Society's permission before going ahead with it. As far as the Society is concerned, anyone having a transcription machine and desiring a microphone attachment may correspond direct with Sound Systems, Inc., 113 Terminal Tower, Cleveland, Ohio, and make all arrangements with them. They will supply you with a letter setting out the information as to price and how the connection is to be made. In parks and large auditoriums a microphone attachment is helpful. Please do not write to the Society concerning this. The reason for this statement is to inform all having transcription machines that if they wish to have microphone attachments it is perfectly all right with the Society.

## "Intolerance" Lecture on Transcription Machines

#### Part of Divisional Campaigns Witness Work

Come to This Campaign

The stirring speech on "RELI-GIOUS INTOLERANCE" delivered by Brother Rutherford at Plainfield, N. M. folders*, petition announce-ments and booklets at the divisional campaign is going to be different from that carried on with the distribution of the radio announcements. At the divisional campaign the petition announcements, transcription machine folders and the booklets are to be presented at the same time, because if the transcription announcements are not left the first time around many of the people whom you call on when you return for signers to the petition would not have time to make arrangements to attend the transcription meeting in the evening. It should be emphasized, therefore, when leaving the petition announcements and P. T. M. folders, that it is very important that both of these should be read.
