Check Sound Equipment Before Using

Needle Changing Essential

Transcription leaders and all peroperating sound equipment, which includes sound cars, phonographs and P.T.M's, should see to it that the turntable revolves at the proper speed. A careful check of this should be made by actual count for three minutes. This cannot be over-stressed. In three minutes the tran-scription machines which are used to run the 16-inch discs should revolve 100 times, which is 33¹ r.p.m. The phonographs should be set at a speed of 78 r.p.m. Please be careful in this regard and check your machines NOW and when used.

It is further very essential that the needles used on transcription ma-chines and phonographs be changed after the running of each lecture. In other words, use a needle for only one side of a disc, whether the disc is $4\frac{1}{2}$ minutes or $13\frac{1}{2}$ minutes. Please keep this in mind, as some of the brethren have been negligent in this, and it is a reflection on the truth and the Kingdom which we are advertising, to reproduce these lectures in an unsatisfactory manner.

Many are inclined to be negligent because they think it is the Lord's business and he will overlook their mistakes. Remember, efficiency is very essential in the Lord's work. It would be well for each individual all interested.

listening to these lectures to remind the operator of any defect in the reproduction, so that the speed of the turntable might be checked and needles changed. Don't be careless with the Kingdom interests!

Grouping Orders

Pioneers in large cities associated with companies and not ordering 100 pounds of literature should give their order to the company di-rector, so that he may send it to the Society along with his order, and in this way the two shipments can be made as one, which will save considerable on freight, as we must pay for 100 pounds whether we ship it or not. Pioneer cartons will be or not. Pioneer cartons will be marked for them. Two or three pioneers in a group should also send their orders in together in the same envelope, so that the Society can save this money.

The importance of making this message available to every person in your territory must be obvious to all. Therefore *Loyalty* and two colored-cover booklets should be offered in every home. This campaign actually starts January 1 and continues for the three months of January, February and March, with an extraordinary effort put forth during "The King" Testimony Person 10 RIOD, February 1-9.

Brother Rutherford has just recorded on a disc the lecture "Flag Saluting". This record can be used on transcription machines operating at 33½ r.p.m. As soon as this disc is prepared it will be furnished to those operating sound cars and portable transcription machines. This record should be used as fully as possible throughout the entire United States. These records will be sent you as soon as they are manufactured. When you receive them use them extensively, especially during the three-month booklet campaign with Loyalty and two colored-cover booklets. Let Jehovah's witnesses present their side of the issue by "word of mouth" and printed page.

These are days of real war. Jehovah by His grace turns the weapons of the enemy upon themselves. In fact, he places those weapons in the hands of his anointed to be used to the torment of the enemy and the glory of God. Loyalty is to be included in every combination of literature placed during these three months. When you leave bound books, or booklets, or both, include Loyalty. It is to be placed, together with any two together colored-cover booklets, on a contribution of ten cents. Alone, the Loyalty booklet may be left on any contribution of less than ten cents, or without contribution, at the discre-

tion of the publishers.

There is enclosed with this *Director* a sample copy of the new radio folder, which is now ready for shipment. Please order your supply.

These folders are numbered on the last page, 1, 2, 3, and 4. The one enclosed with this *Director* is the Number 1 folder. There are 70 different stations carrying this new series of three five-minute talks. Your present folders can be used until January 11; then you should start using the new ones. Distribution of these folders can begin in the early part of January, as the first program of this new series is January 19. These five-minute lectures will undoubtedly arouse much interest on the part of the great listening audience, and as responses are received notice of the interested persons will be forwarded to pioneers, auxiliaries, companies and sharpshooters for the purpose of making back calls. In every instance where back calls are to be made phonographs with records should be taken. These back calls will be another service for the people of good will. Show them that many Bible questions can be answered at their own home by this means if they so desire. If the party is really interested, be sure to arrange a second back call, and if you believe it advisable you might leave a phonograph and set of records with them for a few days or a week until you can call back again, asking them to invite their friends and neighbors to listen and study these lectures. Also have them report to you (on your return) the attendance and the number of hours the phonograph is used. It is a great privilege to contact the great multitude and to aid them to see and appreciate Jehovah's organization.

combination of three booklets, Loyalty and two colored-cover book lets. A combination of six booklets on a contribution of 20c is a suggested attractive offer, and may be used during these three months if desired. In such a combination there are to be included first of all Loyalty, and in addition four coloredcover booklets, and one of the booklets Government, Who Shall Rule the World? or, if you have any left, Truth: Shall It Be Suppressed? or Prosperity-Famine may be disposed of in this manner. In other words, on a contribution of 20c place two self-covered booklets and four colored-cover booklets.

The Kingdom the Hope of the World, World Recovery, Intolerance, Angels and Dividing the People having been added to the regular orders from the field, these consignments sent only to those who sent in regular orders for other literature.

Now, here is something you must emember, and do it right away. Place an order with the Society for Loyalty booklets and any of the above-mentioned booklets you can use during the next three months. Get plenty, because reports are that the three on a contribution of 10c are going very well. Please do this. If you do not have a supply of Loyalty, place an order TODAY! and mark on the order what other book-lets you want to use in the threebooklet combination.

Let each individual publisher make his or her arrangements to have as large a personal share as possible. Let the service directors and others of the local company and sharpshooter organizations plan the territory for efficient winter service, and lead in the field. All interested ones in sharpshooter and company organizations should be furnished with each issue of the Director; and to accomplish this some companies and sharpshooters will require more copies of the *Director* than the number they are now

Any companies or sharpshooters at present receiving too many or not enough copies of each issue of the *Director* should advise us, letting us know just how many to send, so that the proper change can be made in our records, and the proper num-

They Must Be Accurate

Each Publisher Should Read This Carefully

Report Jonadabs

Our attention has been called to the fact that some of the service directors and sharpshooters are failing to include in their monthly reports the activities of Jonadabs who put in only a few hours a month in the service, claiming that if such activities were included the average hours per publisher for the group would be lowered. The instructions in regard to reporting field publishers are as follows: "Report the total number of different individual publishers taking part in the door-to-door service with the literature one or more hours during the month." In view of these instructions, if some Jonadabs put in one or a few more hours in the field service during the month, the service director or sharpshooter should be sure to count and report these as active field publishers for that month. This also applies to juveniles having a share in the witness work. It is true that at first the average hours per publisher for the group will be lowered somewhat, yet the activities of the older and more experienced publishers should tend to offset this. Jonadabs beginning in the service naturally do not put in full time the first month or two of service. However, after a short time Jonadabs contribute as much time to the field service as do a majority of those of the remnant, and this in the end materially aids the company's quota. Jonadabs are beginning to come, and every provision should be made to aid them to become and serve as field publishers of the Kingdom. Pioand auxiliaries in isolated territory having Jonadabs occasionally join them in field service and who have not enrolled with the Society for service under the sharpshooter arrangement should report those occasional activities separately to the Brooklyn office. Briefly report on a separate sheet of paper the number of books and booklets placed, number of publishers, hours of service, and obtainers. Send such Jonadab reports along with your monthly report to the office.

Sound Car Reports

Since there are now several hundred sound cars in operation throughout the country, it seems well at this time to briefly review sound car report instructions. Pioneers and auxiliaries owning and operating their own sound cars should report their sound car activities direct to the Society on their regular pink report cards. Individual company publishers owning their own sound

Rates on Literature

Some of the brethren have written in asking to be advised what credit is to be allowed the company publishers, pioneers and auxiliaries on the three-bound-book combinations placed during the month of December.

Pioneers are receiving literature at the minimum rate now; consequently there will be no credit to

Auxiliaries will be credited 18c on each combination, or 6c on each book placed in combination.

Company publishers will be credited 15c on each combination, or 5c on each book placed in combination, during December.

car and located in company or sharpshooter territory should regularly report their sound activities to the service director or sharpshooter with whom associated, who in turn will report these activities direct to the Society each month. Activities of company-owned sound cars will, of course, be reported by the director or sharpshooter. In cases where two or more companies or sharpshooter arrangements jointly own sound cars, each company or sharpshooter should report their own activities with the sound car during the time they use it in their own territory. Where a division owns one or more sound cars, these activities should be reported separately by the divisional leader direct to the Brooklyn office, and not by the companies in whose territory they were used. If pioneers operate company or division sound cars, the ploneers should note on the bottom of their report card the number of hours spent with the sound equipment, even though the actual report for the sound car will be made by the divisional leader or service director.

TIME: Where a sound car is being used continuously in a territory, report the time from your first setup (sound meeting) to your last setup. If you gave twenty short lectures at twenty different places in a certain area of territory and it takes you five hours from the first setup to the last one, report five hours of sound service instead of the actual time it took to play the 20 records.

ATTENDANCE: Sound car attendance, in almost every case, has to be estimated. At each setup or sound meeting a reasonable estimate should be made of the number of persons having had their attention called to the Kingdom message broadcast by the sound car. The estimate should be conservative; and actual count should be made if at all possible.

The sound car, more than any other instrument at our disposal, arouses curiosity and creates interest in the Kingdom message in an informal way. To be effective the sound car program should be well organized, and carried on in intimate conjunction with the publishers doing the house-to-house witnessing. Experience shows that sound cars can be effectively used during the winter season as well as during the summer. All sound cars and other equipment should be kept busy, and accurate and prompt reports made to the each month as outlined

Remember to report attendance at all sound machine meetings, phonograph, transcription machine and sound car meetings, as well as re-porting the number of machines and the hours of sound machine activity.

Please keep in mind always, when requesting literature for the blind as a loan, to be sure to give the name of the blind person for whom it is requested, as the postal law requires that literature for the blind be sent in the name of a blind person in order to go through the mail free. It may be sent in care of anyone to any address, but to go free of postage the name of a blind person must appear in the address.

You can take advantage of this day and be away from your secular work and be at the convention at Los Angeles, or else at the convention via New York, Chicago, or some other of these nine points. A direct telephone connection and public-address system in each hall will be installed between the above points and the Shrine Auditorium, and at 12 o'clock noon Pacific Standard time, the lecture "SEPARAT-ING THE NATIONS", by Brother Rutherford, will be brought direct to the auditoriums in these nine cities. Wide advertisement of the public meeting, inviting the people of good will to attend, will be made in these cities and in Los Angeles. Again at 4 p.m., Pacific time, it is expected, by the Lord's grace, Brother Rutherford will address the convention assembled at Los Angeles, and the proceedings of the convention from four to six o'clock will be brought to these other convention points by direct wire from the Shrine Auditorium. Arrangements Being Made for Them to Hear

They Must Make the Choice

So let's advertise! Every means of advertising the public lecture, "Separating the Nations," which Brother Rutherford will deliver, by the Lord's grace, at noon, February 23, is being used. First of all, we have the unique means of advertising this lecture, the first time by any people, the use of a phonograph record to be amplified through the sound equipment with which most of the brethren are now supplied. These records are being shipped out now, and should be used constantly until noon February 23, Pacific Standard time, and (according to location) later in other time zones.

Be sure to include the number of hours this advertising record is used, and the attendance, in your monthly report of sound machine activity.

Additionally, there will be millions of radio announcements consigned to the various companies and sharp-shooters, as well as to pioneers and auxiliaries, these to be distributed advantageously, and, wherever possible, placed in the hands of the people, making special mention to them

them the reminder, the radio folder. In making the consignments to the large cities, the supply will be sent to the director, and the pioneers and auxiliaries will receive their supply through the director.

Numerous other means will be

used to advertise this lecture, such as signs painted by the brethren, setting out the title of the lecture, the speaker, Judge Rutherford, the time and the radio station over which they may listen, or the auditorium at which they may attend. There are many bulletin boards in railroad stations in the smaller communities, and on these boards should be tacked the radio announcement or some other announcement that will advertise the February 23 chain broadcast. You might post on these boards the back cover of The Golden Age No. 425 or the back and front of the radio folder. The attractiveness of such posting can be enhanced by pasting a bright red paper border around the edge of the page after the page is pasted on. Everywhere bulletin boards of this nature can be found in various public places, such as ferry houses, bus stations, communi-ty centers, rural post offices, general stores in rural sections. All such boards are frequently consulted by of this broadcast and leaving with local residents and travelers, and

thus afford an excellent means of giving notice to persons while wait-

ing at such places.

Remember, too, that during the broadcast of the lecture each sound car should be equipped with a radio and connected with the sound car equipment and thus the lecture taken off the air would be sent forth to the largest audience possible.

Keep in mind that all this adver-

tising must be done early in February and that an extensive witness must be given in your own territory. Then on to the convention in your locality to begin anew a thorough advertising campaign and give the witness of the Kingdom to millions more people.

The arrangements as they proceed from time to time are really remarkable; and we know it is the Lord's direction. The *Loyalty* booklet was furnished to his people for wide distribution. The issue is clearly drawn, whether to be loyal to a superior power or to the Supreme Power. Now announcement is made of "Separating the Nations". Again the issue must be raised as to the question of Loyalty. Therefore, in the distribution of the announcements of "Separating the Nations" there will be used, during January and February, the booklets Loyalty and Dividing the People, World Recovery, or any other two colored-cover booklets, such as The Crisis, Intolerance, Righteous Ruler, Escape to the Kingdom, Angels, and The

Right in the midst of this midwinter campaign comes the special testimony period, "The King," February 1-9. This period will be an excellent opportunity to put forth a special effort in the field, advertis-ing the February 23 broadcast. Every publisher should be equipped with plenty of territory, plenty of literature, and a good supply of radio folders announcing the lecture "Separating the Nations". The P-Special record should be used as often as possible, not only over the large outdoor sound equipments, but also in private homes and at transcription meetings.

This campaign comes in the coldest season of the year; but are Jehovah's publishers going to slack their hands? No. not for a minute. They are determined to give a greater shout than ever for Jehovah and his anointed King; and the special events in February will aid in this. There is a lot to do. The last two years, during the cold season we

had petitions to circulate. Two and half million signatures were obtained each time in just a short period. Now in the winter months the privilege is extended to us of advertising a world-wide broadcast and the distribution of a very important message as set out in Loyalty and other booklets. Of course, there are conditions over which some of us do not have control, and therefore in some cases the hours may fall below 15: sickness, business or other matters might interfere. But let's see if we can overcome some of these interferences and get our average up to 15 hours a month. Those who can, do more! Remember, all our work is unto the Lord.

During the three months' campaign, January, February and March, with three booklets on a contribution of 10c, if each one tries to put in 15 hours a month there should be placed between a million and a million and a half of these booklets each month, and between four and five million booklets in the three months. In previous years we got around two and a half million signatures, besides placing literature. We are now privileged to advertise a public talk and place literature on a contribution of 10c; and it is very likely, with the increased interest in the Kingdom, the enthusiasm and zeal for the work that is ahead, and the blessings in store, the publishers will surpass the four million mark for three winter months. We will try; won't we? For your information: Nearly three million copies of the booklet *Loyalty* have been shipped out already. The orders are still heavy, and if you don't have yours it is because you haven't ordered them. The factory is just able to keep up with the orders on Loyalty, but if you order more than we can make by day the factory will start working by night also. This the brethren are pleased to do.

Those who desire can bring with them the convention literature, which will consist of a supply of the Loyally booklet and two colored-cover booklets, any two of the following: Dividing the People, The Crisis, World Recovery, Angels, Intolerance, The Kingdom, the Hope of the World Righteous Ruler, and Escape to the Kingdom. If you do not bring literature with you, there will be an ample supply in stock at the convention hall, at company rates only. Pioneers and auxiliaries should bring their

own literature, as there will be no stock at pioneer or auxiliary rates. All should see to it that they get a good supply of announcements for the public meeting on their arrival, as it will be necessary to distribute these during Saturday and Sunday. A tremendous witness should be giv en in each of these ten cities, and each of them should have sufficient territory for several thousand publishers to be active at least three hours each day. The publishers for these two days should average no less than five hours in the field work, and the directors of the various cities are so arranging the territory as to keep the publishers busy for this period of time. Remember, these cities should know that Jehovah's witnesses are in town advertising a lecture of the greatest importance to the nations of earth.

Every publisher is to make a report of field service at the convention to the captain of the group with whom he witnesses or, if witnessing alone, report direct to the convention. The group captain will make one report to the convention for the group, at the territory assignment booth. All publishers are to make an additional report to their home company. The director of each comsharpshooter arrangement should be sure to get these reports from the publishers on their return from the convention and include them in his monthly report. Pioneers and auxiliaries to also include their convention field service report in their monthly report to this office. This in addition to their report to the convention captain. The same procedure applies to sound equipment reports.

All companies that have sound equipment should use it extensively in their own territory up to and including Friday; and if this sound car can be brought into the vicinity of the public meeting it should be done, bringing your records with you. Signs will be prepared in the various cities for the sound trucks, pointing out the convention hall, the time and place of meeting, as well as the subject of the lecture. Each company having sound equipment that they expect to take to the convention with them will please notify the director, so that he will know how many equipments will be in town, and can assign territory along with the witnesses.

Come prepared for cold weather, rain, snow or sleet. The time is set for the witness, and it is necessary that the witness be given. The separating of the nations will be accomplished. Jehovah has extended the privilege of bringing this information to the peoples of the earth. It must be done in a big way. What a privilege we have in advertising it!

Special Note on Records

Care should be taken to keep the records at all times away from heat. Heat will damage them, not only warping the discs, but affecting the grooves, so that poor reproduction will result. Also, the timing of the machines must be watched closely, so that the discs will not be run too slowly or too fast, which results in distortion. We have a wonderful instrument in Jehovah's provision of the recorded lectures. Let us appreciate this, and care for the equipment as well as the records, using them continually and effectively.

Here Is a Good Suggestion

"For some time we have been hindered in our placements because people have nothing with which to get books except canned fruit, their money and chickens and eggs being gone. As we have had to have cash for gas to keep in the work, I decided to try the boarding-house keepers. I explained our work, that we do not want to make a profit on fruit, but only to get out a small contribution, and therefore could let them have lovely home-canned fruit much cheaper than they could get it at the store, 25c a half gallon, without sugar; 30c a half gallon, with sugar. They were very glad to get it, and now every two weeks we drive into town with a load. Lots them will save the jars for us. These we sell at 30c per dozen in a secondhand store.

We find a good market at cheap hotels and boarding houses, and believe pioneers everywhere, by driving to larger towns, can dispose of all they take in. Of course, better-class hotels won't bother with it. They want uniform commercial

Sound Equipment to Rebroadcast "Separating the Nations"

Have You Made This Arrangement?

The sound equipment is playing tremendous part in advertising the coming broadcast of February 23. when Brother Rutherford speaks to the world on "Separating the Na-TIONS". Phonographs, transcription machines and sound cars are her-alding far and wide the announcement concerning this lecture which is of the greatest importance to every man, woman and child on the earth. The special disc carrying the announcement of this lecture is to be used at every opportunity on every type of sound equipment, and a spe cially concerted effort made with this announcement as February 23 draws near. The sound cars must be used continually; this equipment should not remain idle. Time in the use of this disc, and attendance, are to be reported in the regular way.

The brethren throughout the country are certainly demonstrating the fact that just because it is wintertime it does not mean that the sound equipment must be put in storage until better weather. On the contrary, every territory assignment should be covered as thoroughly as possible with the announcement of the lecture, and the more thickly populated sections should be gone over several times if there is sufficient sound equipment available to accomplish

The effectiveness of the sound cars does not stop with advertising the lecture, but they are to be used in picking up the lecture at the time it is given and rebroadcasting it over the sound equipment. Every unit having sound cars should care fully plan its activity with them, and prior to February 23 have selected locations where this equipment can be utilized in carrying the message on "Separating the Nations" to crowds assembled in places other than the convention halls. This will be carried on extensively in the ten cities where the conventions are being held, making it possible to serve all overflow meetings and other points where a large number of people can be reached. At the time of the Washington convention, last summer, this was done to considerable extent and proved very effective, and it is to be widely

used for the lecture on "Separating THE NATIONS'

As the message is broadcast throughout the world by radio, it should be received on a radio set installed in the sound car or in another automobile, and run through the sound equipment and out through the loud-speakers. It is up to each sound car operator to experiment in this prior to the broadcast, so that he can ascertain just what can be accomplished with the particular sound equipment and radio set he will have to use.

The easiest way to use an autoradio or other radio set with the sound equipment is to place the microphone directly in front of the loud-speaker of the radio, pick up the program, and run it through the sound equipment the same as when one is speaking into the microphone. This is not satisfactory in every case, and should be ex-perimented with to find out the results that can be obtained.

The other means of using a radio with the sound equipment is to establish direct electrical connection between the radio set and the sound equipment; but this is somewhat complicated and should be done by a competent radio mechanic. There are so many models of radios that no general advice can be given except that the most accessible place connect onto the radio set is usually the wires going to the voice coil of the speaker. In most instances a matching transformer and a pad to reduce the volume will be required, the leads from the wires going to the voice coil being run through the transformer and pad and then through a plug which can be plugged into the microphone jack in the transcription machine, one lead to the end and the other lead to the ring on the plug, the outside sleeve of this three-wire plug not being used.

The center of the input transformer in the transcription machine is grounded inside the machine. The ends of this transformer are connected to the jack to make contact with the tip and the ring of the three-wire plug. The outside sleeve connection of the plug will not be grounded, but this is connected to plus 6-volt inside the machine. The tip and ring will give a 200-ohm

SINGAPORE, STRAITS SETTLEMENTS

"A splendid witness was given in Singapore harbor by the Society's boat the 'Lightbearer', and many heard the message by this means, particularly the crews of two war-ships and also other shipping." The following is quoted from the Singapore Free Press of Friday, October 11, 1935: "Sailors listen to unique lecture by Watch Tower Society. A loud voice boomed across the water in the Singapore Roads on Wednesday night and men on board ships at anchor peered into the darkness expecting to find Father Neptune break forth to the surface. But nothing of the sort happened. Instead they saw a long white ketch lying in their midst while the powerful the wayside or in a farmhouse at voice echoed between her and the night, in order to spread the mes-'sides of the two men-o'-war Hermes

and Cornwall. It was a unique lecture that was being projected for the benefit of the ratings of H.M.S. Hermes and H.M.S. Cornwall and sailors at large from the ketch 'Lightbearer', which has been giving Watch Tower programme in Singapore since her arrival from Australia some two months or so ago. So far, Captain Ewins, her skipper, has distributed thousands of the Watch Tower Society's many publications and given addresses ashore, but it was the first time that he had the crews of ships at anchor in this port for audience.

BELGIUM

"Publishers increased by 12. From all sides we now hear that the clergy as never before are warning the people not to buy our books. Gradually the attention of the clergy is brought to bear upon the handful of witnesses, and we rejoice greatly that we are known and that the enemy deems it necessary to take action against the little company of publishers."

INDIA

"At Montgomery a party of Indian publishers worked the city during a big convention of Indian Christians organized by the American Presbyterian Missions. The common people heard the message of truth gladly and would have had Jehovah's witnesses conduct meetings, but the missionaries opposed them. The result is that several requests have been received for Jehovah's witnesses to visit the surrounding villages from which the people had come to attend the convention."

GREECE

"The work done during this period was done under martial law, and we had some difficulties in going on. People are much influenced by the decree against the work of the Office of Religions. In one place as soon as the books were taken from the car they were seized by an officer and the brethren sent to the public prosecutor. Until today we have not been able to take them out. One brother was seized and sent to the martial court. His case is still pending. Two other pioneers were seized some days ago and are also summoned to the martial court as Communists and against the present form of government. They are at present in prison awaiting their trial."

LITHUANIA

"The first Sunday of the period was election day in the Memel Territory, an event of European importance. The effect on the people was almost unbelievable. Even some of those who are supposed to be 'in the truth' were affected, some even hoping that the Nazi government, the persecutors, torturers and murderers of Jehovah's witnesses across the border, would be taking over the territory. It seems incredible that those once enlightened could be so overwhelmed by the Devil. This, of course, has its reaction on the loyal ones, who, in the face of opposition from all sides, even from their erstwhile 'brethren', show more than ever their determination to be wholly on the side of Jehovah and the Greater Gideon."

JAPAN

"The Lord blessed his own faithful ones in Japan and Korea with unusual fine weather almost every day during the period. And we are happy to send you this report which shows another highest record made here. A big public witnessing meeting was held at Heije, the second great city in Korea, on October 4. The topic of the public lecture was Kingdom of Heaven Is at Hand'. Heije is the center of the missionary work. Many clergymen were present. The hall where the meeting was held has 1,200 seats and it was overpacked with a big crowd of 1,600, and many were turned away. 3,200 pieces of literature, both in Japanese and in Korean, were placed in the people's hands at the meeting."

HAWAIIAN ISLANDS

"Literature in eight different languages was placed, and at some of the sound meetings all eight groups of people were represented, from naked-skinned babies to elderly Chinese women in black alpaca pants. We are rejoicing in the great privilege and honor of carrying Jehovah's message to the people here and thank him for the opportunities given."

It appeared that there were great numbers in town, but, really, Jehovah's witnesses and their companions now make only a handful. Hundreds of thousands of persons heard the announcements through the sound equipment. In the ten cities the brethren made many back calls on the people who attended the public meeting, and their

experiences are most encouraging. The consensus of opinion was that more such conventions should be arranged. The mighty shouts of "Aye" that went up at the public meeting, and their stand for Jehovah and his King in the meeting Sunday evening, were most thrilling. If you were not there you missed a lot; and if there are any more, make up your mind now not to miss them. Jehovah's blessing and direction was manifested on every side. His name be praised

This is the first time in several years that a clothbound book has been offered during an international period; and what a book it is! We know that all the Kingdom publishers are thrilled to have read it and now are more eager than ever to place it in the hands of every honest-hearted person throughout the world. Translations have been made in various languages, and in the United States it can be had in Spanish, Greek, and Italian. Many more are under way, and in a few months will be completed.

Work was begun on the *Choosing* booklet immediately after the broadcast, and consignments are being made to as many publishers as possible in the United States, but the time is rather short. The consignment will be added to your *Riches* order if possible. If on offering

Riches, on a contribution of a quarter, they do not accept it, then offer the Choosing booklet, on a contribution of 10c. Interested people will be glad to contribute 10c to ald in preaching the gospel. This will be a real help to pioneers, and also emphasizes the splendid combination of both Riches and Choosing on 30c contribution. This is true in regard to all transcription meetings arranged for. During this period every publisher that has ever been in the field should be out again, and many more with them. We confidently look to having thousands more publishers in the field April 4-12 and thereafter. It will take planning and effort on your part. planning and effort on your part. Remember, where much has been entrusted, "the more is demanded entrusted, of them.'

Back-Calling with "Riches" and "Choosing"

Response to February 23 Broadcast Excellent

The lecture "Separating the Na-TIONS" appears in No. 430 of The Golden Age. A copy of this was mailed to each one of the many thousands of persons who requested Brother Rutherford's lecture. There was made out in the office a backcall slip, showing the name and address of the party interested. These have all been mailed to the various companies, pioneers and sharpshooters, so that a back call might be made on these people. Call on them with Riches and Choosing. Take with you the phonograph and several lectures, and keep after these people, because they may eventually take their stand on the side of the Kingdom, All these back calls should be made in evenings during the special period "HIS STRANGE WORK". Thousands of them have been mailed to the brethren. The director should place them in the hands of the publishers, and every effort should now be made to contact the great multitude. Experiences reported to this office on this back-call work are marvelous, and of many of the people it can be said they are taking their stand and associating them selves with Jehovah's witnesses and taking active part in the preaching of the Kingdom message.

Back Calls with the Phonograph

As is pointed out in Brother Rutherford's letter, at the end of this campaign assemble the interested ones, including those with whom you have come in contact during the testimony period, and use the sound equipment in running the transcription lectures, both the phonograph and the transcription machine.

During the campaign in the eve nings much work can be done with the phonographs, and such phonograph meetings and those held following the period may be used to establish study groups at which the Riches book is to be used. Such studies may be started by using the transcription lectures, or phonograph records if the transcription machine is not available in your unit, and part of the study period be devoted to listening to such lecture, and part to the study of Riches. As soon as sufficient interest is manifested a regular Riches study can be continued and the transcription lecture dispensed with at that particular place.

Phonographs can be loaned for one or two days, placed in homes and stores, and several records left there. Every effort should be made to witness by the use of the sound equipment during this period. We should surpass by a large number the people reached during the last world-wide period, which best sound report ever had for nine days. The attendance under sound equipment should be those people who hear at least 4½-minute lectures. Those hearing brief announcements, such as announcing the place of meeting or spot announcements of the special lecture, should not be included in the attendance of sound equipment. In other words, when people hear a lecture they learn something of the Kingdom. Attendance should be those persons who hear at least a lecture for 4½ minutes or more. Any time spent in making spot announcements is to be included in sound machine hours.

Should Be as Big a Witness as April Campaign

What better way could there be of starting out the summer's witnessing than with a testimony period? The months of April and May will have seen a large portion of the city territory reached once with Riches. The brethren will be eager to carry Riches to the other parts of the company and sharpshooter territory, to the small towns, rural communities and rurals. All will wish to continue the vigorous campaign begun in April, and to push it to the fullest extent during the coming testimony period of June 6-14. This they will do because of their zeal, the zeal of the remnant and the zeal of the Jonadab class.

All who love the Lord have joined in the emphatic declaration concluding "Feasts", and contained in the April 15 Watchtower. Therein it is stated: "With the ZEAL OF HIS HOUSE we will continue to march forward, we will continue to march forward, and as we go we will joyfully sing our victory song, The Sword of Je-Hovah and His Globious King!" Herein is the title of our next period. Zealously, the brethren throughout the field have the grand opportunity of making this period just ahead a splendid witness during June 6 to 14, which is the "Zeal of His House" testimony.

During the corresponding period last year the convention was held in Washington, D. C., at which time there was first brought to the Lord's people an understanding of the great people an understanding of the great multitude. During the period last year the United States publishers placed 301,050 pieces of literature, using the book Jehovah and the booklets Universal War Near and Favored People on a 35c contribu-tion. What will be the results of "ZEAL OF HIS HOUSE" testimony?

Now we have work to do with Riches, the publication that must be placed in the hands of those who may be of this great multitude. During the period of June 6-14 the campaign literature is to be a combination, on a 35c contribution, consisting of Riches, Choosing, one other colored-cover booklet, and a self-covered booklet (Loyalty or any other self-covered booklet in stock). This is certainly a remarkable combination. If the entire combination cannot be taken, let *Riches* be offered alone, on a contribution of 25c. "A *Riches* in every farmhouse"; that is our slogan. If this cannot be taken, present the three booklets, on a contribution of 10c.

foreign-speaking people, the Riches book in their language, or the latest bound book if Riches is not available, is to be used, on a 35c contribution, dropping to a booklet com-bination of two colored-cover and one self-covered, on a 10c contribution, when the book cannot be taken. Order the testimony cards you will need in foreign languages.

Sometimes brethren ask if it is all right to place literature additional to the special campaign pieces being stressed; and, of course, it most certainly is proper to do so, placing all additional books and booklets desired, always including *Riches* and *Choosing*.

Small towns and rural territory are to be reached in this campaign, and, of course, the service directors and service committees are to complete all arrangements ahead of time. All-day witnessing parties should be organized for every one of these nine days possible. These publishers are to take lunch with them and spend the entire day in the field. Many of the rural sections are quite thickly settled, and such should be chosen, permitting all in the car to keep busy, and enabling the driver to make calls with the literature.

In using the phonograph during In using the phonograph during this period, such lectures as "The Remedy", "Greatest Prophet," "God's Banner," "Faith," "Obedience," "Great Multitude," should be used, and also where sound cars present the 4½-minute recordings. The phonograph campaign in the rural districts should be gotten well under way during this period. The under way during this period. The hour transcription lecture is, of course, "Separating the Nations." Time in the field will be necessary

in order to accomplish effectively the work outlined for this period, and certainly much time can be spent in the service in the rurals. With the zeal of Jehovah's house let all members of God's organization join in the song of praise and victory by manifesting themselves as wholly on the side of Jehovah, and pointing others to God's banner. Start now to plan for this period, so that everything will be in readiness before June 6: literature and TIME; territory and TIME; testimony cards and TIME; transportation and TIME. Let all do what they can to Jehovah's praise.

The foregoing is but one of the many times Jehovah calls the attention of all who have taken their stand on his side to the privilege and obligation that rests upon them to carry the message of the Kingdom to others. This is an obligation which cannot be evaded, and those who love the Lord do not wish to evade it, but joyfully "all of Jehovah's people keep the feast together" giving the witness to the honor of Jehovah's name.

This calls the attention of the brethren to an opportunity for service which should be seriously considered by all. The time is here for the campaign for the enlightenment of the people concerning God's kingdom. The question for each one to consider is, How may I have a larger share in this campaign; can I in some way arrange my affairs so that I can serve as an auxiliary, or as a full-time pioneer publisher?

Air-mail letters, telegrams, cables, telephone calls, all means of communication, were used to contact the Society so that re-orders for *Riches* could be placed during "His Strange Work" testimony period and immediately thereafter. came in stating "Completely out". Another letter concerning the pioneer and auxiliary work was mailed under the date of April 22 and should also be considered carefully.

You will be very glad to know of the good response so far to this opening for more pioneers and aux iliaries. Men and women, young and old, varying from young folks in their teens to a sister of 85 years, have increased the total enrollment of the pioneers and auxiliaries by more than a hundred. Applications are coming in daily from those of the remnant and those of the Jonadab class desirous of taking advantage of every provision Jehovah arranges for their service. We are confident that there are still a great many of the brethren throughout the land who have not yet made response to the pioneer or auxiliary service but who could spend all their time in the service, or at least fifty hours a month, which is auxiliary time.

Let no one think that there is no more territory; because from the territory standpoint the time has never been more ripe for pioneer and auxiliary service. Now is the time of the "ingathering". There are not sufficient pioneers in isolated territory to cover it as frequently as it should be gone over. While company territory is gone over several times a year, generally, and some isolated counties are covered yearly many isolated counties are reached only every two or three years. An even more important point in this connection is the fact that regardless of what has previously been done in any territory, it should soon be thoroughly and carefully gone over with *Riches*. So now, more than at any other time, all territory is new territory. Business districts offer a splendid field for pioneers.

Some of the back calls to be made on people responding to the radio lectures of Brother Rutherford are for persons located entirely outside of the territory held by any company or sharpshooter organization, and the pioneers have the privilege of reaching these.

In the territory of the companies

there is much being done by pioneers and auxiliaries. Any brethren who can spend their full time in the service but who cannot go to isolated territory should certainly enroll as pioneers to serve in co-operation with the company where they are located. The same is true of those brethren who can get in auxiliary

Every service director, pioneer, sharpshooter and auxiliary is to make the usual monthly report at the end of April, showing on the report card the activities for the entire month. In addition to reporting the work of the entire month, let every one be sure to remember the testimony period just past, "His Strange Work," April 4-12, and see to it that the April report card contains the report for this testimony period as well. When brethren fail to send in their reports complete it not only makes it necessary for the office to write them about the matter, but leaves the total report for the field incomplete. Please put your testimony period report on your monthly report card.

in Rurals

Spend All Day in Country Territory

Making Back Calls Sunday Afternoon

Now that summer is just ahead, and the service organizations will turn their attention to their rural territory with the first of June, the question is, How can the phonograph work be most effectively carried on in the rural territory? The publishers who have gone ahead with the phonograph work as outlined in the Director from time to time have accomplished much, chiefly in urban territory. This should be continued of course, and the interest being built up at such phonograph meetings is to be aided in every way. The work with the phonograph in the rurals is an extension of this same service to the scattered rural territory.

The effective time to witness in the rurals is when all day is available for the service. This would include weekdays which brethren set aside for service, and Saturdays, and the day when all of the brethren can participate in the service, Sunday. Odd times in the service in individual assignments or when all day is not available should be in town territory where the most hours can be spent in the actual witness work. Beginning with June, the all-day witnessing is to be in the rural territory primarily.

When the entire day is set aside for service, it should not be wasted by poor management. First of all. it is recommended that there be no study or other meetings held for the publishers during the daytime Sundays, but that all such meetings be held in the evenings. This will make it unnecessary to quit the service to get home early and have dinner in the middle of the day and get ready for meeting, but the afternoon as well as the forenoon should be spent in the field. The arrangement of the last convention is very good and is recommended. Let the brethren take a lunch with them when they leave home in the morning, and take a few minutes or half an hour out for lunch, eating in their territory, and then continuing work. Such an arrangement will enable all the publishers to gather up their carloads early Sunday morning, begin witnessing at nine o'clock witness three hours, take half an hour for lunch, and continue witnessing until 2:30. This would give each one five hours in the service for the day, and is the manner in which the companies can build their average time in the field to exceed the quota of 15 hours a month per publisher. Make the days you set aside for the field service real pioneer days.

Of course each car should be provided with at least one phonograph, and as many more as are available and can be carried. If it is possible for each publisher to have one, it should be so used. In the rurals, as in the towns, the best time to use the phonograph, as a rule, is at the first call on an interested person, provided this can be arranged and all keep busy. A phonograph may be taken to the farmhouse at each call if all publishers have them. However, if there are more publishers than phonographs in the car, one publisher should not use one in the regular house-to-house service if in doing so the rest of the carload of publishers would be held up wait- made,

What to Do During May

Riches and Choosing

The report of the Lord's manifest blessing upon the activities of his people during "His Strange Work" testimony should not induce anyone to feel that now we have done a good period's work and we can take it easy, because the phenomenal results of this period cannot be accredited to any creature or creatures. It is the Lord who has brought forth this irresistible message at this time and made it available when the people need it most. It is evident, therefore, that the Lord's time for this work to be done is here; and those who love the Lord, the anointed, the Jonadabs, all who love righteousness, will joyfully participate in carrying out his requirements at this time.

Each and every one of us should determine by the Lord's grace that the splendid witness which started with "His Strange Work" testimony in April is going to continue by his using his faculties as effectively as possible to the glory of Jehovah's name during the coming months. This work is still to be carried on in the urban territory. Try to cover all your urban territory with Riches and Choosing during the month of May, so that by June 1 every unit will be prepared to go into the rural sections and give an extensive witness there.

You have read our text for the month of May on the Calendar pad, and know this is to the point in this respect: "He that regardeth the clouds shall not reap." Of course, he who does not reap cannot have part in the feast of tabernacles or in-gathering, because he would have nothing to gather in. To have part in this during May, carry *Riches* to your urban territory. Anyone who regards anything else than the Lord's requirements now will not be diligent in the King's business and cannot have Jehovah's approval.

During the month of May continue to offer Riches and Choosing, on a 30c contribution. Where this combination cannot be placed, drop to a booklet offer, three on a 10c contribution, including Choosing, another colored-cover booklet, and one self-covered booklet. Get your booklet stock in good condition in placing these combinations.

ing while he runs the phonograph records. Instead of thus wasting the time of several other publishers while one is busy, make an appointment to call back at the farmhouse.

When should rural back calls be made? It is recommended that, since the witnessing party is already in the territory, the remainder of the day, from 2:30 or so on, be spent in making the phonograph back calls in that part of the rurals, and thus the calls arranged for in the field would be made the same day, after the regular field service. Also, back calls in the evenings during the week can be arranged. So that the most can be accomplished in making these trips, it is suggested that several of the back calls in a section of the rurals be arranged for one evening, and a carload go out at one time, each publisher equipped with a phonograph, records and literature. The driver can put one off at each place, go on and make a call himself, and pick up the load on the way back

In making appointments for calling back with the phonograph, the brethren should always be very definite, so that the people will know just when the return call will be

We are submitting here the table showing the work done and the comparison, and also a few brief comments on the different features, particularly those wherein we have come decidedly short. Commencing from the top of the table we find-

- 1. A drop of over 240,000 bound books.
- 2. A drop of over 300 publishers per month.
 3. A drop of 170,000 hours.
 4. A drop of 459,000 obtainers.

Examining the foregoing in the

examining order presented:
Bound Books. This drop of 240,000 is to a certain extent offset by the booklets placed. The bound book Jehovah was released in February 1935, and the brethren throughout the country concentrated in its distribution. This, of course, accounted to some extent for the decrease, for we had no such release in 1936. We believe that the phenomenal placement of the Riches book during April and the subsequent months will more than wipe out this decrease. However, each and every one will have to do his part in enthusiastically placing the *Rich-es* book and booklets with the people.

PUBLISHERS. The drop of 300 publishers each month is serious. In trying to analyze why and where this drop came in we find that there was a drop of 61 from the pioneer list, 140 from the auxiliary list, and from the company publishers. All branches of the service were affected by this drop. Probably the chief reason for it was the intensely rigorous winter, which has been the worst we have had in years. In addition to that we had a wide-spread epidemic of flu, and floods and other unusual circumstances which played havoc with conditions throughout the country; and, of course, these affected our brethren as well as other people.

Nothing much can now be gained by dwelling on these things which are past, beyond noting how far behind we really are and endeavoring, by the Lord's grace, to make up for it as far as we can. The drop in publishers can be aided only by each and every one's having part in the service in the future and endeavoring to be out regularly. In this way we not only will bring our activity up to the normal requirement, but will also succeed as far as it is within our power in making up for some of the time lost during the winter. The big business of the Lord's people now is the Kingdom work. Nothing that can possibly be avoided should be permitted to interfere with it in any way. The weather has definitely settled now, enabling a great many to get out in the field who could not cope with the severe winter. Let each one of these now plan to have a part in the service every week, and as many times each week as possible. Here we are, 22 years into the Kingdom, and still there are millions who have no clear conception of the crisis they are facing. What can we do about it? The Lord has placed upon his anointed, the Jonadabs, and other honesthearted people who hear the message of his kingdom, the obligation to announce it to others. Let us each do our part in making this proclamation, and the desired results will be accomplished, because this is the arrangement made by the Lord, and he makes no mistakes.

Hours. We were short 170,000 hours during the past six months. The cause of this condition is undoubtedly the same as that responsible for the fall-off in publishers, and this must be overcome in practically the same manner: by recognizing our responsibility in connection therewith and each and every one's taking hold and doing his part. The 61 pioneers who were forced to leave the service because of

What Have You Done About It?

Some Questions for You to Answer

Can We Make It Better than the April Period?

Here is a question: WHAT HAVE YOU DONE to complete all your arrangements outlined in the May "ZEAL OF HIS HOUSE" testimony, June 6-14? Every publisher will wish to make a special effort at that time. Every service director and sharpshooter, and all service committees, should have the details of the campaign well in hand, so that each service unit can move forward with zeal and efficiency befitting those of Jehovah's organization. You can check up and refresh your memory with these questions regarding this most important campaign:

What do we place with the people during "Zeal of His House" testimony? Riches, Choosing, another colored-cover booklet, and Loyalty (or some other self-covered book-let), in combination. Do you have a good stock on hand?

What is the contribution on which this combination of Riches and three booklets is placed? Thirty-five cents. Testimony cards are enclosed with this Director. Have you ordered all the extra ones you will need to supply all the new publishers in your unit? When the book and three booklets are not taken, do we offer *Riches* alone? Yes. If *Riches* is not taken, what then? Leave three booklets, on a ten-cent contribution. Do you have your supply of foreign literature for your foreign territory?

Where do we witness? In our small towns and rural territory. Is your rural territory lined up to be thoroughly and systematically cov-ered? What arrangements have you completed for transporting all publishers possible to the rurals? Are witnessing parties to be organized for every day of the period? They should be. Ploneers will continue right ahead to thoroughly cover all their pioneer assignments.

How are phonographs to be used? In addition to any phonograph work in urban territory, the machines are to be taken into the rurals. The allday witnessing parties can make the back calls during the late afternoons. Back calls can be made during the evenings. Sound leaders, service directors and sharpshooters, have you carefully read, and arranged to put in operation, the pro-

weather conditions should all again enroll in the pioneer service as soon as possible, and as many more of the brethren throughout the country as are able to do so. You have received two letters covering this

gram of phonograph work in rurals, outlined in the Director for May?

What about TIME in the service? More than ever the Lord's people are realizing that hours in the witness work constitute the chief measure of service and the thing to be striven for. Time should be used efficiently, not wastefully, and each hour spent in real witnessing to the people. Jehovah, giving the increase to the efforts his people put forth, is accomplishing a wonderful witness to his honor. Many of the brethren probably have not yet spent ten hours in the field during one testi-mony period. Would not that be a good quota for these to strive for during "Zeal of His House" testi-mony? They should set ten hours as their quota. Of course, many of the publishers will be able to devote much more time than this to the service, and, of course, will do so. Especially can our witnessing days be long while in rural territory. We are to take our lunch, and spend all day.

Let all the brethren know that they not only may, but should, do what they can to Jehovah's praise. All are publishers of Jehovah's kingdom. It would be very wrong for any service director, or anyone else, to say that publishers who cannot get in the full quota of hours should not be counted in the total number of publishers. All not only are welcome, but are charged with the responsibility and privilege of taking their full share in the service, whatever that may be, and should be aided in every way by their fellow publishers. Even those who have heretofore taken no active part in the field service should get started during "Zeal of His House" testimony. We can witness effectively early in the morning, in the middle of the day, in the afternoon, in the evening; whatever time of day we can get free for service, let us do so. More publishers, more TIME, more accomplished in witnessing and placements.

Remember, too, our slogan: Riches in every farmhouse." We wish to place this publication with the people. The people are responding as never before. With this special book, this special period, let us make special effort to spend much TIME in the service, doing what we can to put our selves, our equipment, our automobiles, our phonographs, and our Hours, to work for the Kingdom.

With warmer weather, better conditions, Daylight Saving time (making longer evenings), the June testimony period has many advantages over "His Strange Work" period. Can we make the "Zeal of His House" period better than the April period? We'll try, won't we?

Back Calls on "Riches" Obtainers

Riches Opens the Way for Phonograph and Studies

Interested Ones Being Assembled

Referring to the testimony period of April 4-12, at which time Riches was first offered to the people, Brother Rutherford wrote: "At the end of this campaign, then assemble the interested ones by use of the sound equipment and establishing study classes and encourage the peo ple to get a knowledge of the truth as quickly as possible." The possibilities of this work first outlined here appear almost limitless. Each service unit and each publisher has a definite responsibility in this regard, and all can have a share therein. What have you done so far in this respect? The campaign of April was just the beginning of this important work; the service in connection with these interested must be increased and continued with our regular service with *Riches*. Some definite steps in accomplishing this follow:

First: Each person who is sufficiently interested to obtain Riches, and those who are interested but for some reason or other cannot obtain it, should be told of the Riches study in that neighborhood, and invited to attend. Also tell of the arrangement to bring the Kingdom message to the people by means of the recorded lectures. If the phonograph is used at this first call with the literature, run but one or two lectures or so, and, if possible, make an appointment for a return call. This will mean taking the name and address in most cases.

Second: At the back call, take the phonograph, several lectures, and also additional literature. At this time make an effort to organize a Riches study, not only for the family where the back call is made, but also to include those other interest-ed persons in that neighborhood. Arrange to hold the study at the home showing most interest, and then, either when first met or on back calls, advise the other interested ones of the study. In this manner the interested ones can be assembled. It takes effort on the part of the publishers. It is a most blessed service, and really must be participated in to be appreciated fully.

(Continued from page 1, column 3) matter recently. Each one undoubtedly has given them careful consideration and is striving to set his house in order. This six months' report shows the absolute necessity that there be more pioneers in the field. Those of you who can enroll, enroll now. The 140 auxiliaries who for one reason or another had to leave that service should also again enroll in that branch of the service as soon as possible, if they cannot become pioneers; and the hundreds of company publishers who are so employed as to enable them to have time off during the week so that they can meet the 50-hour requirement of the auxiliary branch of the service should also enroll; and those who, because of daylight saving time and more favorable weather conditions, find that they can meet this 50-hour requirement should enroll in the auxiliary service now. By doing this we shall not only bring up the auxiliary enrollment to normal, but also have a part in making up much of the time that was lost during the winter months. And the company publishers have their part. Each and every one of them who is able to do so not only should be in the field service every week, but if we do our part.

Third: When a study is started, it should be turned over to the comorganization after three meetings, and handled by the company service committee, a leader being appointed. This study leader is also a service leader, carrying to the group the information relative to the company activities, and inviting them to company service and other meetings. He is to take to the group each issue of the Dircctor, and aid them in every way to become familiar with the workings of the Lord's organization.

Fourth: Witnessing parties should be arranged to assemble at stated times at the meeting place. These are to be participated in by the regular publishers, who are to assist the newly active ones to get started in the service. Of course, by this time they have manifested their time they have manifested their sincere interest. The leader himself should, of course, always be one personally active in the house-tohouse witnessing, having a clear appreciation of the issue and the necessity of service, and should lead the group into the field.

Fifth: These new publishers, having progressed in the truth over a period of time varying considerably with different people, will them selves be carrying on the same servwill themice as their brethren have carried on in their behalf.

For many years we have realized that "our job is not to convert the world". The work in behalf of the great multitude, the "other sheep" class, is not in conflict with this truth. The fact is that the time is here for the message of Riches to be carried to the people, now, before the destruction of the Devil's organization. It is our happy lot to do everything we can to aid these of good will to gain a knowledge of the truth. The numbers, the results of our efforts, are not our primary concern; they are the increase which Jehovah gives. Our concern is that we do our part as his witnesses, and clearly now we see that our companions are now to be gathered in, assembled. Back calls on *Riches* obtainers is one of the means to accomplish this. Many companies, sharpshooters and pioneers are hav splendid results because of carrying out the above program, and so report to the office. Reports on your activity are always appreciated.

should set for himself a regular 15hour monthly quota. If all the brethren seriously consider the var-ious branches of the service, set their house in order, and enter into whichever part of the field they can it won't be a great while before this deficit in time will be made up.

There is another important feature, also, Each company and sharpshooter organization should set aside every Sunday, if possible, for allpresentday rural service work in ing the literature and calling upon the people with phonographs. Start early, take your lunch, and stay all day. If we do this the deficit in the number of obtainers will take care of itself, although it is a serious thing, when we realize that almost 460,000 fewer people received Kingdom literature during the first six months of this year than during a similar period last year. If this ratio were continued throughout the year it would mean that practically a million fewer homes would receive the Kingdom message this year than last. We feel confident that all the Lord's people want to see the Kingdom progress and the activities in creased rather than decrease. The Lord will give the necessary increase

Unless Ordered

The important book Riches, and the important booklet Choosing, will not be sent to anyone unless they ordered. Neither Riches nor Choosing is being consigned. It is correct that when Choosing was first printed some consignments were made by adding a small number of Choosing to orders received from companies near Brooklyn, so that at least some of the publishers could have Choosing as soon as manufac-

tured, but this is not being done So all the brethren are not only to order the number of Riches they will need for "ZEAL OF HIS House" testimony and enough to carry them through the month of June, at least, but to order all the Choosing they can use, as well. In sending these orders, include any other publications you will need, both English and foreign. Your order should have been sent in by May 11; if it has not been, it would better be hurried.

Accepting Coupons as Contributions

This May Help Some to Place Riches

Many of the brethren throughout the country have been very succe ful in accepting coupons as contributions in placing literature. These coupons are redeemable in cash by sending them direct to the headquarters of the Premium Department. Do not send the coupons to the Society, but direct to: Premium Department, 62 Grand St., Jersey City, N. J. That organization makes special allowance for schools, churches, etc., of \$4.00 for a thousand complete coupons, and this arrangement applies to our work. When you send them the coupons, instruct them to make the check payable to the Watch Tower Bible & Tract So-ciety, and to send it to this office, 117 Adams Street, Brooklyn, N. Y., asking the Society to apply their on your account. They do this; so advise them definitely when you send the coupons to them.

Four dollars a thousand would mean four-tenths of a cent for each full coupon, or 13 full coupons would equal 5c; 25 coupons would equal 10c; 63 coupons, 25c; 125 coupons, 50c; and so on. ness from place to place, at 5c a copy. This aids in getting subscribers.

Transcription Records

Nearly 4,500 fifteen-minute transcription records are being consigned to all the large companies and sharpshooter arrangements having sound equipment. These records were formerly used on the radio, and are in good condition. These records are ideal for summer sound activity, and arrangements should be made to use them at once in the field as effectively as possible. This consignment was made in harmony with the reorganization of the transcription service, an outline of which was sent to all brethren concerned. Under the new arrangement all consignments of transcription supplies will go direct to the service director or sharpshooter, instead of (as heretofore) to the individual brethren owning sound equipment. Each company will maintain a central stock of transcription records, from which all sound cars and PTM's are to be fed. If pioneers desire to use some of these 15-minute records, they may borrow them from the various companies. The time is here for a vigorous sound campaign, and everyone should co-operate to this
