Salvation by "Foolishness of Preaching"

That is why the news that January would mark the beginning of two campaigns was received with such joy and enthusiasm by all who have enlisted under the Theocratic banner. Yes, January not only will begin the annual Watchtower subscription campaign, which will last four months this year, but will also see the beginning of the greatest public evangelizing work this earth beginning soon, seen! has ever seen!

The "Watchtower" Campaign

The sixth Watchtower subscription campaign was by far the best we had ever had, and there is every reason to look forward to this (the seventh) one's being still greater. However, for this to be the case, every company publisher, every general pioneer and every special pio-neer will have to do his part from the first day of January to the last day of April. They will have to be subscription-conscious, consistently subscription-conscious, consistently presenting the offer of a year's subscription for *The Watchtower*, with the premiums of the new bound book "*The Kingdom Is at Hand*" and the new booklet "*The Kingdom of God Is Nigh*", on a contribution of one dollar, at every door in their house-to-house work. Where the subscription cannot be obtained, effort should be made to place the bound should be made to place the bound book and the booklet on a contribu-tion of 25c; and where this cannot be done, try to leave at least the booklet. Nor will we overlook op-portunities to present the subscrip-tion offer in our back-calls and at our book studies. Where these have already subscribed for The Watchtower, the Consolation magazine may be offered, even as other bound books and booklets may be pre-sented with the subscription if they already have the latest ones. already have the latest ones. We will also be prepared to offer the subscription while engaged in the street magazine-work, and give those on our magazine routes the opportunity to avail themselves of the special offer. By so doing, we shall, in harmony with our text for the month (1 Cor. 1:21), be offering salvation to all by means of the "foolishness of preaching".

Public Meeting Campaign

However, beginning with January our offering salvation to those who will hear will not be chiefly confined to the house-to-house preaching, the back-call and book-study work, and the street and route magazine-work. Even as the apostles not only preached from house to house but also publicly, in the temple, synagogues, the Areopagus, and other places where people were wont to meet, so all of the Lord's servants now will have the same opportunity by taking part in the great public meeting campaign.

For this to be a success, however, each and every one must put his shoulder to the wheel. The servants of the company who are charged with the burden of making the arrangements, lining up the locations and territories, procuring the halls, and providing contribution boxes for them, preparing the advertising and assigning the company publishers, will need to work diligently, ever looking to the Lord for wisdom to direct their activities. The brethren who will give the public talks will who will give the public talks will prepare these carefully, going over them before giving them in public, critically scrutinizing their notes for Scripturalness, logic, coherence, etc., and will time them so that they will neither take too long nor they will neither take too long nor run short. They will give all they have both in the preparation and in the delivering of those talks, endeavoring to make them so clear, educational and convincing that the educational and convincing that the attendance of other publishers at the public meeting will be a joyful privilege, interesting, enlightening, and stimulating to faith, instead of a

With this Informant each company will receive two sets and each male pioneer one set of the outlines of the eight public talks to be given. The company servant will place one set of these outlines in the company files and the other set he will distribute to the brethren giving the talks, who will each make a copy of the outline for the talk to be given by him and return the original to the company servant. Also two sam-ple announcements of each of the first four lectures (the other four will be sent later) and twenty order blanks are enclosed to assist in planning the advertising and in ordering the same. When further order blanks are needed, these may be ordered, and they will be sent with the regular company orders.

Sunday morning announcements will be distributed from house to house in connection with the current Watchtower offer. Where this offer has already been presented another may be used presented, another may be used, preferably literature of which you have a large stock.

Individual Territories

While from now on the field service will to a large extent center itself around the public meeting campaign, this does not mean that all publishers will now give up their individual territory assignments. Not at all! They will continue to take care of their back-calls and book studies the same as before, and will witness therein from house to house during the week and at all such times as they are not able to assist in the united effort of advertising a public meeting.

Let all take part in the Watch-tower and public meeting campaigns with zeal and enthusiasm, fully confident that these arrangements are of the Lord and that His blessing will be upon our efforts if we will but do our part. Let us answer the world's charge that our activity is impractical, useless, just so much of the "foolishness of preaching", by putting forth the greatest effort we have ever made in offering salvation to all who will hear.

All applications for Bethel service filed prior to January 1, 1945, have been canceled; hence they must be renewed if such applicants desire Bethel service privileges.

As the Lord's work requires, Bethel service assignments are offered to *consecrated* persons who seem to have the necessary qualifications to fill the places open. At the moment there are a few such opportunities for assignment of persons wholly devoted to the Lord and in full accord with His organization who are from 18 to 40 years of age. Of the persons within the age limits it is suggested that only single men and single women who are without dependents and expect to remain single this side of the divine mandate, as well as married couples without children or dependents, make request for applications at this time. children or dependents, make request for applications at this time. In other words, all must be without at the president's office.

1945 Yearbook

In the 1945 Yearbook the Lord's people are given a panoramic view of the Kingdom activity throughout the earth: the trials of His people, the difficulties with which they have to contend, their victories, and their hopes for the future. Each consecrated servant of the Lord is keenly interested in these experiences and will live them anew as he reads them in the Yearbook, because they are his experiences. No one can afford to miss a sentence of this remarkable report presented by the president.

You will note the Macedonian call for Gileadite assistance coming from all over the earth—South America, the remote islands of the America, the remote Islams of the seas, and other places where the Kingdom message has been preached to some extent. There the brethren and the good-will interest are anxious that leads to the season of the seaso ious to serve, but lack proper organization. They await further instructions. Such organization and instructions will be supplied by the Lord through his Theocratic organization. These experiences not only are inspiring as we read them in-dividually, but are very edifying and inspiring to study collectively at our service meetings.

A competent brother will have been as-signed to handle that portion of the service meeting. He should have one or more questions on each paragraph, to bring out the vital points. He should encourage discussion from the floor, and, in conclusion, read each paragraph, until the assignment is completed. In this way the experiences of our brethren throughout the earth may be made profitable and helpful to each company organization.

Public Meeting Campaign

The widespread public meeting campaign, inaugurated the first of January, will be well under way in practically all companies through-out the country. The servants in the company will have obtained the necessary hall or halls, etc., for the public meetings, and the speakers will have been selected. By now, your order for handbills has likely been forwarded to the office at Brooklyn. Publishers will have been assigned to their particular public meeting. In general, everything should be in readiness for the first week-end of activity in this new work as far as the servants are concerned. The publisher must prepare, too; for it is the publisher that plays the key role in the Kingdom work of crying out the call, "The kingdom is at hand."

Saturday's activity should be confined primarily to the distribution of the handbills. Be sure to cover all business establishments in the Saturday distribution, contacting the manager of the establishment and all those employed, if at all possible. Also, the magazine work will be engaged in, and the handbills will be distributed to those that show interest on the street. Sunday's work will be with the Februpresentation as given below, along with the distribution of the handbills. Where possible, arrange to aid the interested to come to the meeting, furnishing transportation. When they are there, make them feel at home, and answer their ques-

Rearrangement of Servant to the Brethren Activity

It seems to be the Lord's will at the present time that the Kingdom service should go forward greater impetus and force. kingdom of heaven is at hand; therefore it is necessary that an enthusiastic witness to that effect be given throughout the world.

To assist the companies and others of the Lord's people in that respect the servant to the brethren activity is being rearranged and increased approximately fifty percent. Instead of having the servant to the brethren stay with the company one, two or three days, as has been the case in the past and as outlined in *Organization Instructions*, beginning February 1, 1945, company of the case in the past and as outlined in *Organization Instructions*, beginning February 1, 1945, company of the case of panies of 1 to 18 publishers will receive a two-day service, compa-nies of from 19 to 50 will receive three days' service, companies of 51 to 100 will receive 6 days, and companies of 101 and over will receive a two-week appointment.

The object of this rearrangement is to enable the brethren to stay with the company sufficiently long to co-operate with them and aid them in their book studies, back-call work, and other field activity, as well as to instruct the servants on these points. He will go with as many of the brethren as possible in their back-call work and in their studies and suggest ways and means arranging such back-calls and studies and conducting them effectively. When the servant to the brethren is in a company he will act as company servant for the entire time, making arrangements for the service meeting and other features of the Kingdom work. He will demonstrate to and instruct the regular servants on all features of the service actively as well as check all company records as at present. He is to give particular attention to the service meeting, showing how to arrange and conduct such a meeting. providing for the consideration of Informant articles, demonstrations, and other essential features that go to make a service meeting Theocratic and profitable to all the

Lord's people.

He will not conduct the Watch-tower study or Theocratic Ministry, however, but the appointed servants will conduct these meetings as usual. He will counsel and instruct them as at present. In the Theocratic Ministry, after each six-minute talk the regular counselor will counsel the speaker, after which the servant to the brethren will offer suggestions to both the speaker and the counselor, and at the conclusion he will give such coun-sel and instruction to the Theocratic Ministry instructor regarding the entire service as may be necessary. At the conclusion of the Watchtowcr study he will offer such suggestions to the Watchtower study conductor as will help improve that

In some cases it may be necessary for a servant to spend more than two weeks with a company. In that event the company and the servant to the brethren will be advised by the Society. In addition to the foregoing the servant to the brethren will, of course, participate in the public meeting campaign as outlined the instructions pertaining to that branch of the service.

Book Study Conductors

In order to build up each other in the faith and to form fully-equipped units of publishers that may operate in field service from various centers throughout a company's assigned territory, it is essential that God's people so assemble in book-study meetings and that the duly appointed study conductors co-operate with such groups by leading them forth in regular Kingdom activity.

Complete instructions have been published by the Society as to the proper method of conducting a book study for the profit of all in attendance; and, by entertaining one or two brief comments on each printed question, having one scripture cited in the Question booklet read in support, and having the paragraph from the textbook read in summation, a conductor is enabled to cover eight pages a lesson, thus preventing the meeting from dragging. In addition, the conductor of all company studies will exercise courtesy, kindness and patience in dealing with those studying, and where in-dividuals do not conform to the specified requirements of study procedure, the conductor will firmly and tactfully refuse to depart from the course, and time may be spent after the meeting in answering side questions or ironing out other difficulties.

The attendants of a company study under the leadership of the appointed conductor are privileged to engage in group witnessing to locate others of good-will and invite them to study with and eventually associate them-selves with the Lord's people in Kingdom service. Literature under the care of the conductor will be kept at the meeting place; and as the present public-meeting campaign increases the various study groups will be able to work together.

All Publishers Becoming Study Conductors

As all God's people attain maturity in knowledge and field activity they go forth unto others with the glad tidings even to the point where they form study meetings with them, and thus the term "study conductor" is reaching out so as to include every zealous witness who is seeking to hold at least one book study week with someone of good-will. It is becoming more and more apparent that by reason of the complete provision of the Lord's organization for this line of activity every publisher can qualify and serve as a study conductor in aiding those of good-will to learn the truth.

The study questions are all prepared, scriptures already found, and the answer to the question contained in the paragraph of the textbook. No publisher, therefore, need be fearful of being unable to answer questions that might be put to him by others. The entire provision has been made, by the Lord's grace, and each one, by faithful use of it, can prosper in this joyful feature of service. Where interest is found and a study started, the continuance of the study depends largely on the earnestness and thoroughness of the publisher in developing that interest; so necessarily the publisher will prepare as thoroughly as possible for the lesson. Then if the interested person does lose interest in time, the publisher should not be unduly discouraged. If the publisher has given the best he has, he has done his part.

Do not drop a study if someone attends a company meeting or two. but aid all new interest to become strong enough to continue in the right way. The line must not be drawn too finely between new interest and those beginning to associate. Use the study conductor slips to report on all such studies. However, studies of parents at home with children or with confined publishers are not so reported.

In these "last days" the Theocratw organization in the earth moves shead in bold offensive! Jehovah has given the command, his King takes the lead, and every faithful servant is in his place, functioning according to his assignment and being sustained by the spirit of the The overseers (episkopos) and assistants (diakonos) in the company organizations know their respective duties and move ahead with confidence in the task at hand.

Points to Observe

The Society's printing facilities are hard put to turn out these handbills in good time for the meetings. It is not possible to tell in advance whether the handbills will be sent by mail or express; so, after a reasonable time, the brethren should inquire at the express office con-cerning their expected shipments. By so doing, two or three days may be saved; for the express of-fice usually sends out a notice to the consignee when a shipment arrives, thereby involving a delay.

Do not use anything but the Society's specially prepared "Hand-bill Order Blanks" when ordering handbills; otherwise it entails considerable office work and delay. Order several weeks in advance, so that ample time is allowed to get the handbills to you, and write "Handbill Order" in the lower leftthand corner of the envelope. Show the name of the speaker thus:

J. W. Publisher (first and second initials and last name). Do not order printed handbills in quantity less than 1,000. However, blank handbills may be obtained in any quantities and the needed information be filled in by the company. It is necessary, though, to specify the quantity required for each lecture, as the subject title appears on each kind of blank handbill.

In answer to many inquiries, where a lack of speakers exists: It is proper to invite capable pioneers working in your vicinity or qualified brothers from near-by companies to deliver the lectures wherever such arrangement is possible.

The companies will profit by assigning a portion of a service meeting to the consideration of the Society's instructions on how to handle subscriptions, including the filling-out of the slip. Publishers, of course, will remit 75c for each new Watchtower subscription, retaining 25c to cover the cost of the book and booklet left with the subscriber as a premium. This arrangement applies during the special campaign only. All renewed subscriptions, and all new subscriptions taken at any other time during the year, will be at the usual rate of \$1.00. Welcome the "Stranger"

Now in every part of the earth the Lord's people are putting forth their greatest efforts to date in the discipling of all nations'. The public meeting campaign which has been added to the already well-filled program of activities of Jehovah's witnesses is the cause. It must be that the Lord's servants are extremely busy, else the public meeting campaign could not be effective. The Lord is giving His witnesses the strength and the ability necessary to meet the requirements of His service. We sincerely hope our labors will bring forth much fruit to the honor of Jehovah's name, evidence of which will be the increased number of worshipers of the Most High, the "strangers" in our midst.

After putting forth diligent effort to help those of the "stranger" class learn the truth (by witnessing at the doors, by inviting them to the meetings, by studies in their homes) over a period of time, it is our expectation that at least some will become associated with the various companies of Jehovah's worshipers. It is important that we recognize the necessity of exerting some effort on behalf of the "stranger" class right in our Kingdom Halls and at meetings, and not merely in the field. It is regretted that there are some companies where, it has been reported, no warm hospitality is extended to new persons attending meetings. The large companies are apparently the ones where such has occurred. This is difficult to understand; nevertheless, it is so. Surely anyone who manifests sufficient interest in the Kingdom to come out to a meeting of the Lord's people ought to be shown friendliness and made to feel welcome. Brotherly love must be shown for the incom-ing ones too. "Be kindly affectioned one to another with brotherly love; . . . given to hospitality." (Rom. 12:10, 13) "Your love for the brotherhood must continue. Do not forget to be hospitable to strangers, for by being so some, without knowing it, have had angels as their guests. (Hebrews 13:1,2, Goodspeed) We do our utmost to show the "strangers" the way to the Lord's organization, of which the company is a part; but if we do not welcome them when they finally get around to attending a meeting we are neg-lecting the "stranger". There should be no question left in the mind of any person of good-will who leaves any meeting place of the Lord's people as to his being among friends while there, as well as being welcome to return for the next meeting. True, all of us are busy at meetings getting territory and literature. besides making arrangements for field service in days to come; however, we can find time for at least a word of greeting to the new ones. It should not be necessary to say more in this matter. Each company and each publisher can and should be hospitable. Let us not neglect the "stranger" in our midst. Be sure you make arrangements to welcome rainian. and help the "stranger" attending your company meeting and public Arabic.

Seeking First the Kingdom Help the "Stranger" to Become a Publisher

Today, as never before, Satan is doing all within his power to turn all mankind away from Jehovah God and to stop the work of preaching this gospel of the Kingdom, the evangel that directs all men to their Creator. Even if the Kingdom work were not so pressing, were there not so much to do and so few to do it, there still could be no excuse for this attitude. Kingdom publishing has always pressed for fulfillment. and now the most stupendous task ever set before imperfect human creatures is placed upon all who have undertaken to serve Jehovah. Therefore now, more than ever before, it is imperative that they be 'seeking first the Kingdom", text for the month of March.

During this month all Theocratic servants will seek first the Kingdom by pushing forward in the Watchtower subscription campaign (which should be going in high gear in this, the third month), by working in their individual territory from house to house, offering the year's sub-scription for *The Watchtower* (at the regular subscription rate), with the book "The Kingdom Is at Hand" and the new booklet One World. One Government. As previously mentioned in the Informant, where the householder is unable or unwilling to subscribe for the entire offer, efforts should be made to leave the book and the booklet. However, at every home and every interview leave a copy of the new booklet One World, One Government. This important message should be gotten into the hands of every person in your company territory. Servants and all publishers should make arrangements to this end. All publishers will also continue to take care of their back-calls and conduct their book studies.

They will also put the Kingdom interests first by giving enthusiastic and wholehearted support to the public meeting campaign, advertising it on the streets and from house to house on Saturday with the leaflets, and on Sunday in connection with the literature presentation. the literature presentation.
will also attend the public meetings, bringing their good-will interest with them, and will be on the lookout to welcome the "stranger" and make him feel at home.

Peak of Publishers

However, that is not all. They must also follow in the footsteps of their great Exemplar in seeking first the Kingdom in another respect. And what is that? In assisting new ones to become publishers. Yes, He not only conducted a public meeting campaign and taught the people in their homes, but also took begin-ners with Him, teaching them by precept and example how to preach, and then sent them forth to 'disciple all nations'. So this month each evangelist will put forth a special effort to help others to get

lishers. It is the ideal time for this, as the Memorial comes during this month. Therefore invite your goodwill interest not only to attend that meeting but also to have a part in the field service. Start them out in the leaflet distribution work, both on the streets and from house to house, and then take them with you when presenting the literature. And when doing so use the time to good advantage by counseling the new publisher as to the best way to meet the various objections and to answer the many questions one encounters while engaged in the preaching work. Such suggestions, together with a real joy in the service being apparent on your part, will go far toward making your new publisher an able and zealous one.

Nor will we limit our assistance to such. Continually new ones are coming into the organization, symtheir consecration, out in the field service, and yet it has been two years since we have had a peak in publishers. Why is there no increase? Is it because some are growing weary in well-doing or are becoming weak in faith, and as a result are pubirregularly or not at If so, these too we must help. If we are willing to spend hours and hours in helping those of good-will by conducting book studies in their homes, certainly we should be willing, yes, anxious to spend some time and effort with those who have already taken their stand but for one reason or another have relaxed and failed to appreciate their privilege of service. Therefore,

this month let every regular publisher work for a by assisting others to be publishers, not only those just beginning but also those weak and irregular publishers. Thus doing we not only shall be "seeking first the Kingdom" ourselves, but shall also help our brethren to do likewise.

'Discipling All the Nations' Information on Reporting

Glorious Opportunity for Full-Time Servants

Those present-day faithful servants of the Lord who are seeking to keep Christ's command to 'preach the Kingdom gospel' are thus described in the 1945 Yearbook: "Some call at farmhouses, others at apartments, and still others from house house. In some lands it means visiting people in their adobe huts and their lean-to's; but wherever people live, that is where Jehovah's witnesses are directed to go: 'Go ve therefore, and make disciples of all the nations.'

The same general picture is conveyed by the striking illustration and text on the Society's 1945 Calendar. In equatorial heat, or the bitter polar cold, the busy city streets, or the lonely continental plains, in every land, to every people, the message will go until all who live shall bow the knee

What a glorious prospect! What desire for full-time activity is kindled in contemplation of the service privileges thus presented. Many willing ones in this day of Jehovah's power have put aside the things of the old world and taken up full-time service, and many more would do so except for the fear of being unable to support or maintain themselves as pioneers. There were those in Jesus' day also that were hindered from following him because possessed of the doubts, but Jesus declared that if men would seek first the Kingdom interests his Father would provide all things needful. The work of discipling all the nations includes the drawing of men from the things the old world to God's New World. How, then, in all consistency, can the Lord's servants be concerned with such things as the Gentiles seek?

Publishers, Pioneers,

and Servants, Study Carefully

As the man 'clothed in linen with the writer's inkhorn by his side', after finishing his Theocratic assignment, reported the matter, saying, "I have done as thou hast commanded," so Jehovah's Theocratic servants today make reports to the Theocratic organization via their local company organization, and the pioneers direct with headquarters, as to the work they have done which the Lord has commanded them to do, to "go ye therefore, and make disciples of all the nations"

Set forth below is information on the proper reporting of time for various features of Kingdom activity, and what should be reported on your field service report; also information on reporting attendance at book studies. Please study this carefully and conform to same from and after February 1, 1945.

Time. Report time while engaged

in house-to-house distribution of handbills, folders, radio announcements, Kinydom News, magazines. books, booklets, and other Kingdom literature. Also, report time spent advertising the local public meeting with information signs, and passing out handbills; time spent in operating sound equipment, thus heralding the Kingdom message far and wide over the territory; also time spent in witnessing to owners of buildings, lots, etc., when arranging to secure such lots, buildings, parks, pavilions, schoolhouses, bandstands, etc., for use in connection with the public meeting campaign. Of course, time spent in regular features of the work not mentioned above, such as back-call and book-study activity, will be reported as heretofore.

Publishers assigned to work with a particular public meeting group may include in their service report time spent in attending and supporting the public meeting, pro-vided they have participated in advertising that public meeting to the best of their ability. Also, the speaker delivering the talk may count the time spent doing such, but not the time spent in preparing it. This is witnessing publicly and the time in bearing the witness is thus counted. This rule concerning the publisher's and speaker's counting time applies only for the public meetings, and not for regular studies and meetings

in the company.

TRAVEL TIME. Henceforth, travel time may not exceed one hour a day for each day spent in the service by company publishers and pioneers.

On Being Thorough

The House to House Record form now employed by the publishers is an instrument by which thorough coverage of territory may be accomplished. When a person is too to receive the witness or no one is at home, notation is made on the form. It has been found that at about 35 percent of the homes a witness is not given the first time a territory is worked; and that is considerable. These homes should be called on again the very next time the publisher is in the territory, else the territory is really only partially worked. Many wonderful opportunities of free education are enjoyed by the publishers who are thorough. One such publisher reports placing as many as seven books in one day while calling upon those who were not at home when he first worked the territory. It is always well to go back to homes where you have not had a chance to give the Kingdom witness. Being thorough in your service will produce the most fruitful results.

How Improvements Will Be Made

With more time at his disposal, the servant to the brethren will go thoroughly into every feature of company organization, explaining to each servant how to rightly use forms and discussing the in-

means of the public meetings. Reports are constantly coming in telling of the great number of "strangers" and good-will interest attending for the first time a lecture given by a representative of the Society. Not only the first time, but these 'strangers" manifest their continued interest by repeated attendance at the meetings. Many millions of handbills have already been printed and shipped to companies in the United States. structions dealing with his specific line of activity. He will then aid the servants to put this understanding into practice in the company meetings. This is especially true of the others. nies may have information walking in the business districts with plac-ards. Work the stores with maga-zines and handbills, place placards in store windows, pass out handbills from house to house, on the streets, at intersections, etc. Brethren should talk about the public meetings wherever they go and to whomever they meet. There is no limit in this advertising work. Let all far and wide know that they are welcome to attend a free public meeting, which is for their welfare. When summer comes, if you have difficulty in obtaining halls, go to public parks, bandstands, vacant lots, public pavillons, or any other place you can find where you can gather together a group of people and talk to them about the Kingdom.

It has been noted that many publishers fail to bring their book-study attendants and back-call interest to the public meetings. Every effort should be made to get these people to attend each public talk, regardless of what territory they live in. They already have some knowledge and appreciation of the truth. Publishers, give these interested ones your close attention.

Jehovah's witnesses are united together in the spirit of the Lord. Their answer to Jesus' command. Information on **Public Meeting Campaign**

Surely no work being attempted or accomplished in the strength of man can compare with the activity in which Jehovah's servants are engaged and which they are doing by the power of his active force. Without question, theirs is the most important work. Theirs alone brings honor to Jehovah's name and works toward its vindication; theirs alone brings benefits of lasting value to all men of good-will as well as to those engaging therein. This being the case, it at once becomes apparent that all who engage in this work should do so with carefulness, earnestness, and thoroughness. each and every servant of the Lord should take every feature of the work seriously so that his efforts may prove acceptable to the Great Master whom he has covenanted to

As the public meeting campaign gains momentum, and the brethren become more proficient in it, questions arise and weaknesses become apparent, which it seems well to consider at this time.

How Assigned; Why?

The question has been raised as to what constitutes being "assigned" to a lecture series. Where only one meeting is being held at a time, all the publishers in the company or unit are in line to support that series. All who agree to and then do take part in advertising that meeting and support it are considered as assigned to that meeting and may Advertising can be put on on a count the time spent in attending large scale. Where possible compathat meeting as field service. This

would also, of course, include those who call for good-will interest and bring them to the meetings. In fact, this method of calling for the good-will has been found to be one of the most effective means of coming the stranger'.

Where more than one meeting is being held at a time, as previously instructed, the servants should arrange to assign certain publishers to the advertising and support of each series so that each meeting will be properly advertised and have a proportionate number of publishers in attendance. Each one should feel it his obligation and responsibility to support this meeting, and, when given an assignment, should be depended upon to carry it out. And such attendance at these meetings should not be governed by per sonal preference for the speaker, but by a Theocratic assignment, an appointment coming through the local Theocratic organization.

Another question arises as to the manner of distribution of the advertising leaflets. These should be distributed on the street corners and from store to store and house to house on Saturday, and when pre-senting the literature in the regular house-to-house work on Sunday. When these are distributed from house to house they should always be handed to the householder, and not merely slipped under the door, unless the householder does not respond to the knock or ring. Those engaging in regular house-to-house activity during the week may distribute these leaflets also, provided the territory is accessible to the public meeting.

The Kingdom Halls

A weakness that has become very apparent as a result of the public meeting series is the appearance of some of the Kingdom Halls. In fact, in some places these actually constitute a reproach to the glad tidings of the Kingdom. The Kingdom Hall is the headquarters of the Theocratic interests, the center of Kingdom activity in a city, and it should be a place dear to our hearts; and we should show our fondness of this place by looking well to its appearance, as well as by regularly at-tending there. As the psalmist of old, we should be glad when the time comes to go to the house of the Lord. The typical house of the Lord was made according to His specifications and was a place befitting its purpose. Our Kingdom Halls of today should likewise have an appearance befitting their pur-

While not all of the Lord's peo ple may be in position to provide for as good a Kingdom Hall as they would like to have, yet, regardless of their financial condition, the Kingdom Hall should always be arranged in an orderly and neat man-ner and kept clean. Where arrangements to do this systematically have not already been put into effect, provisions should be made to do so at once. No doubt all of the Lord's servants will be glad to have a share in this privilege of service, and by all doing so it will present no great burden to any one, nor interfere to any great extent with one's time for study and service in the field.

By noting the above as well as all the details and taking every feature of the public meeting campaign seriously, we shall have the Lord's approval upon our activity, will see his blessing upon our efforts, and will also be maintaining our integ-

Items to Note

All companies, pioneers, and other brethren writing the Society should place their full name and address in the upper right-hand corner of the sheet. Do that in every case, particularly if you wish an answer. Inquiries regarding subscriptions that have been sent to this office will not be answered unless some specific abnormal condition exists that requires an answer. When inquiry is made about a subscription sent to this office and you receive another renewal slip in the meantime, ignore the latest renewal slip. Possibly the renewal slip was on the way before your initial inquiry received attention, as such notices are prepared in advance.

Special Letters

Enclosed with this Informant are letters addressed to the special pioneers, general pioneers, and to the company publishers. All of these letters should be carefully and prayerfully considered by those to whom they are addressed.

The letter to the special pioneers has to do with their activity during the past year and the Lord's very evident blessing upon their efforts. It also contains suggestions for closer co-operation and unity among the specials themselves and between the specials and the other branches of the Theocratic organization with which they are required to work in carrying on the Kingdom service. Careful consideration of all the material therein will be of great benefit to all concerned.

The letter to the general pioneers similarly outlines for their consideration the Lord's blessing and guidance upon that branch of the service during the past year, and the absolute need for unity now in order to have the Lord's blessing. Each pioneer should carefully study this let-ter and examine himself in the light of the facts presented. Be sure that you are co-operating fully in advancing the Kingdom interests in unity.

The letter addressed to the company publishers and sent to each company for collective consideration and discussion calls attention to the great privilege of pioneer service now for those who are in position to avail themselves of it. This letter should be read at the first Watch-tower study and at the first service meeting after it is received, then at the second service meeting after it is received it should be carefully studied and discussed. Some compe-Theocratic-minded servant should have charge of this period and devote fifteen or twenty minutes to a clear presentation of the advantages of the pioneer service. Questions should be encouraged and asked by the brethren in the audience. A real effort should be made to place all the facts pertaining to the pioneer service clearly before

"United Kingdom Announcers" Testimony Period

"Watchtower" Campaign Unprecedented Success

Time Now for Co-ordinated Activity

The expression "United Announcers" brings to the Lord's people the thrilling recollection of the wonderful assembly of that name held during the year 1944. This assembly was undoubtedly the greatest exhibition of unity and co-ordinated activity of the Lord's people up to that time. And as they recall that, they cannot help but recall the thrilling announcements "The Kingdom of God is Nigh", and "The Kingdom of Heaven is at hand", which visualized the grand discipling work done by Jesus, Jehovah's greatest witness of all time, and who left us the proper example for discipling all nations. All of these inspiring recollections constitute the background for the "United Kingdom Announcers" Testimony Period.

The same uniting spirit and coordinated efforts in evidence at Buffalo and the other assembly points throughout the earth will undoubtedly be in evidence throughout the month of April as the Lord's people everywhere participate in this testimony period, and which will, without a question, make April a month worthy of the title "United Kingdom Announcers" Testimony Period.

The complete unification of the public meeting campaign, the goal of a new peak of publishers in all branches of the Kingdom service, and the celebration of the Memorial, just past, are the outstanding events that go to make April the month of months for the year 1945.

Nourishment and Protection Necessary

The Watchtower Campaign has hit a new high. Six weeks before the campaign ends, we have 93,000 subscriptions already through, and there are other thousands going through and in the mail. And, with over one-third of the campaign still to go, there is very little doubt that we shall have well over 150,000 new subscribers drinking in the life-giving Kingdom message every fifteen days as a result of these subscriptions placed. However, that allows only for one person reading each Watchtower or Consolation, as the case may be. whereas in many cases a number of persons will undoubtedly read these publications, thus swelling the total number of people being witnessed to as a result of this campaign.

However, the sowing of the seed is not all that is required here. Further unity and co-ordination are necessary in order to accomplish the ultimate purpose. The seed must be nourished and protected from the elements and other destructive agencies. It must be watered and the people helped and protected from the enemies of the Lord and His people. Therefore, let no one leave this splendid job only partly

finished. Let each one assume the obligation before the Lord to finish the job by thoroughly nourishing and protecting this interest by making regular back-calls upon the people, inquiring how they are getting along in the study of the magazine. Help them to see and appreciate the marvelous prophecies now being fulfilled and revealed through these magazines. Conduct studies with them, and invite and assist them to attend the public meetings and the other company studies. This is all a part of the co-ordinated efforts that go to make the "United Kingdom Announcers" Testimony Period.

Faith in the Lord's Power Necessary

United with this is the public meeting campaign, which has advanced with such phenomenal success everywhere that the brethren have gone forward in faith and zeal and put on the series as outlined. The evident blessing of the Lord upon the progress of the campaign leaves no doubt about its being the Lord's will to have such a campaign now and that he is directing it.

Some brethren lacked faith to start out right away on the series. They were conscious of their own limitations and permitted these frailties to assume larger proportions in their mind than the power of the Lord's holy spirit. As a result they did not get started immediately, and to that extent missed a great blessing, as well as, for a period, withholding from the "stranger" the message of the Kingdom, which the Lord now has indicated shall be brought to all people of good-will by means of the public meeting campaign.

Any brother who has conscientiously applied himself to the Theocratic Ministry Course and can read, write and speak the English language understandingly should be able to prepare and deliver one or more of these talks with the aid of the outline and the help of the holy spirit of the Lord which quickens even his mortal body.—Rom. 8:11.12.

This is true of young brothers and old brothers, and those brethren in between. All that is required is faith in the Lord to do his work through you, wholehearted submission to the spirit of the Lord, and diligent application to the task before you. This means hard work. Combine Activity

Where two or even three small companies exist close to one another they may unite in arranging for the advertising and putting on the public meeting campaign by supplying speakers for one another, and where the company is very small the publishers of both companies may unite and put on the series in one company territory and then in the other, alternating after each complete series until a number of series are put on in each company territory. In such cases, however, the present interest in each company territory should not be neglected. Keep up your back-calls and studies and local witnessing as much as possible between times.

Memorial this year was on March 28. Every consecrated servant of the Lord and each person of good-will attended that service and heard the mighty works of our God recounted, and visualized his own place in His great arrangements. These are now anxious to go forward joyfully to meet the requirements necessary for the Lord's approval. All should continue to have some part in the Lord's Kingdom service and continually experience that peace and joy that comes from a consciousness of a Kingdom service faithfully rendered.

An all-time peak of publishers should be registered during the month of April and continue to manifest itself throughout the coming months. United co-ordination of Kingdom announcers is now a privilege and obligation resting upon all consecrated servants of the Most High God.

In this connection, all who diligently study will become apt to teach and instruct others, by means of the company and Theocratic Ministry Course. These studies are the provision of the Lord to prepare his servants to bear the gospel of the Kingdom, and many a brother who now does not feel able to give a public lecture can train himself by the Lord's help and faithful appli-cation of the truths learned in these meetings.

Speaking ability comes as a result of much study, preparation and practice; and if some are at first unable to speak fluently, let them constantly seek to improve their ability. In time the effort will bear fruitage, and they will be able to present a talk with clearness, coherence and conviction. The same principles apply to all in the company. In order to be able ministers all must study and make progress in ability to teach others. Therefore. when the speakers do their part well and all the company publishers ably support the effort, the people of good-will who attend the public lectures will be enlightened and fed, and the Lord's blessing manifested on the combined activity.

Co-operation of Speaker and Publishers

Complete co-ordination between the speaker and publishers assigned to support and attend the meeting is needed for its success. The speaker, presentable in appearance, will be introduced by the chairman, also clean and neatly attired. A few introductory remarks will suffice to present the speaker, who will then do his best to develop a clear and convincing argument in support of his topic. At the close of the meeting the chairman will advise the audience of future company meetings and of the free booklet being offered.

Carefully weigh the facts presented in the letter, and, if possible, put aside all restraining influences so that God's holy spirit may energize you to faithful full-time pioneer activity. (This letter will be read at the first Watchtower study and first service meeting after being received, and carefully studied at the second service meeting after receipt.)

A Thorough Witness

To the Ends of the Earth Expansion of the Public Meeting Campaign

"And ye shall be my witnesses ... unto the uttermost part of the earth." (Acts 1:8, A.S.V.) What striking fulfillment these words are having in this year of 1945! Not only do we see the witnesses of Jehovah regaining more and more ground, as, due to the blessing of the Lord upon their relentless efforts, bans are being lifted in one country after another (England being the latest to do so), and the work blossoming forth with renewed vigor as the forces of totalitarianism are being driven from one land after another, but we also see special publishers (with Gilead training) ever widening their sphere of activity as they carry the witness to more and more Central and South American countries and to the isles of the sea. Yes, there is a great work being done by the Lord and it is definitely heading for the ends of the earth

However, this increasing of the work is not to be considered merely as applying to the spread of the work in foreign lands. There is much work ahead for each one of us; for "to the ends of the earth" indicates not only a widespread wit ness, but also a thorough one. And that is where our activity for the month of May comes in.

Without a doubt, by the time May rolls around all witnesses will agree that the first four months of this year were the busiest and best yet. The greatest Watchtower subscription campaign to date will by then be a matter of history, all indications at the present time pointing to its exceeding anything done in the past, and the public meeting campaign will be in full swing, ever increasing as the weather becomes more favorable, and the announcers, one and all, become more proficient in this new work.

However, while doing so we have more or less limited our efforts to witness publicly and from house to house to the cities and the home towns. Now the time has come to make it a thorough witness, by each company carrying it to the 'uttermost parts' of its own territory. Now is the time to arrange for the intensified witness by means of the public meeting campaign in other sections of the territory and in the small outlying towns, and to invite the people in the rurals and suburbs to hear these lectures.

Nor need we limit our public meeting series to Sundays. In some country sections it may be found advantageous to have these meetings on a Saturday or other "shopping" night, when the town is full of farmers and others who are doing their trading. Also, such companies as are unable to put on a series, due to lack of qualified brothers. should take advantage of the visit of the servant to the brethren to put on at least one public meeting during his stay regardless of the time of the week that may be. Spend all day advertising the meeting, chiefly on the streets, but also by the personal invitation method from house to house. Elicit the cooperation of rural schoolteachers to obtain permission to give announcements to the children to take home, and use any and all other means available to carry the advertising to the widely scattered rural community.

lic meeting campaign has been a decisive factor in increasing both the number of publishers and the average hours spent by them in Kingdom service. However, in spite of these increases, in some companies there has actually been a decrease as regards the back-call and book-study features of the work. This should not be. In fact, just the opposite should be the case. All those responding to the public-meeting advertising should be called on, as well as keeping up our regular back-calls and book studies. If this were done there would be an increase in these features of the work

Where book studies have been held on Saturdays and Sundays, and such now tend to interfere with the advertising of the public meetings, instead of dropping them, efforts should be made to make the backcalls and conduct these book studies during the week. In our efforts to find more interest we should not neglect that which we have already

Remember, there are five evenings in the week in addition to our weekends, all of which should be devoted to Theocratic interests. After individual study and the service meeting are accounted for we should still have two or three evenings for the making of back-calls and conducting of book studies. Every company should have a back-call night which should be well supported by all the publishers. During May, particularly, this back-call night can be well spent by following particularly, this back-call up the interest manifested by all subscribers for The Watchtower, endeavoring to interest them in a book study, and inviting them to the nearest company-established book study and the Kingdom Hall studies and meetings. In fact, all the names on the back-call files should be called upon and invited to the public meeting. The back-call servant should see that this is done, for he has on file the names of all such

Literature Offers

During the month of May, in addition to supporting the public meeting campaign and keeping up our back-calls and interest at studies, all Theocratic servants will also witness to the uttermost parts their territories by engaging in the regular house-to-house activity, offering the bound book "The Kingdom Is at Hand" and the booklet One World, One Government, on a contribution of 25c. Where the bound book cannot be placed a diligent effort should be made to leave the booklet. When covering the same territory week after week in connection with the meeting campaign, other offers may be used, such as three booklets on a 10c contribution, and two bound books and two booklets on a contribution of fifty cents, etc. The goal for which each Kingdom witness should strive is that of a schedule: well-balanced service Back-calls and book studies (preferably during the week), street magazine and leaflet distribution, and the regular house-to-house work, using all to support the public meeting campaign.

The remarks by the chairman, while only few in number, should be very carefully thought out and prepared. He is not to review the talk that has already been covered by the speaker, but he is to call attention to the fact that our object is to aid persons of good-will who are striving to understand the purposes of the Lord. To this end Scriptural questions will be entertained and answered by competent ministers, and the chairman will indicate where these ministers are located. Announce future meetings. If the Watchtower study follows, invite the public to stay for it. Invite them to the service meeting and the company book-study meetings, and explain the nature of these meetings Announce the following public talk. and invite the interested ones to return next week and bring their friends. Prepare these announcements as carefully as the speaker prepares his talk, and deliver them just as clearly and coherently.

The company publishers will do their share by thoroughly advertising the meeting, and then arriving on time so as not to disturb the proceedings. Fill the front seats first, and support the speaker's efforts by giving rapt attention to the message as it is delivered. Children can be supervised and kept orderly by their parents, and everyone be on the alert to welcome and set at ease the strangers. Make them feel glad they came, extend a welcome hand to them, and be at all times ready to answer their questions. Lord's blessings are clearly manifest upon this feature of Kingdom service. All reports from all parts of the country testify to its expansion and increase. Let everyone fully share in gospel-preaching and rejoice in the Lord's favor so clearly shown upon it.

Every company holding public meetings will report the results on the lower left-hand corner of the company monthly report card. Just show two items: Number of public meetings held and the total attendance. For instance, if a company conducts two series of four lectures during the month, with an attendance of 100 at each meeting, it would be reported thus:

In Regard to Service Meetings

All attenders of the United Announcers' Theocratic Assembly centering at Buffalo, N. Y., last August will well remember the model service meeting conducted there. As you recall it, remember how all were there on time, that no one came in late? Promptly, at the scheduled time, after a song was sung, the meeting was opened with prayer to Jehovah. Following that, the day's text from the Yearbook was read and the comments thereon. The company servant in his opening remarks then tied in with the theme of the day's text a welcome to the "stranger" in attendance. The outline of the service meeting program was then given, Each one assigned followed in his order, properly presented his article because he had prepared fully in advance, took the assigned amount of time, no more, no less. Each assignee tied in his consideration with that of the one preceding him, making the meeting as a whole coherent. Then the closannouncements, next week's ing service meeting program, the coming week's Theocratic activity and arrangements for service, were made, after which a song followed and the meeting was closed with prayer. "Examine yourselves," and see if your company is conforming

to the model set at the Assembly.
In connection with service meetings, it would be well for all publishers, particularly the servants, to read again the articles dealing with service meetings that appear in the January and the February, 1944, Informant.

That their service duties may be properly cared for, the appointed servants and their assistants should make it a point to be on hand at company headquarters with their records at least fifteen minutes prior to each service and Watchtower meeting, and earlier if possible. It is not possible to handle one's assignment properly if appearance is put in just prior to the beginning of the meeting and such one leaves immediately thereafter. For a servant, then, being "on time" would mean being there at least fifteen minutes early and staying until his duties are properly cared for.

At a service meeting in April a capable brother should be assigned the article in the 1945 Yearbook, "The Field," pages 50-52. This pages 50-52. This should be considered in accord with the instructions appearing in the January, 1945, Informant.

Keep always in mind that the service meeting is the point where you learn how to put into practical application your commission to 'go and disciple all the nations'. It is there where instructions on the new public meeting campaign are given, and for you to properly handle your assignment requires your presence at such meeting. Make it your business to be on time. participate in the meeting, pay close attention, take notes, and thus make it your own. Also, make it your business to 'welcome the stranger' to the service meetings and the Watchtower studies the same as you do at the public meetings.

Keep Pace with the Expansion of All Features

May will mark the introduction of a bound book and booklet offer. Present "The Kinydom Is at Hand" and the booklet One World, One Government on a 25c contribution; other combinations may be offered also, as outlined in the April Informant. Entered into with the same zeal that marked the Watchtower Campaign. May's field service prospects look very bright indeed. issue, they must be thoroughly instructed and taught the truth. There is only one people on earth today commissioned of the Lord to do this instructing, namely, Jehovah's witnesses. During the month of May, if every publisher will hold at least one book study a week, and all the pioneers increase their book studies proportionately, it will mark a wonderful increase in this vital educational activity.

Everyone Can Have an Abundant Share

Some new publishers may commence their field activity by merely distributing handbills to the people; but they will soon learn how to carry litera-ture along also, and how to present to the people. Gradually they learn how to recognize good will interest and make back-calls Eventually they will be able to conduct book studies and thus experience the joy of being a fully rounded-out minister, apt to teach. used by the Lord to aid others. During this month of May, every regular publisher, all who have previously been irregular, and even the formerly inactive ones, have every reason to express their appreciation for the joy and blessings received at the company meetings on April 27-29, by uniting in a faithful manifestation to men everywhere that as Jehovah's witnesses they will up-hold his side of the issue. Magazine Distributors' Order Blanks

A new order blank, complete with all necessary instructions, has now been provided for all companies and pioneers to simplify the ordering of magazine distributors' copies and extra copies. (Samples enclosed) This form has many advantages over the former order blank, as it contains at least five distinct im-provements that will greatly expedite magazine ordering.

should always be used when ordering magazines. Different sections are provided in which to indicate what you require. Clearly print the name of the company or pioneer in the space provided at the top of the form, and then set out the complete name and address of the person who is to receive the magazines. After this, select that section dealing with your particular kind of order and show plainly therein what you require. So doing, there should be very little difficulty experienced in obtaining what you order.

How to Order

Each section of the order blank is self-explanatory, and complete instructions are given on these different features to insure exactness in ordering. First comes the provision for making a change of address. If you want an increase or decrease in the number of magazines formerreceived, you use the next section. If the order is an entirely new one, show that fact by entering the quantity in the place provided on the right-hand side.

The next two sections are for foreign-language or special issues of Consolation or The Watchtower. As there is room for but one foreignlanguage or special issue to be shown on each form, it will be necessary to list additional kinds on separate forms. However, when many varieties are needed, list them on a suitable sheet of paper and attach it to the order blank. In addition, read the printed instructions on the reverse side. Please make all orders neat and plain.

Do You Have Your 1945 Calendar?

Every Kingdom Hall, each individual publisher, and each person of good-will should have a 1945 Service Calendar in use. Placed in a prominent place, not only is the calendar an advertisement of the Kingdom but it keeps before those around it the text for the year, "Go ye there-fore, and make disciples of all the nations," as well as showing the monthly slogans and texts and the

Testimony periods as they come.

If you have not obtained your copy of the Calendar, and/or if you know of any of good-will desiring one or more, you are urged to place your order with the stock servant immediately, so that the company can include the order with a current company order for literature. Greatest Summer Campaign of Public Preaching Is On

'The Meek Inherit the Earth' Released for Public Distribution

Jehovah's impelling, stimulating, active force moves his organization of devoted servants on in the fulfillment of their commission, and that commission is set forth clearly in the text for June:

"This gospel of the kingdom shall be preached in the whole inhabited earth for a testimony unto all the nations; and then shall the end come."—Matt. 24:14, A. S. V., mar-

June, 1945, marks the sixth month of the ever-increasing public meeting campaign announcing that kingdom of heaven is at hand". It will also witness the beginning of the greatest summer campaign of public preaching, from house-tohouse, in the "marketplaces", making back-calls, conducting book studies, and from the public platform, that the servants of Jehovah God have seen and been privileged to be used in to date. By this time companies should have become well organized for the public meeting work and will be able to proceed without waste of motion in arranging for the increase of the public witness this summer. As soon as the *Informant* is received, if you have not already done so, definite plans should be made and followed through to the end that June will be the greatest month of Kingdom work to date, and that an all-time high in hours may be reached. Just think, it has been five years ago this month (June) that the previous peak in hours was reached, namely, June, 1940, the peak being 20.3!That was the month that organized mob-action broke out against the servants of God and conditions were not nearly so favorable as they are now. Through support of the public meetings on week-ends and the backcalls made during the week and studies conducted, publishers should be able to average at least 30 hours. By your having part in the advertising of the meeting and aiding new ones present, the Lord has ar-ranged for you to count the hour spent attending the lecture, and that alone is four hours per month. Travel time of a maximum of one hour per day (if that much time is consumed traveling) can be counted also. By careful planning on the part of the servants in the company and by personal assistance of the publishers and newly associated on the part of the study conductors, and by the individual publishers' support of the arrangements made to publish, not only can an all-time peak in hours be reached in June but also a peak of publishers will be reporting as well.

'The Meek inherit the Earth'

MEMORIAL REPORT

Public Meeting Campaign Procedure

All Should Be Engaging Therein

Mighty as a forrential downpour. and with constantly increasing velocity, the powerful waters of truth through the land washing away the filthy religious doctrines that have contaminated the earth, and providing refreshing life-giving nourishment for those who love righteousness and truth. This, brethren, is the effect of the greatest public meeting campaign in history. This is undoubtedly a most effective instrument employed by Jehovah's witnesses to magnify His name. Therefore it is of the greatest importance that every individual publisher and servant becomes thoroughly familiar with all the details of his part and responsibility in the campaign and then carries them out. "The steps of a good man are ordered [established] by the Lorn." (Ps. 37:23) Therefore, let your course of action be directed (or ordered, established) not by any previous course, or personal preferences, but by the Lord's spirit.

The Proper Procedure

By this time, all companies, regardless of size, should have participated in the public meeting campaign to some extent. The servants are to see that the work is properly organized, that the territory is divided up properly so that it can be worked thoroughly and effectively, that the advertising is pushed with vigor, that halls and meetings are of such a pleasing and inviting nature that people will want to return, and that the interest is properly

Publishers, if they wish, may advertise the public meeting in the campaign territory all during the week prior to the public lecture by distributing handbills while they engage in house-to-house witnessing. However, on Saturday and Sunday everyone will push the advertising. At all times, back-call interest, book study attendants, and other good-will, regardless of where they live, should be urged to attend all public lectures.

Saturday is usually the best day for public advertising. At strategic points near the hall publishers should be assigned street witnessing positions to offer magazines and pass out handbills all day Saturday. Other publishers should distribute them from store to store in connection with store-to-store magazine work each week. Some will be assigned to wear placards (where such placards are available) streets and pass out handbills. Placards may be placed in store windows in town. Brethren who have automobiles may wish to stencil signs or paste placards thereon advertising the lectures, as has been done at conventions. Be sure you make such signs for advertising the lectures very neat in appearance, as that alone gives a good witness. From time to time the publishers may be changed from one branch of the work to another so that all will have opportunity to participate in every form of advertising.

In the past when there has not been sufficient territory to absorb all the publishers in public handbill distribution on the streets, store to store, etc., some brethren have covered their house-to-house territory Saturday with the handbills only, and have then gone over the same territory Sunday with the literature. This is unnecessary duplication of work. To avoid this duplication in cases where there are more publishers than are required to give a thorough public witness, passing out handbills in the streets, wearing

placards, engaging in store-to-store witnessing with magazines and handbills, etc., on Saturday, some of the brethren may be assigned to work from house to house in that area with both handbills and the regular literature offer, presenting the literature first and concluding with the presentation of the handbill and an urgent invitation to attend the meeting for the public. Similarly, work a different part of the territory on Sunday, presenting the literature and then the handbill. Thus, you will be covering the same territory four times in four weeks. All territory assigned to that lecture series should be covered once each week. The territory servant may regulate the size of territory to be covered so that it will not be too much nor too little for the brethren to work once a week. As soon as one series is completed you will start another series of lectures in another part of the territory, and work it in the same systematic manner.

Welcome and Aid Strangers

For a half hour before the public lecture some publishers should be outside the hall with signs (if available) and handbills directing the people into the hall. Kind and courteous ushers should be on duty to keep order and aid strangers to their seats, as well as answer questions. All other publishers should be there early so as to get acquainted with the strangers. Don't wait until time for the lecture to enter and take your seats. All halls should be clean and neatly arranged, presenting a pleasing appearance. After the lecture be sure to mingle with the strangers and discuss the lecture and the Kingdom with them and arrange to make back-calls on them. Invite them to return again. Each publisher should realize that his duty at the public meeting is to aid the stranger; and he will, therefore, postpone the getting of literature, magazines, renewing territory, making out field service reports, back-call slips, etc., until some other more convenient time. Give all your attention to the good-will!

The very purpose of these meetings is to feed the "other sheep" and aid them to learn of Jehovah's kingdom. Our work in that respect just begins with the public lectures. It requires much follow-up work with additional literature, phonograph recordings, and particularly studies in the Society's publications. to properly "feed my sheep" as the Lord directs. These back-calls and studies will give the "strangers" the necessary foundation in the truth to appreciate its value and regularly associate with Jehovah's people and participate in their joys and bless-

Whoever sponsors or arranges for the public meetings should report them on the monthly report card to the Society. That is, if a public series is put on by a company, the company will report the lecture; if sponsored by special pioneers or general pioneers, then they will report the lectures at the end of the month, regardless of who else may have participated and assisted them in the meetings. Always be sure to report total number of meetings and total attendance on your monthly report cards.

While the nations assemble (as at San Francisco) and seek human remedies for world distress (a 'just and lasting peace' by means of a world security organization), Jehovah calls attention to His remedy by commanding, "This gospel of the kingdom shall be preached in the whole inhabited earth for a testimony unto all the nations." (Matt. 24:14, A.S.V., margin) The carrying out of that command is the most important work that is being done

on the earth today.

Jehovah always does his part. By setting his King upon his holy hill of Zion, he created the basis or foundation for "this gospel". He put his spirit upon his people and commissioned them to go forth and preach "this gospel", and by his spirit or active force he sustains them in that work. And so that his servants might press on with joy and zeal and increased faith and appreciation, he provided the special company meetings.

At those meetings the servants of Jehovah were refreshed and edified as to the privilege of presenting their bodies (including all its mem-bers and faculties) as living sacri-fices. How they might perform their rational divine service was clearly and forcibly brought to their attention. They were thrilled as they heard the graphic portrayal of the part that Jehovah's witnesses play in the great conflict for supremacy as the people for the issue, specially created for that occasion. There they heard with rapt attention the timely and comforting message "The Meek Inherit the Earth", and received it in printed form with enthusiasm for their use in further measurements. their use in further preaching "this gospel". But above all, those special meetings will be remembered as the occasion on which Jehovah, through his "faithful and wise servant", provided his surprised and delighted evangelists with the new instruction book Theocratic Aid to Kingdom Publishers. And what an instrument that is! What an aid in our endeavors to measure up to the exacting terms of our commission! Yes, Jehovah always does his part!

Availing Ourselves of the Theocratic Aid

Now the issue facing us is that of applying these divinely provided instructions in the field. Throughout the month of June, all of the Lord's servants will make use of its counsel while preaching from house to house (see Lesson 50), offering the bound book "The Kingdom Is at Hand" and the new booklet 'The Meek Inherit the Earth' on a contribution of 25c. An earnest endeavor should be made to place one of these new booklets in each home. Where the new booklet has not yet been received, use the booklet One World, One Government until it arrives. (The factory has worked extra time so as to get as many of the new

booklets as possible into the hands of the publishers in time for the June campaign.) This month brings with it warmer weather and longer days, thus providing additional op-portunities to preach "this gospel" by engaging in the evening house-to-

by engaging in the evening house-to-house work, presenting either the regular offer or the booklet alone. Not only will the servants of Je-hovah do their part by going from house to house with "this gospel", but they will also show their appre-ciation of his tender compassions by calling back on all such as have shown interest and aiding them to appreciate the issue and the Kingdom. In going from house to house we are merely looking for the meek, the "other sheep". Being meek, they are teachable; and therefore, having found them, we must also teach them. And having started studies with these, we must exercise care if we would have them continue. It is not enough merely to go through a routine procedure of asking the questions and then having the paragraphs read, but we must put our heart into it; teaching with au-thority and conviction, making the lesson clear and interesting, and at the same time being ever alert to use Theocratic tactfulness in dealing with the many questions and incidents that arise. That is one of the main reasons why the new book Theocratic Aid to Kingdom Publishers was provided. Study and apply its lessons, and your back-calls and book studies will increase.

Preaching "This Gospel" Publicly

Doing our part includes also pushing forward in the public meeting campaign. Improved weather should see a decided "stepping up" in this method of preaching "this gospel". In fact, June is the ideal month for this, being neither too warm nor too cool. Therefore, do not wait any longer, but arrange now for openair meetings in parks, pavilions, bandstands, ball parks, and where-ever suitable places can be found. Bring the lectures to the people, and thus reach many who failed to come to the lectures. At such places it would be well to attract attention by playing musical selections on a transcription machine (if one is available) for ten to fifteen minutes before the assembly begins. During this time the brethren can go around handing out leadets and personally inviting those in the vicinity to attend the public meeting.

Where the company has no fur-ther places available at which to put on the series, it would be well to arrange for a return series at the Kingdom Hall and other places used earlier in the year. At such places the same lectures could again be given, or, especially where the first series was limited to four lectures, the company may use new subjects

Religion"; "Religion's Harvest"; "Education for Life." Under these circumstances it is left to each comto decide whether again with the first talk and run the entire series or just use the last four mentioned here. Indeed there is still plenty of work for all, in the public meeting campaign.

With each and every publisher having clearly in mind what Jehovah has done in connection with the preaching of "this gospel", and seeing the many opportunities that lie before us as co-workers with Him, there is no reason why the June Testimony period should not see a new peak in hours for all ranks of Kingdom publishers. Jehovah always does *His* part. Will you do your part?

Kingdom Service Expanding store to store and house to house, as The territory should be thoroughly covered with handbills, every person available doing the work and using every form of distribution possible. There are many other means of advertising as previously suggested that can and should be used in advertising these public lectures.

Not only can the publishers en-large their privileges in advertising the public lectures during July, but the speakers also have a great responsibility in this regard. Every brother enrolled in the course in Theocratic ministry and qualified to deliver a public lecture should be given one of the hour talks to prepare. As soon as he gives evidence of being able to deliver it satisfactorily, he may be assigned to deliver it publicly. There are four essential features which every speaker should keep in mind to be successful in delivering an interesting public leca sincere First, it requires desire with a humble spirit and willingness to be used by the Lord in any way he may direct. Secondly, much effort must be spent in studying the new book Theocratic Aid to Kingdom Publishers and other instructions on delivering the Kingdom message effectively. Third, it requires time to work out carefully every detail in the outline of the talk and make the finished speech coherent and easy to follow. Fourth. in order to be able to present the talk forcefully and effectively, the speaker must practice it for delivery, using emphasis, gestures, expression, etc., doing this several times before giving it publicly. No speaker should be assigned to give a public talk unless he will prepare properly in advance.

Enlarging Your Privileges Applies to Each Kingdom Servant

New World Government Requires Trained Representatives

The apostle Paul was a great enthusiast for enlarging his own and all of his brethren's privileges of service. After enumerating the proper steps to be taken and showing how he himself and his associates were enlarged toward the Corinthian brethren, he then exhorted them to be similarly enlarged. (2 Cor. 6) In this the apostle was outlining for our education the proper procedure

to follow today.

Jehovah is gathering his people from the north, from the south, from the east, and from the west. In this work he is using his holy spirit, his truth, and his conse crated people operating under the direction of his anointed King. The Watchtower articles describing Brother Knorr's trip to South Amer ica give us a vivid description of how the spirit and the word of the Lord have been working to assemble isolated people in many countries and gather them into Jehovah's organization, even though no detailed organization arrangement existed for that purpose in those countries.

Be Ye Enlarged

In addition to this, however, it pleases the Lord to have his consecrated people enlarged to embrace the additional privilege of assisting in the education of these people in the Kingdom requirements. To this end he has invited hundreds of consecrated men and women, ministers all, to Gilead to further equip themselves, or be enlarged. To enjoy this privilege these brethren had to apply themselves diligently to their studies from early morning until late into the night, day after day, until they were properly trained. Those who faithfully applied themselves have been sent forth or are now being sent forth to some fifteen different countries, and new fields for still others to go to opening up

Before being elected to this serv ice these brethren had to manifest faith in the Lord. They had to make a full, unconditional consecration to him and then enter actively into his service and continue walking in the light. In due time they became pioneers, then special pioneers, were ultimately invited to Gilead, and then on to these new fields. In their case that was the simple, orprocess of enlarging privileges. The same principle applies to everyone who is going to have further and greater privileges in the Lord's service. They must follow the leading of the holy spirit.

Be Theocratic in all your ways. Keep your handbills neat. If you must use blank forms for local printing, see that the job is neatly done. See that the hall, or wherever the meeting is held, is clean and attractive. See that the good-will interest receives

More and more the truth is being impressed upon you that no man is to live unto himself; that each one should seek the welfare of his brother as well as his own. Is such giving of aid limited to those brothers having special qualifications? Far from it! Helping Your Brethren

Additionally, you pioneers have a great responsibility in connection with the company studies. By virtue of being in the full-time service, having the Kingdom truths on your minds and lips morning, noon and night, you are bound to have a clearer vision, a better understanding of them. It is your duty, therefore, to help others to get the benefit of this increased appreciation, and while should you should not monopolize the study, you should always be ready to do your part by furnishing adequate comments. "Stranger's Right" Testimony Period

Assist Him to Exercise His Right

The Champion of the right of the "stranger", the Theorratic Government, is now directing the proclamation of "this gospel" in all the earth, which gospel is preached for the gathering of the "strangers", to the ultimate vindication of Jehovah's name. The "stranger" has a right to hear the good news, and, after hearing it, has the right and obligation to tell it to others. For many years Jehovah's faithful anointed remnant have witnessed to the peoples of all nations that they too may have the right to witness, and they have devoted themselves to fighting the great oppressor whose one aim is to 'turn the stran-ger from his right'. As a result of the Lord's spirit's operating freely through them thousends of the through them, thousands of the "stranger" class have been shown their right and have taken on the obligation that is theirs, to say "Come" to others, preaching "this gospel" to all.

August, 1945, the "STRANGER'S RIGHT" Testimony Period should be a month marked by the greatest influx of "strangers" into the Theocratic organization to date. To the end that this may be so, an organ-ized effort should be made on the part of all company publishers, all companies, and all pioneers, to as-sist all attenders of back-call book studies which have been carried on for a reasonable time to have part in preaching "this gospel". Take them with you to the public meet-ing contact point and let them distribute handbills. Show them that there is now "one ordinance" for them and those of the "congrega-

tion", namely, preach "this gospel".

When you bring the stranger to the public meetings, show him he is welcome. Make him feel at ease. Introduce him to other publishers in attendance, particularly those living in the book-study area where the "stranger" lives. Arrange for him to meet with the regular organized book study in that area. You can then initiate him into the house-tohouse work by taking him with you in the booklet work for an hour or so prior to the book study, having him distribute a small combination of booklets, including the latest publication, The "Commander to the Peoples", making it a point to leave a copy of this booklet, if nothing else, at the home of all who will read. Show him how to take note of the interest on the House to House Record form. By doing this you show him his right to publish and assist him to progressively become associated with the organization through the company organized book study. From this point the "stranger" will progress to the local company headquarters studies at the Kingdom Hall.

Consolation and Watchtower Renewals

The Society is encountering some difficulty with renewal subscriptions. In some cases the subscribers fail to give the correct address as it appears on the latest address label or wrapper on their magazine. It will help this office greatly if everyone filling out renewal slips gives information requested: the name, number and street, postal box, route and box number, city (post office), and state, as it appears on the latest address label.

There are cases where not all this information is given, and this delays the renewal of the magazine. Follow the procedure indicated on the latest address label on your magazine, to insure prompt service. Where there has been a recent change of address the old, as well as the new address, should be given in the proper spaces on the renewal blank. The zone number should always be included. If you are in doubt about the zone number, do not guess at it. Ascertain what the correct number is and put it down.

Renewals should be forwarded to the Brooklyn office as soon as conveniently possible, preferably through the company organization, to insure quicker and safer handling. Use the regular renewal slip found in your magazine. Do not become alarmed if a second notice is received. This is just a friendly reminder to those who have not re-Those who have renewed should ignore the second notice.

Be Careful

Certain brethren in Florida have been the victims of theft of property and money from their homes by a person who claims to have been in the armed forces of the United States; other times as a Catholic forced out of his home because he took a stand for the truth. Let the number of pioneers keep increasing; for more than ever the words of Jesus apply: "The harvest indeed is plenteous, but the labourers are few." Watch Your Spirit in Theocratic Service

Keep Your Eve on Kingdom Service

With the final battle of Armageddon speedily drawing near and Satan desperately exercising all of his deceptive powers to stumble the 'meek of the earth', it becomes very essential for all of Jehovah's faithwitnesses to take heed to their spirit, that is, their mental disposi-tion. The wickedness of this old world has gone to seed and lawlessness runs rife throughout the earth. The spirit of evil, selfishness, lust for money and personal pleasures holds sway and seeks to penetrate with its deadly influence and dominate the minds of all creatures. By taking heed to his spirit and con stantly being on the alert to blot out all tendencies to lean in that direction the Christian can be pleasing to the Lord and provide a proper example to people of good-will and maintain his integrity.

All future blessings of life and happiness are based on love for Je hovah and his Theocratic law, and a sincere effort to comply with his requirements. In order to avoid being ensnared one must diligently employ all of his faculties and his time, attention, and resources to the Kingdom service. He must keep his 'eye single' by laving it directed entirely to advancing the Kingdom interests. Only by having this spirit is it possible to accomplish the work set out before us and maintain our integrity until the end. This can come only from study and application of the Lord's Word. Under all circumstances, and particularly those of an unsettling nature which tend to upset mental balance and a calm mental disposition, the publisher will exercise control over and watch his spirit. (Prov. 25:28) He will always be on the alert to see that his every thought and action is the result of a proper Theocratic spirit, and he will try to cultivate and en-large this spirit and enhance its free operation in his daily activity.

Proper Care of New Interest

Now that much of the company territory has been thoroughly covered with the public lectures, much interest has been manifested and many people have attended these lectures. However, there still are on the back-call files names of many persons who have not yet attended any of these lectures; and there are many who have attended the lectures whose names do not appear on the back-call files.

These meetings and the extensive advertising connected with them certainly proved to be Lord's provision for bringing His people into association with the other sheep". An increase is now coming to many companies who are properly availing themselves of the full use of this gracious arrangement.

Because of the wide scope of servopportunities involved, every willing servant of Jehovah now has ample occasion to take part in at least some feature of this activity. and this alone should result in an ever-increasing number of publishers. Where companies have not yet done so, by all means let them now do everything possible to deliver the public lectures in their vicinity. Do the best you can with the material available, trusting in the Lord as to the results.

The resourcefulness of many companies has shown itself in overcoming various difficulties and obstacles. Where halls have been denied or canceled, park pavilions and outdoor have been substituted. Knowing of interested people that could not come to lectures because of transportation difficulties, buses have been hired to bring them to the meeting places. Old stores and buildings have been hired and used only after much expenditure of time and energy to make them presentable for an assembly. Police and official prejudice has been overcome by tactfulness and the Lord's spirit. Where the determination to the meetings has been persisted in, the Lord's blessing and approval have been manifested. The barriers have been pushed aside, and reports pour in from all over the country of happifying results from diligent public meeting activity.

Watch Your Spirit in Theocratic Service

September Opens New Year of Joyful Service Privileges

Loyal Servants Put Theocracy First

The inflexible position of Jehovah's servants in the issue of universal domination is continually being more forcefully demonstrated to them. It becomes increasingly apparent that there cannot be the slightest compromise with the enemy. 'Treachery toward the wife of our youth' automatically spells disaster, the only safeguard being a constant vigilance and watch over the spirit so that the Theocratic service occupies the first or highest place in life. For this reason, Malachi 2:15 has been designated as our guiding text for September: "Take heed to your spirit, and let none deal treacherously.'

The new service year thus opens up with a clearly defined course of action. A solemn warning to avoid the dangerous course of comproand admonition to heartedly maintain loyal and faithful devotion to the cause we have espoused. The Jezebel enemy organization, in its last desperate struggle for survival, extends blandishments and inducements to Jehovah's servants to forsake Zion. Watch your spirit! Flee from the old course, and give time, energy and loyalty to The Theocracy. Do not let the enemy get you stirred up and cause you to act foolishly. Remember, "He that hath no rule over his own spirit is like a city that is broken down, and without walls." (Prov. 25:28) Make your new service year, beginning with September, another year that will pass inspection by the "Commander to the peoples".

Improvements for the New Service Year

Every feature of your activity can be increased during September by 'watching your spirit in Theo-cratic service'. First of all is your desire for an increased number of publishers, helping the new ones to fall away from the old world and come into true worship of God. Newly interested ones are glad to sever connection with the old world because they see your good disposition or spirit and your zeal for Jehovah's righteous cause, and there fore they soon start in new world service.

Not since April, 1943, has there been a peak of publishers in the United States, but by faithful pushing of the public meeting campaign and all other Kingdom activities a great increase will come. Publishers who are industriously pushing the public lectures and avoiding impure connections with this old world are not only finding much new interest, but increasing their service hours also, and rejoicing in the manifestation of God's favor upon their efforts. They are making themselves known in the community, and directing men of good-will to The Theocracy. Many formerly irregular and placed in combination on a publishers are now regularly adver-

tising the lectures, and the newly interested are joining with them in inviting still others. Let every com-pany aim for at least one lively series of lectures during September, supported by the energetic co-operation of everyone associated with the company. Show the people that Jehovah's witnesses are in their community, and extend to them the gracious invitation to come and hear the truth.

Increase in Back-Call and Book-Study Activity

September is an ideal month for calling back upon people of goodwill, and as an inducement toward increasing these revisits the Society has for distribution a good supply of the recorded lecture "Peace— Can It Last?" This entire lecture can now be obtained for only \$2.00, and, together with recorded series that the companies now have on hand, they can be effectively used to arouse interest among many who are looking toward The Theocracy. These records can be loaned to the people for a week's time to be played at their own convenience. Their friends can also hear them, and upon calling back for the records in a week the publisher can quicken the interest aroused by arranging for a book study. Many records now possibly lying idle can thus be put to profitable use by loaning them out.

Back-calls and book studies, of course, are not established with the object of forming permanent calling places in certain homes, but to acquaint the people with the truth giving them true education and then to direct them to the company's centralized activity. The effort or prime objective fails if this is not

Bring such people with you to all company meetings. Help them to associated in Theocratic service by completely breaking away from "old world" entanglements. To accomplish this you must watch your spirit. Be patient and kind. Concentrate on making the people acquainted with your local company. The work being done there actually represents the center of Theocratic activity in your vicinity, and the place to which you will gladly direct all men of good-will whom

you meet.

All during September some of the rurals and country sections can be diligently worked, due to more gas for cars. Two booklets, The "Commander to the Peoples" and 'The Meek Inherit the Earth', and the book "The Kingdom Is at Hand", is the offer for the month. Other books or booklets can be substituted for these if the party already has one or more of such. This message of hope, assurance and blessing will be joyfully carried to the people by Jehovah's servants

You favored servants of God, 'watch your spirit.' Make the glad service of The Theocracy your delight and chief objective. Aid the "other sheep" now, during this new service year!

New Quotas for 1946 Service Year

As soon as the August report is complete, every company should immediately set new quotas for the coming service year, and place these figures in their proper places on the company chart. The Company Chart Instructions sheet, which was sent out last year with the chart, gives complete instructions on how to determine your new quotas. Here is a review of the general procedure.

To get your new quota of average number of publishers per month, first find the average number of publishers for the past year by adding up the "Pubs." column of your chart and divide by 12. Then to this monthly average number of publishers for 1945 add 10 percent, or one-tenth, and this will be your new quota for publishers for the year 1946. For example, if your average number of publishers last year was 40 per month, your quota this year would be 10 percent more than last year's average, or 44.

To find the new quota for "Hours" for the company, first find the average number of hours of the entire company per month for the past year, then add 10 percent to that. For instance, if this company of 40 pub-lishers averaged 820 hours per month last year, the new quota for the company would be one-tenth more, or 902 hours per month.

To find the quota for "Av. Hours per Pub.", divide this new quota of "Hours" for the company by the new quota of publishers. For example, in the above illustration, dividing 902 by the new quota for publishers, 44, gives a quota per publisher of 20.5 hours.

Likewise, find the average number of back-calls of the entire company per month during the past year, then add 10 percent to get your new quota of back-calls for the company. to get your new That is, if the company averaged 260 back-calls per month last year, the new quota for 1946 will be 10 percent more, or 286 back-calls per month.

To find the "Av. B-C. per Pub." divide the total quota for back-calls by the quota for publishers, which in the above case would be 286 divided by 44, making the "Av. B-C. per Pub." 6.5.

The quota for "Av. Stud. per Pub." will be 1 book study a week for each publisher. The total "Book Studies" quota will be the same figure as the new quota for company publishers, as each publisher's quota will be one study per publisher.

Don't forget to post the "Monthly Averages" at the bottom of the chart for the service year 1945.

of their attention.

The full-time pioneer service today is likewise by far the greatest privilege anyone can enjoy. It frees one from the destructive evil forces now running rampant in this world. Effective Apartment-House Witnessing

Overcoming Obstacles Theocratically

As the work of 'discipling all naions' goes forward the servants of the Most High become more and more skilled in carrying on the work. Because of heeding the ad-monitions to be wise as serpents, as harmless as doves, and without fear, they have won many legal decisions which have made more and more "land" the undisputed territory of the witnesses of Jehovah.

However, the apartment house is a stronghold of enemy resistance which still remains. If the Devil can succeed by threats, intimidation, police action, or violence in keeping the ministers of the gospel from preaching the Kingdom message in apartment houses he will have succeeded in depriving the "strangers" living in them of their right to hear the truth and to worship the only true God.

Sagacity Required

In carrying on apartment-house activity it should be borne in mind that the hallways are provided for the use of tenants and persons calling on them and no one has the right to prohibit such use. Apartsometimes ment-house managers wrongly suppose that they have the right to exclude Jehovah's witnesses and threaten police action against those who insist on visiting the tenants. While doubtless this issue could be forced in nearly every instance, yet to save time and expense it would seem that sagacity (see Matthew 10:16, *Diaglott*) and The-ocratic tactfulness should be depended upon rather than inflexible 'push".

In going into apartment houses where one is expecting difficulty or has previously experienced trouble it would be well to be fully prepared. Have copies of Consolation Nos. 624 and 671 with you, which assignments, but give the verdicts of the supreme courts of Massachusetts and Minhear the gospel.

nesota. It would also be well to enter not too obviously laden with supplies and equipment. And also by giving particular attention to appearing neat and clean one will add weight to the fact that he is a minister of the gospel and not an itinerant peddler. If the householder is not interested, do not needlessly press him, but proceed to the next

There are times when it would be best for one to go to the superintendent first and explain our work, while others would enter, one at a time, until there is one worker on each floor, such having been assigned in advance. The one chosen to call on the superintendent should kindly explain the nature of our work, pointing out that we are not peddlers or canvassers in any sense of the word, but are ordained ministers of the gospel; that we have a commission from Jehovah; and that it is a matter of life or death as to whether or not we carry out our commission, and that not only to ourselves but also to those to whom we would bring this message.

When interrupted and ordered out, one should remember that "a soft answer turneth away wrath", and that, therefore, it is of the utmost importance for one to watch spirit, even as called to attention in the text for the our month. Doing so we shall more likely be able to reason with the one interfering and thus gain our point to continue the preaching work in the building.

As the weather turns cooler the attention of the publishers is directed more to the cities. To thoroughly witness to these cities the apartment houses must also be worked. Therefore let all take hold of this feature of the evangel work so that there will be no by-passed apartment-house territory in our assignments, but that all living therein may have an opportunity to

Relax Not Your Vigil in the **Back-Call Work**

some individual companies throughout the country there appears to be a tendency toward relaxing the vigil that has been kept in regard to back-call and bookactivity. This, should not be; and, to the end that all publishers may progress in this feature of the service properly, the

Each company, as well as each individual publisher, should be well organized for the back-call and book-study work, even more so since January of this year. Let none arrive at the mistaken conclusion that the public meeting work is in any sense to replace the back-call or book-study activity. The people of good-will cannot be discipled entirethrough public meetings. all things be done unto edifying," say the Scriptures. Therefore, let publishers engage in all features of the Kingdom service to edify the people of good-will.

It is a fact that from 75 to 90 percent of the publishers reporting do make effective back-calls and conduct studies. Something is required to remedy this.

An effective remedy is to use service meeting demonstrations. These should be lively, practical, and not a show; for our job is to instruct, not entertain. Get the most active in this work on the program and have them demonstrate how they really do it.

Another way to organize bringing up the back-call feature of

Yearbooks and Calendars

Then, on another evening during the week, meet at the contact point and the same group can call back on the interest previously found, talking back-calls and book studies all the time, leaving handbills for the coming public meeting and arranging to call back and take them to the meeting. Take the question booklet along and try for a study; if you are not successful the first time, try, try again.

If all publishers, servants, and companies take steps to this end, organizing for advertising and assisting the interested hearers, we shall have a peak in back-calls. Did

Thus you will have a witness given simultaneously at a num-ber of homes instead of only one. The same applies to group back-call work. As soon as contact is made, let the rest proceed to the next call, and then later pick them up. Nor is that all. Beneficial Use of Theocratic Aid Book in Service Meetings

His Active Force upon Kingdom Publishers

Jehovah's Wav of Life

The Lord has been pleased during recent years to reveal to his people more clearly than ever before the vital importance of his active force or holy spirit and that his purpose can be accomplished only through its enlightenment and strength. All publishers, regardless of position, must apply for and submit themselves to the active force of the Lord if they are going to do His work properly. The prophecy (Isa. 61:1-3) applied primarily to Jesus, and also applies to the members of his body, and the principle it outlines applies to every consecrated creature that participates in the Lord's service. The opening statements of the prophecy direct our attention to the active force of Jehovah as the basic essential requisite of the service about to be accomplished, by saying: "The spirit of the Lord Jehovah is upon me: because he has anointed me...

It is only after we as Kingdom publishers realize this great funda-mental fact that we can properly submit ourselves to the purposes of the Lord and become real witnesses. James evidently had this point in mind when speaking to the Kingdom servants of his day. He said, "The body without the spirit is dead." Also the prophet Zechariah, in the calendar text for the month of November, "Not by might, nor by power, but by my spirit, saith Jehovah of hosts," and Jesus, in his statement in John 6:63, "It is the graphit that quidenneth; the flesh prof spirit that quickeneth; the flesh profiteth nothing," make it very clear that the active force of Jehovah is indispensable to the Kingdom publisher today and that without it it is impossible for him to do Jehovah's service properly.

The experiences of our brethren in Germany and other totalitarian countries during the past ten years is the greatest possible demonstra-tion of what the active force of Jehovah can do for his servants, preserving, quickening and strengthening for every ordeal, and energizing them to go forward in the service on every opportunity. It is this active force that reveals to us the Kingdom in all its surpassing power and glory, and enables us to enter into or come under its control and understand what type of service is to be rendered in order to be acceptable to Jehovah, the King of Eternity. His active force has also revealed to us that the Lord has come in power and great glory, that he has established the New World Government, and has brought forth his "faithful and wise servant" and given him rulership over all his goods and his houseservant" hold'. The same active force reveals to us that that "faithful and wise servant" is the consecrated spiritbegotten servants of the Lord organized into unity and functioning as Jehovah's witnesses under the direction of the present "Commander to

Active Force In November Activity

It enables us to see that the in-strument used by that "servant" in distributing things new and old and directing how they shall be used is the Watchtower Bible and Tract Society. Looking to this agency for directions for our November service activity, we find the Lord ever true to his arrangement, directing his people to go forth and proclaim "The kingdom of heaven is at hand", by means of the distribution of the Kingdom message contained in books and booklets (any two of each on a contribution of 50c), and particularly that before winter sets in we call upon the people in the small towns and rural communities who have been isolated for the past four

years because of war restrictions. Just as the active power of Jehovah led Jesus into the wilderness, so it impels the Lord's people today to feed these hungry ones, make backcalls, conduct studies, and otherwise assist and comfort them.

We should never lose sight of the fact that we received the holy spirit of the Lord upon conditions, which were based upon our consecration previously made to do the Lord's will. That will is now clear. For the publisher to withhold or refrain from preaching this gospel of the Kingdom would amount to obtaining the active force of Jehovah under false pretense and receiving the grace of God in vain.

Therefore, every publisher impelled by the active force to give testimony of Jehovah will follow through making back-calls and arranging for book studies with the people who manifest interest, and thus carry out his active commission. In addition to the house-to-house work, public meetings can be arranged for and magazine work done in these small towns and rural communities. Store-to-store work on Saturday afternoon will reach large numbers of farmers who can be invited to the public talk, which may be put on either on Saturday evening or on Sunday. The willing servant quickened by the active force of Jehovah will joyfully embrace all of these opportunities to do the will of Jehovah and aid the people of goodwill to appreciate their need of the Kingdom, assist them in coming to the meetings, and help them to understand their Kingdom privileges at and after the meetings, by calling back upon them and assisting them with their studies.

There is much of this type of service to be done before the severe winter months set in. The servants are to plan and take the lead in this and all branches of the service.

Companies that have no rural territories, and publishers who are unable to go into the rurals and small towns, will work in their regular urban territory and busy themselves in all branches of the service. "The Stranger Must Be Fed"

World leaders are noticeably perturbed, in this day, by the plight of millions of unfortunates starving for want of physical food. But of much more serious concern is the fact that there are living today multitudes on the verge of perishing for want of spiritual food, found in God's Word. Among these are countless numbers of "strangers" of good-will, whose state of spiritual malnutrition causes them to cry out with earnest desire for something better than the husks that they have been fed via religion's starvation diet.

What consecrated servant of Jehovah lives who would refuse to lift a finger to help such, or decline to share his "food" with another? The "stranger" must be fed; for Jehovah has decreed it. But how?

Witnessing from house to house is the first step; but only the first. Placing abundant literature does not constitute 'feeding the stranger', within the full meaning of the term. Of prime importance is calling back. ascertain what progress, if any, is being made, and to show the 'stranger' how to study the litera-ture and to increase the "stranger's" desire to learn. Some say, "But I have called back, and the person simply does not take hold." Maybe so; but can we expect outstanding results on the first call or two? Few come into the truth overnight; rather, it requires patient feeding, over

What are some of the reasons why back-calls may prove unsuccessful? In answer, consider a back-call of this nature that you made recently and ask yourself these questions concerning it: "Before approaching the person, did I fully prepare, having in mind something definite to present (Scripturally), so as not to beat the air'? Was I untactful in any way? Did I stay too long? Did I make the call because of my ardent desire to aid the 'stranger', putting full confidence in the Lord to bless my efforts, and lead me to His sheep, or simply to be making a back-call?" Thus you analyze your presentation and, knowing wherein you may have fallen short, are in position to improve on future visits.

With a successful back-call established, the feeding process has begun. Next comes development into a book study. How? One method is the use of the Study Questions book-let, to get the book study started. Show the stranger the value of the book and the booklet. Show him how to study, perhaps by selecting be-forehand a pertinent question or two, asking the question, and suggesting that he get his book and Bible, as you want to point out how he can use the question booklet in connection therewith. Help the interested one find the scripture cited, ask him to read it and the paragraph, then summarize by pointing out the valuable information gained, in just a few minutes of such study. Tactfully arrange to call back, and begin your study. Follow Theocratic Aid suggestions, and the results will surely be forthcoming.

From the back-call book study the "stranger" should be encouraged to attend the company book study, a live, instructive meeting well supported by the publishers. Simultaneously he should be invited to the Watchtower study and service meeting, where, in assembly regularly with the Lord's people, the ger" will soon see his privilege of actively responding to the invita-tion at Revelation 22:17: "Let him that heareth say, Come. And let him that is athirst come.

The "stranger" must be fed. Upon us rests this serious responsibility, which cannot be shirked. If we make the effort to this end, Jehovah will add the increase.

How to Arrange **Interesting Service Meetings**

Lively, enthusiastic service meetings are a vital necessity to healthy, active company. Regardless, a vital necessity to a though, of how good a service meeting might be, the effect is lost to some unless all publishers are there to benefit by it.

To aid the companies arrange for better and more interesting service meetings, we are submitting a suggested outline for each service meeting in October. Five minutes before the meeting starts a song may be sung. First open the meeting with prayer, then briefly welcome the strangers, outline the program for the evening, and discuss the daily text. We shall assume this meeting is held on Thursday evening.

25 minutes: Informant article "Jehovah Reigns". (Give short introduction, ask questions and have audience answer, and have each paragraph read by a good reader.)
10 minutes: Analyze previous month's activity. Compare report of country with that of local company.
12 minutes: Consider the Report Letter. 3 minutes: Accounts servant's financial report.
5 minutes: Closing announcements (week's field service report, arrangements for field service for week-end, miscellaneous announcements, next week's service meeting program), by company servant.

5 minutes: Usual opening procedure, by company servant.

15 minutes: Jehovah's Servants Defended booklet (section entitled "Who Are Jehovah's witnesses?"). Questions and answers, and read paragraphs for sum-up.

10 minutes: Informant article "Instruction on Tactfulness in Field Activity". (Consider by giving extemporaneous discourse and applying to local company activity.)

15 minutes: Demonstration.

(Use suggestions in Informant article "Instruction on Tactfulness in Field Activity".)

10 minutes: Two or three experiences from back of Watchtower issues showing use of Theocratic tact.

5 minutes: Closing announcements as usual, by company servant.

5 minutes: Usual opening of the meeting, by company servant.

10 minutes: Organization Instructions. Ask questions, and have answers from audience, and read paragraphs for sum-up. (Consider first part showing purpose of the Lord's organization.)

6 minutes: Talk on subject "How to Use the Theocratic Library", by school servant.

6 minutes: Talk on subject "Suggestions for Welcoming Strangers".

6 minutes: Talk on subject "Importance of Attending All Company Meetings".

10 minutes: Informant article "The Stranger Must Be Fed". (Ask questions, have audience answer; chairman summarize.)

10 minutes: Experiences in the field from local publishers.

7 minutes: Closing announcements, by company servant.

3 minutes: Prayer; welcome, program, by company servant.

5 minutes: Text.

12 minutes: Watchtower second article September 1, "Integrity Outlives Concentration Camp." (Give discourse on this, showing how our German brethren were preserved and directed by Jehovah's spirit.)

15 minutes: Informant article "His Active Force upon Kingdom Publishers". (Consider by asking questions on each paragraph.)

10 minutes: Demonstrations "Presenting November's offer with the invitation to attend the public meeting".

10 minutes: Review on Informant. (All publishers put Informant out of sight, and chairman will ask questions on various articles and items in the Informant.)

5 minutes: Usual closing announcements, by company servant.

The service meeting may be arranged a month in advance, so that brethren having demonstrations to prepare or other items that take much work will have enough time to properly get these lined up.

This outline does not begin to exhaust all the various items that may be considered for arranging interesting service meetings.

In just twenty-five years, more than 450,000,000 books and booklets, together with hundreds of of magazines and leaflets containing the Kingdom message, have been published, and public talks at world-wide assemblies, the radio, the phonograph, and practically every means of transmitting information at our disposal, have been utilized, to get done this all-impor-And all this accomtant work. plished, notwithstanding the ceaseless efforts of truth-hating religionists to dam up the river and stop the flow of vital waters to the peoples.

But how does all this relate to the theme for November, as expressed in the title of this article? In answer, we ask, Does it seem at all possible that this small band of Jehovah's witnesses, frail and weak in themselves, hated and despised and violently opposed by all nations of this world, could accomplish such miraculous feat in their own strength and might? No! "Not by [human] might, nor by power, but by MY SPIRIT, saith Jehovah of hosts," has this been achieved. (Zech. 4:6, A.S.V.) Solely by the operation of Jehovah's invincible active force, resting in a powerful way upon his Kingdom publishers, be they of the anointed or the "other sheep" class, has it been at all possible to realize this superhuman task.

Work Expands Public Meetings Preaching

That spirit of God, through the illumination of His Word, now illumination of His Word, now points to the expansion of the Kingdom proclamation on an unprece dented scale as the postwar period opens up. Unquestionably, the public meeting activity, inaugurated by the leading of the holy spirit in January, 1945, will play a prominent part in the further magnification of Jehovah's name, in the preaching-period yet ahead, before Armageddon.

During November every Kingdom publisher, whether he be a pioneer, special pioneer, or company publisher, should take it upon himself to participate in some way in public tions.

meeting work. Do not resist the leading of the spirit by thinking that the work is not for you, because of your feeling unqualified, due to age, or inability, or some other "reason". inability, or some other "reason". This is Jehovah's work. He has or dained it, and he will, through his spirit resting on his servants, see that it is done. His active force motivating Kingdom publishers does not mean, however, that the spirit of God will compel us to engage in handbill distribution, or go from house to house, or make a back-call. The publisher must take the first step, must put forth the initiative, to demonstrate his willingness to serve the Lord. Then, after exerting such effort, in accordance with God's Word and organization instructions. the servant of the Lord may rest assured that the spirit of God will guide and direct him in a way ever leasing to his heavenly Father.

Servants in companies, therefore, will be on the alert in November to secure every type of hall possible to expand the public meeting work into all parts of their respective territories. Use the Kingdom Hall, schoolhouses, abandoned churches, fraternal halls, municipal buildings, or any other structure available, to run series of talks throughout the fall sea son. Be sure, also, when ordering handbills, that your order reaches this office at least a month ahead of the date scheduled for delivery of the talks. The speaker selected will prepare well his material, never seeking to draw attention to himself, but always directing attention to the message presented. Company publishers and pioneers should co-operate in saturating the territory with handbills. Let the whole communiknow that Jehovah's witnesses are in town, and putting on a series of absorbing Bible talks. All publishers will continue to present the previous month's offer of any two books and two booklets, on a contribution of 50c, as they make thorough coverage of the territory their goal, being careful not to pass by a single dwelling without attempting to give a witness

Instruct Your Brethren

Regular publishers and servants should not be content with getting in their own time, but should offer instruction to the weaker publishers and newly interested ones. Take them along with you on the streets or from house to house and show them how to do the work. Remember that the apostle Paul said "I kept back nothing that was profitable unto you, but have shewed you, and taught you publicly, and from house to house." The worldly Thanksgiving holiday during this month will permit many publishers to spend one or two full days in the service, instructing others as well as preaching themselves. Group witnessing might well be scheduled for these days, following the method outlined in Organization Instruc-

In your public meeting witnessing. bear in mind that getting a person of good-will to attend a public talk is not the sum total of your work in connection with such one. This individual does not yet possess knowledge, the gaining of which constitutes the first step in becoming servant of the Most High, and timately attaining life. This ultimately "stranger" attaining must be discipled. taught; and since discipling others is our commission, the obligation to teach him is laid upon us. Discipling takes time. It can't be done overnight, or through a public meeting alone. It can be done, however, through regular back-calls and book studies. Do not allow any interest that develops through the medium of public meetings to grow cold. Follow it up immediately, using your evenings, and especially the backcall night, for this purpose.

Jehovah's active force is upon his Kingdom publishers. It will accomplish the work that He has purposed, the 'preaching of this gospel of the Kingdom in all the world for a witness'. Rely upon that spirit to back you up, to help you in every time of need, and go forward with zeal and determination to do your part in making known during November Jehovah's name and purpose.

"Cash Item" Orders

No other receipt or invoice for that particular shipment will be sent to you, and a record of the charge for it will not appear on your monthly statement. However, when both "campaign literature" and "cash items" are listed on one order blank, the entire order will be invoiced as heretofore, and it will appear on your monthly statement. Please remember that a remittance to cover should accompany every "cash item" order. Every order, whether for "cash items" or campaign literature, or both, or even for one item of either, should be listed and sent in on the regular order blank.

Book Studies

Success Follows Sincere Effort

There has been a slight downward trend in the back-call book studies conducted by the companies, special pioneers and general pioneers during recent months, instead of the increase one would naturally expect at this time. Book studies should be on the increase, and gaining with each passing month.

One of the most gigantic tasks facing the Lord's people at the present time is that of breaking through the mind-stupefying blindness cast over the people by Satan the Devil. It is beyond the power of any hu-man creature or man-made organization to accomplish that task. Therefore it is not to be approached in our own strength. But Jehovah, through his King Christ Jesus, can and will do this job well, using His irresistible power. This irresistible power operates upon and through his faithful people.—Isaiah 42.

If we, as servants of the Lord,

permit the spirit and Word of Jehovah to direct us, we can accomplish this stupendous task. Simply leaving a few books with the people will not accomplish it. We must call back upon the people. We must wrestle with this problem and fight this blinding influence by showing the people how desirable it is to have the mind of the Lord at the present time. Show them how this can be found with the aid of the Bible and the literature you leave with them. Suggest your returning at some future date to discuss it with them and assist them in obtaining this very vital information. Remember the Lord's assurance that his 'sheep will hear his voice, and another will they not follow'. Therefore, if we adhere very closely to the Word of the Lord, his truth, and present it in the spirit of the Lord. it will reach the ears of the "other sheep", and they will respond.

Jesus is also author of the statement, "The words that I speak unto you, they are spirit, and they are life." That is what the servant of the Lord depends upon, to penetrate the cloud of darkness and enlighten the people—the spirit of the Lord and his truth. Every placement should be followed up diligently and faithfully. Try making back-calls on the people and endeavor to start studies with them. We cannot accept the peoples' lack of interest or refusal to invite us back at the beginning as conclusive evidence that they lack interest in the Lord's kingdom. The Devil has done such a thorough job of blinding their minds that they do not realize their undone condition.

Let us, with patience and perseverance, press on in the work, using the various provisions with which the Lord has provided us through the Theocratic ministry, by the literature that we have in our hands, and his spirit enlightening us, and go forward in the work of enlightening the nations in the strength and spirit of Jehovah. Make back-calls, and conduct back-call book studies on all placements.

Theocratic ministry school; become able ministers; do the best you can under the existing circumstances, and you will improve with practice. The main thing is to get started. Don't be discouraged if results are not always up to expectations. Do your part faithfully and the Lord will bless the effort to his praise. Likewise all company publishers, regardless of who is assigned to give the lecture, support the effort for the work's sake. Enthusiastically look after every detail, so that the entire attempt will be a success.

The street work is an important part of public meeting activity too, and even in cold weather, by moving around from store to store and talking to people on the street, publishers can keep warm enough to carry on this feature. The distribution of the special issue of Consolation will have quickened interest in the magazine, and both it and The Watch-tower should constantly be kept before the people's notice so that they may read them for enlightenment and instruction in righteousness.

Back-call and book-study activity are also particularly appropriate at this time of the year, when the majority of the people are kept at home by the wintry weather. Here is where the Theocratic ministry training of all publishers will show fruitage. Certainly all attending the ministry course have been fully equipped and qualified by now to conduct a book study. Use this training to first convince the people of their absolute need to study God's Word, and then, as an able minister, proceed with the book study. With tact, any backcall where good-will interest exists can be developed into a book study merely by commencing to ask the questions from the question booklet, and having the interested person express an answer. Sum up by reading the paragraph from the book and the cited scriptures. Follow the lesson up each week, and you have a book study going. As interest grows bring the good-will person to the company meeting, and in due time you will be able to work together in Kingdom service.

The glorious treasure of service, then, is for the possession of every servant of the Most High. It has not been committed to angels or those seemingly most equipped from natural angles. We have it in frail earthen vessels, our frailty being overcome by the excellency of Jehovah's power. December will be a very active month for all who really appreciate this unspeakable favor and treasure of service.

Year-round Pioneer Activity

Requires Keen Appreciation and Good Management

Each year, as winter approaches, a number of pioneers go off the list. While some doubtless do so because of circumstances over which they have no control, others seemingly conclude that they cannot continue pioneering because of the cold. Is this viewpoint correct? What about the postman, the milkman, the traffic cop, to mention just a few? Do they drop their vocations when winter comes along and then take them up again in the spring? Of course not! Communications, food, safety and protection are essential factors that require attention the year round. Is the keeping of Theocratic communications open, the supplying of spiritual food, and the providing of lasting safety and protection less vital and important?

Do we appreciate the urgency of our work in casting up "defense through knowledge"? Do we appreciate the great honor of being ambassadors for The Theocracy? Do we appreciate the glorious treasure of service? If so, then we will not slack our hand when cold weather with its hardships comes along. Rather, we will view these obstacles as an added challenge to our love for Jehovah and our appreciation of the privilege of full-time service.

Wise Management

We are confident that with the great majority of those pioneers who go off the list as winter approaches the fault lies not so much in a failure to appreciate their privileges as in a failure to use wisdom in managing their affairs. If we would continue in the pioneer work throughout the year, we must learn to become efficient managers. Not only must we possess the proper spiritual qualifications of a knowledge of the truth, love for Jehovah, appreciation of service, possession of Jehovah's active force, etc., but certain material assets are required, such as time, energy, and means. Physical strength is needed, hour require-ments, must be met, there are expenses of a monetary nature, and winter makes added drains on all of these. To neatly balance them so as to keep in the full-time service requires wisdom from above.

Plan your time, always making provision for the unexpected by getting in as much time as possible early in the month. Eliminate all time-wasting habits and let your Theocratically Make a budget of your time and then stick to it. When making back-calls in a neighborhood, be prepared to make call-backs on not-at-homes, etc., so as not to waste an evening just because one or two parties are not at home. Avoid needless travel from one end of the territory to

Service meetings should never be arranged for the purpose of enter-taining; the sole objective should be to convey Theocratic instruction to the hearers.

Therefore every Kingdom publisher should regularly attend service meetings and listen carefully to every discussion and participate to the fullest extent in cause of "inability". To keep meeting the quotas also requires physical strength, vitality. Learn to conserve your energy and to expend it judiciously. Poise, and an abiding confidence in Jehovah, will do much toward keeping you strong physicalspiritually. Proper ly as well as eating habits, plain but nourishing food, taken in moderation, are also important, and especially so in cold

It means using your funds for only such things as are necessary and using wisdom so as to get the most for your money. And that means you may miss some of the luxuries that you were used to. Immovability for Right Worship

January Begins Eighth Watchtower Subscription Campaign

"I have set the Lorp always before me: because he is at my right hand, I shall not be moved." (Ps. 16:8) How well those words describe the stand taken by our Commander when on earth! Never once did he waver, never once did he follow the lines of least resistance, never once did he yield to religion, to creature worship. His was the greatest of all examples of immovability for right

But he lived more than nineteen hundred years ago. What about to-day? Is there a bold and faithful champion of the true worship at the present time? Yes, the "faithful and wise servant". Jehovah's visible Theocratic organization, since the cleansing of the temple, has been and is giving an outstanding example of immovability for right worship. It has fostered and spread that right worship to the four corners of

How has it done this? Primarily, by its official channel of communication, The Watchtower. By means of this instrument thousands upon thousands have been helped to take their stand for right worship and to remain immovable therein. In totalitarian countries men risked their lives to keep in touch with that channel of communication, and through the Theocratic underground and with the help of Jehovah they succeeded even though in prisons and in concentration camps.

Banned for years from one of the so-called "democratic" lands "down under", yet the servants of Jehovah there were able to report regarding The Watchtower, "Never once did we have to go without its regular visits." True, in those lands under or influenced by totalitarianism it did not always appear in the same garb, nor under the same title; how could it, often being copied by hand, mimeographed by the underground, and printed in concentration camps? But the message was there, and its inspiring revelation of truths and its bold and unequivocal stand for right worship gave courage and strength to those so sorely tried while upholding right worship. Its immovability galvanized their spirits to be likewise immovable for right worship.

How fitting, then, that the month of January with its Theocratic theme "Immovability for Right Worship" should begin the eighth annual Watchtower subscription campaign! For four months, from January through April, every Kingdom publisher will do his utmost to demonstrate his own immovability for right worship by obtaining subscrip-tions for *The Watchtower*. There is a great multitude of persons who are 'seeking after God, if haply they might find him', and who would gladly embrace the right worship if they only knew about it. They need The Watchtower to reveal it to them. Do we appreciate the help that The Watchtower gives in such articles as "Immovable for the Right Worship", "Defense Through Knowledge," membering the New World's Creator," to mention just a few? Such information is absolutely indispensable to all who desire to do that which is right. And then the doctrinal points it clears up, such as that of baptism, the sabbath, the Ten Commandments, etc. What Scriptural and reasonable foundation for faith! what help for all who sincerely desire to know the truth and be pleasing to God! Our brethren who felt the fury of the totalitarian monstrosity fully appreciated its indispensability, and to the extent that we likewise appreciate its value, to that extent we will be diligent to get its message into the hands of others. Subscription Quotas

This year there will be a separate quota for each country, the quota for the United States being 150,000 subscriptions. The individual quota for company publishers will be one subscription per month, while full-time publishers will strive for a minimum of seven subscriptions each month. quotas should not be hard to attain in view of the many opportunities for obtaining subscriptions. Talk subscriptions at every door in the house-to-house work, at back-calls and book studies, in the street magazine work (always carrying subscription blanks and a bound book and booklet with you), with business acquaintances and fleshly relatives, etc. With the subscription, of course, go the bound book "The Kingdom Is at Hand" and the booklet The "Commander to the Peoples" all on a contribution of one dollar. books and booklets may be used if the one subscribing has already obtained these latest publica-Consolation may be offered if The Watchtower has already been subscribed for or its presentation fails to strike a responsive chord.

Importance of Planning

To get this Watchtower Campaign off with a bang, start making arrangements at once. Increase your distributors' copies so that there will be enough sample copies on hand for all company publishers and pioneers. In doing so, be sure to use the special order blank provided for this purpose. Do not use the regular lit-erature order blank. All subscrip-tions should be carefully checked by the accounts servant (those living in the larger cities being particularly careful to check the zone numbers) before sending them into the Society's office. With each new English subscription 75c is to be sent, the balance being kept by the company publisher obtaining the sub-scription to defray the cost of the bound book and booklet given free with the subscription.

Territory also needs to be lined up, taking particular care to reach such as were neglected during previous campaigns, those living in the rurals and in outlying sections of our territory now being accessible due to the end of gasoline rationing. See to it that by the time the campaign is over the residents of every home in your assigned territory have had at least one opportunity to avail them-selves of the valuable information contained in The Watchtower.

While we are to feature Watchtower in the English language, we must not overlook the fact that it is also published in a number of other languages, particularly the Spanish edition, which comes in the identical form as the English and as frequently. Diligent activity with the Watchtower offer among the Spanish-speaking people both in country and in the lands to the south of us should give added impetus to the already rapidly expanding witness work among them. In addition to Spanish, other languages for which subscriptions may be taken are French, German, Greek, Italian, Polish, Russian, Slovak, and Ukrainian. With the exception of the French and German editions, which are \$1.50 a year, all these are the same as for the English, which subscription rates apply to the United

Servant to the Brethren Visit

Full Support and Co-operation Bring Results

"And some days after Paul said unto Barnabas, Let us go again and visit our brethren in every city where we have preached the word of the Lord, and see how they do." (Acts 15:36) Unquestionably, the servant to the brethren visit, 1900 years ago, was an occasion of delight and gladness. Not only did all responding enjoy the blessedness of Christian companionship another and their brother from 'headquarters', but they were thoroughly instructed in applying organization instructions, as issued by the governing body at Jerusalem. These visits must have had an exhilarating, unifying, strengthening effect upon all assembled, for the scripture records that 'the churches were established in the faith, and increased in number daily'.

Today the visit of the servant to the brethren is also of importance, for it is now that the "new song" must be sung, harmoniously, by all devoted servants. How can companies and publishers derive the most benefit from such visit? Presented herewith are a few suggestions to this end.

Immediately after being notified of the visit, the company should begin preparing for it. The Company Information forms, with all entries thereon made in ink or with type-writer, should be carefully filled out by the committee, as soon as all figures for the month just preceding the visit are complete. Do not wait until the last minute to do this, for inac curacy may result. To the servants' meeting all should come prepared to take notes, so as not to 'let slip' any pertinent counsel offered. The servants' meeting, incidentally, is to be attended only by servants and study conductors. The servant to the brethren may note points for improvement on the Company Information form; this will necessitate the company servant's checking this form at least once a month, and keeping the company posted as to progress made in

olution in various parts of the earth, the general unrest at home as indicated by strikes, etc., all give new force to the subjects listed, and, by the speakers' keeping their talks up to the minute, these will be ever new and timely. All will therefore continue to diligently support these public meetings, covering the territory again and again, even as the Israelites kept on marching around the aucient city of Jericho.

Persist also in the home educational feature of the work. During the cold winter evenings people like to stay at home and enjoy its comforts and the coziness of the fireside. If we will but brave the cold (taking proper precautions) we shall find ourselves richly rewarded, for we shall most likely find them at home and glad to spend an evening with us in discussing the truth. And remember, every placement of literature, be it only a booklet, is reason for calling back. At back-calls and book studies we accomplish the most as regards establishing the right worship, bring the most good to those loving righteousness, and receive the greatest blessing ourselves.

Obtaining Watchtower subscriptions in the house-to-house activity, in the street work, etc., giving full support to the public meeting campaign, making back-calls and conducting book studies, and doing all this with diligence and joy, and in spite of what the weather may be, that is the way to demonstrate "immovability for right worship" during

carrying out recommendations. In event changes in records or files are suggested, in order to bring them in line with Organization Instructions, accept such unmurmuringly. Beginning January 1, 1946, all letters sent to the servant to the brethren will be addressed in care of the company servant, who will guard against misplacing any mail, and hand it to the servant to the brethren as soon as possible after he receives it.

It would be well for every publisher to try to set aside, temporarily, other pursuits, in order to share in full measure the blessings in store. Make an effort to personally engage in some feature of field activity with the servant to the brethren. Discuss service matters with him; for he will delight to assist you in any way posto serve his brethren. Additionally, invite all persons of good-will to meet with the company during this assembly, to hear the timely, instructive talks given, to meet the servant to the brethren, and to become acquainted with other publishers. Make arrangements to bring newly interested ones; for it has been noted that many good-will persons have gotten their first taste of joyful field service as a result of diligent publisher-action in getting them to associate during the visit. Pioneers, general and special, will also profit measurably by this visit, in attending the visit. ing all meetings, absorbing the vital counsel imparted, and using such, in joint service with company publishers, to thereafter magnify Jehovah's name.

Keep in mind that the servant to the brethren is simply another one of Jehovah's witnesses, with increased privileges delegated to him. In his own strength and ability he can accomplish nothing in the company. But the spirit of the Lord acting through him can, does, and will accomplish much in organizing the brethren for more efficient service.

Full benefit of the servant to the brethren visit may be assured through application of one meaningful word, co-operation, complete, un-selfish, wholehearted co-operation by every member of the company, the company servant, assistant servants, all company publishers, pioneers and special pioneers, working as one, attending all meetings, and accompanying the servant to the brethren in the field. Thus doing, the servant to the brethren visit will prove to be an occasion of gladness and thanks-

Company Bank Accounts

On June 20, 1944, the Society sent a letter to the companies of average size or larger asking for informa-tion concerning the companies' bank accounts, and providing a form for the company servants and accounts servants to fill out and return to the Secretary's Office.

Since then, there have been some changes in check signers, bank used, and other changes affecting this information, and also additional companies have opened up bank accounts. Therefore, any company that has had a change in the information previously given regarding the bank account and has not filled out a new form for the Secretary's Office, and all companies that have since opened up bank accounts and have not supplied this information, should now do so. In each case the company servant should write to the Watchtower Bible & Tract Society, Inc., Secretary's Office, 124 Columbia Heights, Brooklyn 2, N. Y., stating that there has been a change in the company bank account, or that a bank account has been opened, and request the bank account cards to fill out and return.
