



Treasures From God's Word

Ezekiel 21:25—The "wicked chieftain of Israel" was King Zedekiah

Reference: w07 7/1 13 paragraph 11.

In the seventh year of exile, 611 B.C.E., the elderly ones of Israel come to Ezekiel "to inquire of Jehovah." They hear a long history of Israel's rebellion and a warning that 'Jehovah will bring forth his sword' against them. (Ezekiel 20:1; 21:3) Addressing the chieftain of Israel (Zedekiah), Jehovah says: "Remove the turban, and lift off the crown. This will not be the same. Put on high even what is low, and bring low even the high one. A ruin, a ruin, a ruin I shall make it. As for this also, it will certainly become no one's until he comes who has the legal right [Jesus Christ], and I must give it to him."—Ezekiel 21:26, 27.

Ezekiel 21:26—The line of Davidic kings ruling in Jerusalem would cease

Reference: w11 8/15 9 paragraph 6.

The Messiah was to be born of Israel's tribe of Judah. In his deathbed blessing of his sons, the patriarch Jacob foretold: "The scepter will not turn aside from Judah, neither the commander's staff from between his feet, until Shiloh comes; and to him the obedience of the peoples will belong." (Genesis 49:10) Many Jewish scholars of the past associated those words with the Messiah. Starting with the rule of Judean King David, the scepter (royal sovereignty) and the commander's staff (power to command) resided with the tribe of Judah. "Shiloh" signifies "He Whose It Is; He to Whom It Belongs." The regal line of Judah would end in "Shiloh" as the permanent kingly Heir, for God told Zedekiah, the last Judean king, that rulership would be given to one having the legal right to it. (Ezekiel 21:26, 27) After Zedekiah, Jesus was the only descendant of David to whom kingship was promised. Before Jesus' birth, the angel Gabriel told Mary: "Jehovah God will give him the throne of David his father, and he will rule as king over the house of Jacob forever, and there will be no end of his kingdom." (Luke 1:32, 33) Shiloh must be Jesus Christ, who was a descendant of Judah and David.—Matthew 1:1-3, 6; Luke 3:23, 31-34.

Ezekiel 21:27—The one who has the "legal right" is Jesus Christ

Reference: w14 10/15 10 paragraph 14.

Consider what Jehovah promised King David of ancient Israel by means of the **Davidic covenant.** (Read 2 Samuel 7:12, 16.) Jehovah made this covenant with David during David's reign in Jerusalem, promising him that the Messiah would be his descendant. (Luke 1:30-33) Thus, Jehovah further narrowed the line of descent of the offspring and established that an heir of David would have "the legal right" to the throne of the Messianic Kingdom. (Ezekiel 21:25-27) Through Jesus, David's kingship "will be firmly established forever." Indeed, David's offspring "will endure forever; his throne will endure like the sun." (Psalm 89:34-37) Yes, the Messiah's rule will never become corrupt, and its accomplishments will last forever!



new requirements Jehovah might reveal during the thousand years. Thus, individuals will be judged on the basis of what they do *during* Judgment Day.

Judgment Day will give billions of people their first opportunity to learn about God's will and to conform to it. This means that a large-scale educational work will take place. Indeed, "righteousness is what the inhabitants of the productive land will certainly learn." (Isaiah 26:9) However, not all will be willing to conform to God's will. Isaiah 26:10 says: "Though the wicked one should be shown favor, he simply will not learn righteousness. In the land of straightforwardness he will act unjustly and will not see the eminence of Jehovah." These wicked ones will be put to death permanently during Judgment Day.—Isaiah 65:20.

By the end of Judgment Day, surviving humans will have "come to life" fully as perfect humans. (Revelation 20:5) Judgment Day will thus see the restoration of mankind to its original perfect state. (1 Corinthians 15:24-28) Then a final test will take place. Satan will be released from his imprisonment and allowed to try to mislead mankind one last time. (Revelation 20:3, 7-10) Those who resist him will enjoy the complete fulfillment of the Bible's promise: "The righteous themselves will possess the earth, and they will reside forever upon it." (Psalm 37:29) Yes, Judgment Day will be a blessing to all faithful mankind!

1914—A Significant Year in Bible Prophecy

DECADES in advance, Bible students proclaimed that there would be significant developments in 1914. What were these, and what evidence points to 1914 as such an important year?

As recorded at Luke 21:24, Jesus said: "Jerusalem will be trampled on by the nations, until the appointed times of the

nations ["the times of the Gentiles," *King James Version*] are fulfilled." Jerusalem had been the capital city of the Jewish nation—the seat of rulership of the line of kings from the house of King David. (Psalm 48:1, 2) However, these kings were unique among national leaders. They sat on "Jehovah's throne" as representatives of God himself. (1 Chronicles 29: 23) Jerusalem was thus a symbol of Jehovah's rulership.


How and when, though, did God's rulership begin to be "trampled on by the nations"? This happened in 607 B.C.E. when Jerusalem was conquered by the Babylonians. "Jehovah's throne" became vacant, and the line of kings who descended from David was interrupted. (2 Kings 25:1-26) Would this 'trampling' go on forever? No, for the prophecy of Ezekiel said regarding Jerusalem's last king, Zedekiah: "Remove the turban, and lift off the crown. . . . It will certainly become no one's until he comes who has the legal right, and I

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

Good Doorstep Manners

Christians are "a theatrical spectacle to the world." (1Co 4:9) Therefore, it should not surprise us that some householders watch us from a window or listen from behind the door. The home may even have a security camera and a microphone that allow the householder to observe, listen to, and record us. Here are some ways to show good manners when at the doorstep.—2Co 6:3.

• BY YOUR CONDUCT (Php 1:27):

Respect the householder's privacy by not peering into the home. Do not eat, drink, make phone calls, or send text messages while standing at the door

• BY YOUR SPEECH (Eph 4:29):

While at the doorstep, do not say anything that you would not want the householder to hear. Some publishers may even prefer to suspend conversation altogether so that they can collect their thoughts about what they want to say


18 Argentina. How can citizens of the Kingdom prepare in case a medical decision needs to be made while they are unconscious? We can carry on our person a legal document that will speak for us, as Pablo Albarracini did. In May 2012, he was the victim of an attempted robbery and was shot multiple times. He was admitted to the hospital unconscious and was thus unable to explain his stand regarding blood transfusions. However, he had with him a duly executed medical directive he had signed more than four years earlier. Although his condition was serious and some doctors felt that to save his life, blood transfusion was necessary, the medical staff was prepared to honor his wishes. However, Pablo's father, who was not one of Jehovah's Witnesses, obtained a court order to overturn his son's wishes.

19 The attorney representing Pablo's wife immediately filed an appeal. Within hours, the court of appeals overturned the lower court's order and ruled that the patient's wishes, as expressed in the medical directive, should be respected. Pablo's father appealed to Argentina's Supreme Court. However, the Supreme Court could find "no reasons to doubt that [Pablo's medical directive expressing his refusal of a blood transfusion] was formulated with discernment, intention and freedom." The Court stated: "Every capable and adult person has the ability to grant advance directives on [his] health, and may accept or reject certain medical treatments . . . These directives must be accepted by the doctor in charge."

20 Brother Albarracini has since recovered fully. He and his wife are grateful that he had completed a medical directive. By taking that simple—yet important—step, he showed his submission to Christ's rulership through God's Kingdom. Have you and your family taken similar measures?

21 Canada. Generally, courts recognize the rights of parents to determine the best medical care for their children. At times, courts have even ruled that a mature minor should be accorded respect when it comes to making medical decisions. That was true of April Cadoreth. At the age of 14, April was admitted to a hospital with severe internal bleeding. A few months earlier, she had completed an Advance Medical Directive card with written instructions that blood transfusions should not be administered to her even in the event of an emergency. The attending physician chose to ignore April's clearly expressed wishes and sought

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a court order to give her blood. She was forcibly transfused with three units of packed red blood cells. April later likened the experience to rape.

After two years, the case came before the Supreme Court of Canada. Though April technically lost her constitutional challenge, the Court awarded her legal costs and ruled in favor of her and other mature minors who seek to exercise their right to decide for themselves their own medical treatment. The Court stated: "In the context of medical treatment, young people under 16 should be permitted to attempt to demonstrate that their views about a particular medical treatment decision reflect a sufficient degree of independence of thought and maturity."

²³ This case is significant in that the Supreme Court addressed the constitutional rights of mature minors. Before this ruling, a Canadian court could authorize medical treatment on a child under 16 as long as the court felt that

the treatment was in the best interests of the child. But after this ruling, a court cannot authorize any treatment against the will of young people under the age of 16 without first offering them the chance to prove that they are mature enough to make their own decisions.

²⁴ Was the three-year battle worth the effort? According to April, "Yes!" Now a regular pioneer and in good health, she says: "To know that I've had a small part in trying to glorify God's name and prove Satan a liar has truly made me happy." April's experience shows that our young ones can take a courageous stand, proving themselves genuine citizens of God's Kingdom.—Matt. 21:16.

Freedom to Raise Children According to Jehovah's Standards

25 Jehovah entrusts parents with the responsibility to raise their children according to his standards. (Deut. 6:6-8; Eph. 6:4) That assignment is challenging, but it may become far more so in the event of a divorce. Views on parenting may differ sharply. For example, a Witness parent feels strongly that a child should be raised according to Christian standards, whereas a non-Witness parent may disagree. Of course, the Witness parent should respectfully recognize that while divorce may sever the marital relationship, the parental relationship remains intact.

²⁶ The non-Witness parent may petition a court for custody of the child or children so that he or she can control their religious upbringing. Some allege that being raised as one of Jehovah's Witnesses is harmful. They may contend that the children will be deprived of birthday celebrations, holiday festivities and, in the event of a medical emergency, a "lifesaving" blood transfusion. Thankfully, most courts consider what is in the best interests of the child instead of judging whether they consider the religion of one parent to be harmful. Let us look at some examples.

27 United States. In 1992, the Supreme Court of Ohio considered a case in which the non-Witness father claimed that it would be harmful to his young son if he was raised as one of Jehovah's Witnesses. The lower court had agreed, granting custody to the father. The mother, Jennifer Pater, was granted visitation rights, but she was directed not to "teach or expose the child to the Jehovah[']s Witnesses' beliefs in any form." This order from the lower court was so broad that it could be interpreted to mean that Sister Pater could not even talk with her son, Bobby, about the Bi-

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ble or its moral standards! Can you imagine her feelings? Jennifer was devastated, but she says that she learned to be patient and to wait on Jehovah to act. She recalls, "Jehovah was always right there." Her attorney, aided by Jehovah's organization, appealed to the Supreme Court of Ohio.

28 The court disagreed with the decision of the lower court, stating that "parents have a fundamental right to educate their children, including the right to communicate their moral and religious values." The court stated that unless it could be shown that the religious values endorsed by Jehovah's Witnesses would harm the physical and mental well-being of the child, the court had no right to restrict a parent's custody rights on the basis of religion. The court found no proof that the Witnesses' religious beliefs would adversely affect the mental or physical health of the child.


²⁹ Denmark. Anita Hansen found herself facing a similar challenge when her former husband petitioned a court to gain custody of seven-year-old Amanda. Although the district court granted custody to Sister Hansen in 2000, Amanda's father appealed to the high court, which overturned the district court's ruling and granted him custody. The high court reasoned that because the parents had



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


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143 Keep Working, Watching, and Waiting



Keep Working, Watching, and Waiting





"Do You Love Me More Than These?"

"Simon son of John, do you love me more than these?"

—JOHN 21:15.

SONGS: 143, 65

HOW WOULD YOU ANSWER?

How do we keep secular work in its proper place?

What can help us to have a balanced view of recreation?

How can we successfully fight materialism?

SEVEN of Jesus' disciples had just spent the entire night fishing in the Sea of Galilee but had not caught anything. From the beach, the resurrected Jesus observed the group. Then he said to them: "'Cast the net on the right side of the boat and you will find some.' So they cast it, but they were not able to haul it in because of the large number of fish."—John 21: 1-6.

² After serving them breakfast, Jesus turned to Simon Peter and said: "Simon son of John, do you love me more than these?" To what was Jesus referring? Peter was quite attached to fishing. So it seems that Jesus was asking him where his true affection lay. Did he have greater affection for the fish and the fishing business than for Jesus and the things that he taught? In answer, Peter said: "Yes, Lord, you know I have affection for you." (John 21:15) Peter certainly lived up to his word. From that point forward, he proved his love for Christ by busying himself in the disciple-making work,

becoming a pillar in the first-century Christian congregation.

- ³ What can we learn from the words that Jesus spoke to Peter? We need to be careful not to allow our love for Christ to weaken and let ourselves be distracted from Kingdom interests. Jesus was keenly aware of the pressures associated with the anxieties of this system of things. In his illustration of the sower, Jesus said that some would accept "the word of the Kingdom" and make initial progress but that "the anxiety of this system of things and the deceptive power of riches" would "choke the word." (Matt. 13:19-22; Mark 4:19) Indeed, if we are not careful, the everyday concerns of life could entice our heart and cause us to slow down spiritually. Thus, Jesus warned his disciples: "Pay attention to yourselves that your hearts never become weighed down with overeating and heavy drinking and anxieties of life."-Luke 21:34.
- ⁴ Just as Peter did after his experience with the resurrected Jesus, we prove the depth of our love for Christ by putting the work he has given us to do in first place. How can we make sure that we continue to do so? From time to time. we need to ask ourselves: 'Where does my true affection lie? Does most of my joy come from engaging in mundane activities or in spiritual activities?' In this regard, let us consider three areas of life that if not kept in their proper place could weaken our love for the Christ and for spiritual things—secular work, recreation, and material things.

KEEP SECULAR WORK IN ITS PROPER PLACE

- ⁵ To Peter, fishing was more than a mere hobby—it was his livelihood. Family heads today recognize that they have a Scriptural responsibility to provide for their family's material needs. (1 Tim. 5:8) They must work hard to fulfill this obligation. However, in these last days, secular work is often a source of anxiety.
- ⁶ As a result of fierce competition for a limited number of jobs, many employees feel compelled to work more hours, sometimes for less pay. Also, the constant push for increased production takes a heavy toll on people physically, mentally, and emotionally. Employees who are unwilling to make such sacrifices for their company risk losing their iobs.
- ⁷ As Christians, we owe our primary loyalty to Jehovah God, not to our employer. (Luke 10:27) Secular work is simply a means to an end. We work to provide our basic material needs and to support our ministry. If we are not careful, however, secular work could interfere with our worship. For example, a brother in Thailand related: "My secular work of repairing computers was very interesting, but it involved working long hours. As a result, it left me almost no time for spiritual matters. I finally realized that in order to put Kingdom interests first, I needed to change my line of work." What did this brother do?

8 "After planning for about a year," he explained, "I decided to become a street vendor and sell ice cream. In the beginning, I struggled financially and got discouraged. When I met my former workmates, they would laugh at me and ask why I thought selling ice cream was better than working with computers in an air-conditioned environment. I prayed to Jehovah, asking him to help me to cope and to reach my goal of having more time for spiritual activities. Before long, things began to improve. I got better acquainted with my customers' tastes and became more skillful in making ice cream. Soon, I was selling all my ice cream every day. Actually, I was better-off financially than when I worked with computers. It has made me happier because I do not have the stress and worry that I had with my former job. And most important, I now feel closer to Jehovah."—Read Matthew 5: 3. 6.

9 Industriousness is a godly quality, and hard work is rewarding. (Prov. 12: 14) Still, as the brother mentioned above learned, secular work needs to be kept in its proper place. Jesus said: "Keep on, then, seeking first the Kingdom and his righteousness, and all these other things [basic material needs] will be added to you." (Matt. 6:33) To help determine whether we have a balanced view of secular matters and spiritual responsibilities, it is good to ask ourselves: 'Do I find my secular work interesting and exciting but view my spiritual activities as ordinary or routine?' Thinking about and meditating on

how we feel about our secular and spiritual activities can help us to determine where our true affection lies.

10 Jesus set the standard in balancing secular interests and spiritual matters. On one occasion. Jesus visited the home of Mary and her sister, Martha. While Martha scurried about preparing a meal. Mary chose to sit at Jesus' feet and listen to him. When Martha complained that Mary was not helping, Jesus told Martha: "Mary chose the good portion, and it will not be taken away from her." (Luke 10:38-42) Jesus was teaching Martha a valuable lesson. To avoid being distracted by secular matters and to prove our love for Christ, we must continue to choose "the good portion," to give priority to spiritual things.

OUR VIEW OF RECREATION AND ENTERTAINMENT

11 We need some time to relax and find refreshment from our hard work and busy schedules. God's Word states: "There is nothing better for a man than to eat and drink and find enjoyment in his hard work." (Eccl. 2:24) Jesus recognized the need to rest on occasion. Following one particularly intense witnessing campaign, he told his disciples: "Come, you yourselves, privately into an isolated place and rest up a little." —Mark 6:31, 32.

¹² Indeed, recreation and entertainment fill an important need. However, the danger exists that having a good

time could become the primary focus of our life. Back in the first century, many had the attitude "Let us eat and drink, for tomorrow we are to die." (1 Cor. 15: 32) That same spirit prevails in many parts of the world today. For example, years ago a young man in Western Europe began attending Christian meetings. But his fascination with entertainment was so strong that he stopped associating with Jehovah's people. In time, however, he understood that his focus on entertainment had only led to problems and disappointments. So he resumed his Bible study and eventually qualified to become a publisher of the good news. After his baptism, he said: "The only regret I have is that I lost so much time before I realized that serving Jehovah brings far more happiness than pursuing the entertainment offered by this world."

13 The purpose of recreation is to refresh and rejuvenate us. To achieve that, how much time should we spend on it? Think of this comparison: Many of us love to eat a dessert once in a while, but we realize that a steady diet of cakes and candies will harm our health. Therefore, we mainly eat nutritious food. Similarly, a steady diet of recreation and entertainment will weaken our spiritual health. To prevent that, we regularly engage in Kingdom activities. How can we determine if we have a balanced view of recreation? We could select a week and keep a record of the number of hours we spend on spiritual activities, such as attending meetings, sharing

in the field ministry, and engaging in personal and family Bible study. Then we could compare that figure to the number of hours we spent that same week on recreational activities, such as participating in sports, enjoying hobbies, watching television, or playing video games. What does the comparison reveal? Might there be a need to cut back on "dessert"?—Read Ephesians 5: 15. 16.

14 Individuals and family heads are free to choose the recreation they prefer, as long as it consists of activities that are in harmony with Jehovah's guidelines expressed in Bible principles.* Wholesome recreation is a "gift of God." (Eccl. 3:12, 13) Of course, we realize that choices in recreation may differ from one person to the next. (Gal. 6: 4, 5) Whatever entertainment we may choose, we want to keep it in its proper place. Jesus said: "Where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." (Matt. 6:21) Thus, our heartfelt love for Jesus will move us to focus our thoughts. speech, and actions primarily on Kingdom activities rather than on the everyday affairs of life.—Phil. 1:9, 10.

OUR FIGHT AGAINST MATERIALISM

15 Many today are obsessed with the latest fashions, electronic gadgets, and so forth. Therefore, each Christian regularly needs to examine his own desires

by asking himself such questions as: 'Have material things become so important to me that I spend more time researching and thinking about the latest cars or fashions than I do preparing for congregation meetings? Have I become so preoccupied with the everyday affairs of life that I spend less time praying or reading the Bible?' If we realize that our love for material things is eclipsing our love for the Christ, we should reflect on Jesus' words: "Guard against every sort of greed." (Luke 12:15) Why did Jesus give that serious warning?

16 Jesus stated that "no one can slave for two masters." He added: "You cannot slave for God and for Riches." That is because both "masters" require exclusive devotion. We will either "hate the one and love the other" or "stick to the one and despise the other," said Jesus. (Matt. 6:24) As imperfect people, all of us need to keep up our fight against "the

desires of our flesh," including materialism.—Eph. 2:3.


17 Fleshly-minded people have difficulty cultivating a balanced view of material things. Why? Because their spiritual senses are dulled. (Read 1 Corinthians 2:14.) Once their powers of discernment have become clouded, it becomes more difficult for them to distinguish right from wrong. (Heb. 5:11-14) As a result, some develop an uncontrolled desire for material things—a desire that can never be fully satisfied. (Eccl. 5:10) Thankfully, there is an antidote to being poisoned by materialistic thinking: a healthy dose of God's Word, the Bible, taken on a regular basis. (1 Pet. 2:2) Just as meditating on divine truth fortified Jesus to reject temptation, so applying Bible principles helps us to fight against materialistic desires. (Matt. 4:8-10) By doing so, we show Jesus that we love him more than any material thing.


