# Questions on the Book "THEN IS FINISHED THE MYSTERY OF GOD"

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This booklet will facilitate an enjoyable and enriching study of the book entitled "Then Is Finished the Mystery of God." It contains specially prepared questions that have been worked out to enable the student to discern and assimilate the vital material in each paragraph. To specify the paragraph or set of paragraphs under question, the page number thereof is first printed in bold black type. Alongside, by an elevated figure, is given the number of the paragraph on that page.

In personal study of the book, especially when you are preparing to attend and take part in a group book study, first read the paragraph or set of paragraphs as indicated by the numbers set before each question or set of questions. Then read the question or set of questions on such material and seek to answer, thereby to demonstrate whether you have caught and understood the key idea of the material read. For your refreshment of mind by a quick look thereat, you can underline the words or phrases that set out the essential idea. Such underlining will be useful for you in a formal group study. Also, look up and read in the Bible Scripture texts cited but not quoted in the book.

In a group study, whether at home or at the congregation's meeting place, the person presiding will first read aloud the question on each paragraph or set of paragraphs. Then he will grant opportunity for all present to comment and to read aloud the unquoted supporting Scripture texts, until the question has been answered satisfactorily. As a summary the book material under discussion will be read aloud by someone designated. Then the next question or set of questions will be taken up and handled in the same way. This procedure will continue until the time allotted for the group study has been used up. In advance of each successive group study, the one presiding can indicate the reasonable amount of book material to prepare.
